INTRODUCTION

The 2012 edition of *Crime in South Carolina* contains general information about crime trends, provides crime data at the county level for the most recent year available, compares national and state crime trends, and provides descriptive information about crime. The intent of this publication is to provide statistical information about crime in the state in a simple and straightforward manner so that it can better inform policymakers, criminal justice practitioners, and academicians as well as the general public.

The information presented in the tables, graphs, and charts in this publication indicate volume, fluctuation, and distribution of crime in South Carolina on the basis of incident reports submitted to the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED) by state and local law enforcement agencies. These reports are edited and reviewed, corrected as needed, and compiled to form the basis of the information presented in this report. It is important to note that the information in this report is only as complete as the information submitted to SLED. By their very nature, unreported crimes cannot be included. Additionally, edits, updates, and corrections are made over a two-year period in order to provide agencies with the maximum window of opportunity to report as fully and accurately as possible. As a result, rates and totals from a specific year can vary from previously published totals for that same year. The data used for this report were current as of February 18, 2014. Any data published here concerning figures for prior years supersede those published in previous reports. The sum of categories for some tables, charts, or graphs may not total 100% due to rounding.

We wish to express our thanks and appreciation to the sheriffs, chiefs of police, state and local law enforcement officers as well as the administrative staff whose hard work gathering, reviewing, and submitting crime and arrest data to the South Carolina Uniform Crime Reporting Program made publication of this report possible. The report itself is the product of a collaborative relationship between the State Law Enforcement Division, Uniform Crime Reporting Program and the South Carolina Department of Public Safety, Office of Highway Safety, and Justice Programs Statistical Analysis Center.

CONVERSION OF NIBRS TO SRS

The FBI Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program collects data through two reporting systems: the traditional Summary Reporting System (SRS) and the newer National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). South Carolina switched from the SRS to incident-based reporting in 1987. However, because the FBI UCR Program continues to receive the majority of UCR data from states who report via the SRS, the FBI converts all NIBRS data to SRS data to report crime statistics. In order to match the FBI's UCR publications, *Crime in South Carolina* is published using the SRS.

When converting Incident Based Reporting (IBR) data to SRS data, in most cases, only one offense type is counted per incident. In incidents where more than one offense type is committed, only the most serious offense type is counted. The Hierarchy Rule ranks traditional Index offenses by level of severity from high to low as follows:

NEW DEFINITION OF RAPE

In December 2011, FBI Director Robert S. Mueller II, approved revisions to the UCR Program's definition of rape: "Penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim." In addition, the Director also approved the removal of the term "forcible" from all sex offenses in the UCR program. According to Attorney General Eric Holder, "the new, more inclusive definition will provide us with a more accurate understanding of the scope and volume of these crimes."

The rape definition change affects only the SRS. Because South Carolina collects all UCR data in the NIBRS format, the broader sex offense information reflected in the new definition is already captured with the existing offenses of Rape, Sodomy, and Sexual Assault with an Object. As such, the only modification needed during conversion from NIBRS to SRS is the aggregation of these three offenses for publication in *Crime in South Carolina*.

In order to comply with the new definition of rape, but maintain comparisons with past years, both the revised and historical definitions of rape are used throughout this book. Each instance is marked as using either the historical or revised definition to clearly indicate which criteria are used for a given statistic.

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INDEX OFFENSES

There are seven Index I offenses: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, breaking and entering, larceny and motor vehicle theft. These are typically categorized as violent (murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault) and property (breaking and entering, larceny and motor vehicle theft) and provide basic measures of crime. Throughout this report, crimes are usually presented either as the number of reported offenses, or as the rate of offenses per 10,000 unit of population. Because it takes into account population, the offense rate usually provides the most useful basis of comparison over time or among jurisdictions or other geographical groups. The formula for calculating an offense rate is as follows:

$$\text{Offense Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Crimes}}{\text{Population}} \times 10,000$$

State and county population estimates used to calculate offense rates were provided by the South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office.

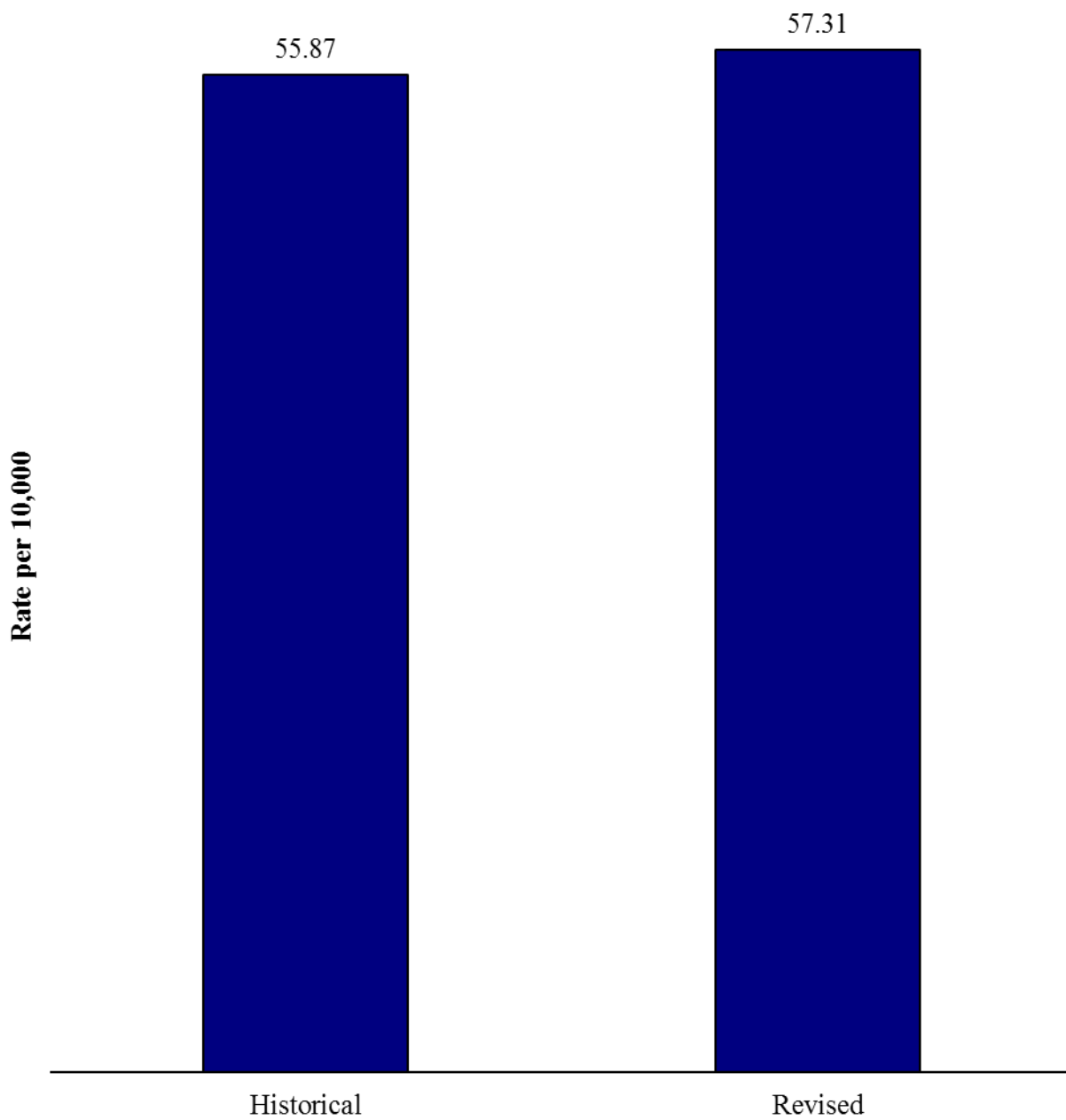
South Carolina had 27,072 violent crimes reported in 2012 using the revised definition of rape, and the violent crime rate was 57.31 per 10,000. This represents an increase of 2.6% over the number of violent crimes and the violent crime rate for the same period of time based on the historical definition of rape.

VIOLENT CRIME: Violent crime consists of murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault, and involves the element of personal confrontation between the victim and offender. The 2012 total below uses the current definition of rape. It is not possible to go back and apply this definition to crimes committed prior to 2012 in order to identify trends or make comparisons.

Impact of Revised Rape Definition Violent Crime Rate 2012



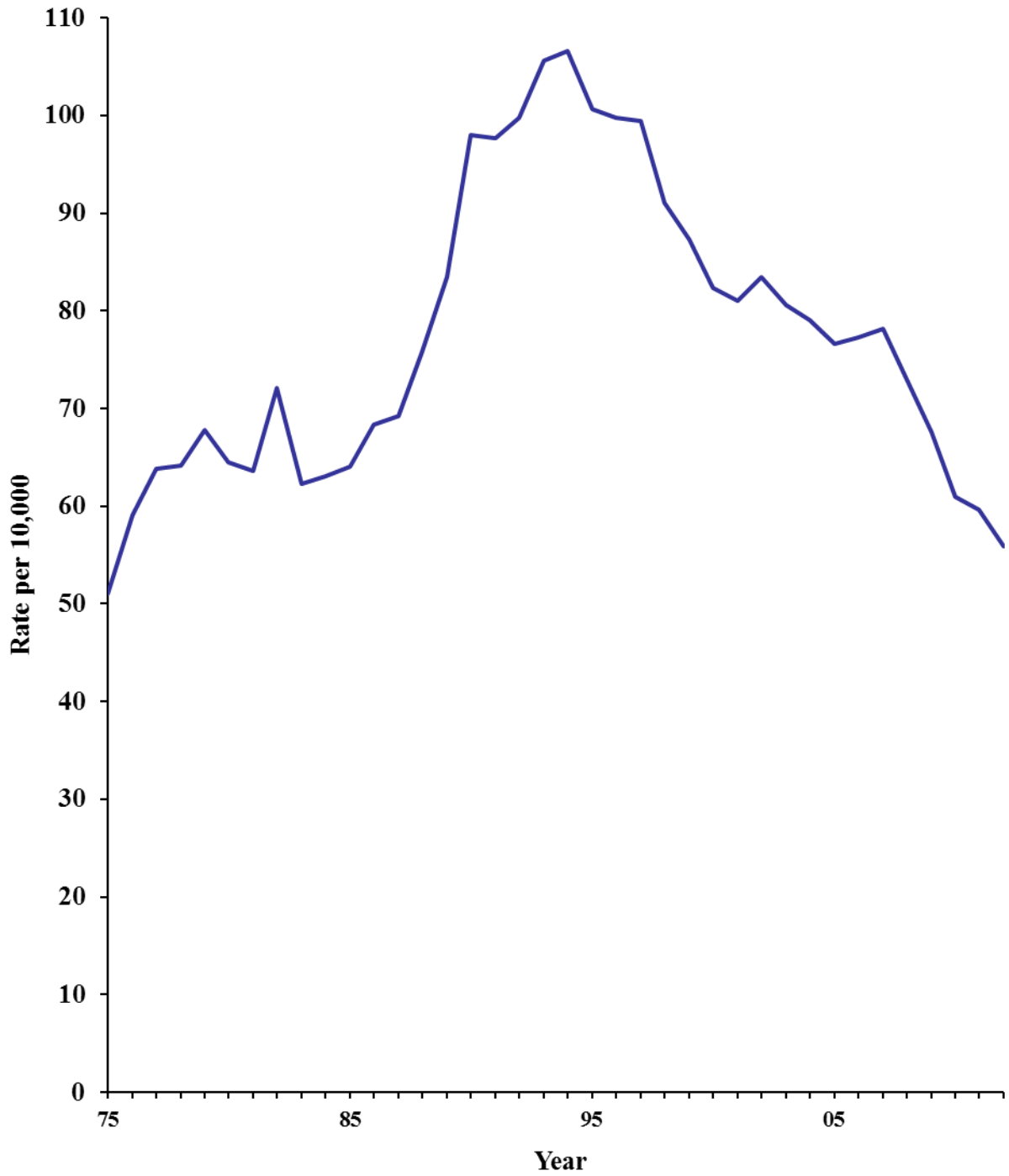
South Carolina's violent crime rate decreased 6.3% from 2011 to 2012. Since 1975 the violent crime rate has increased 9.5%.

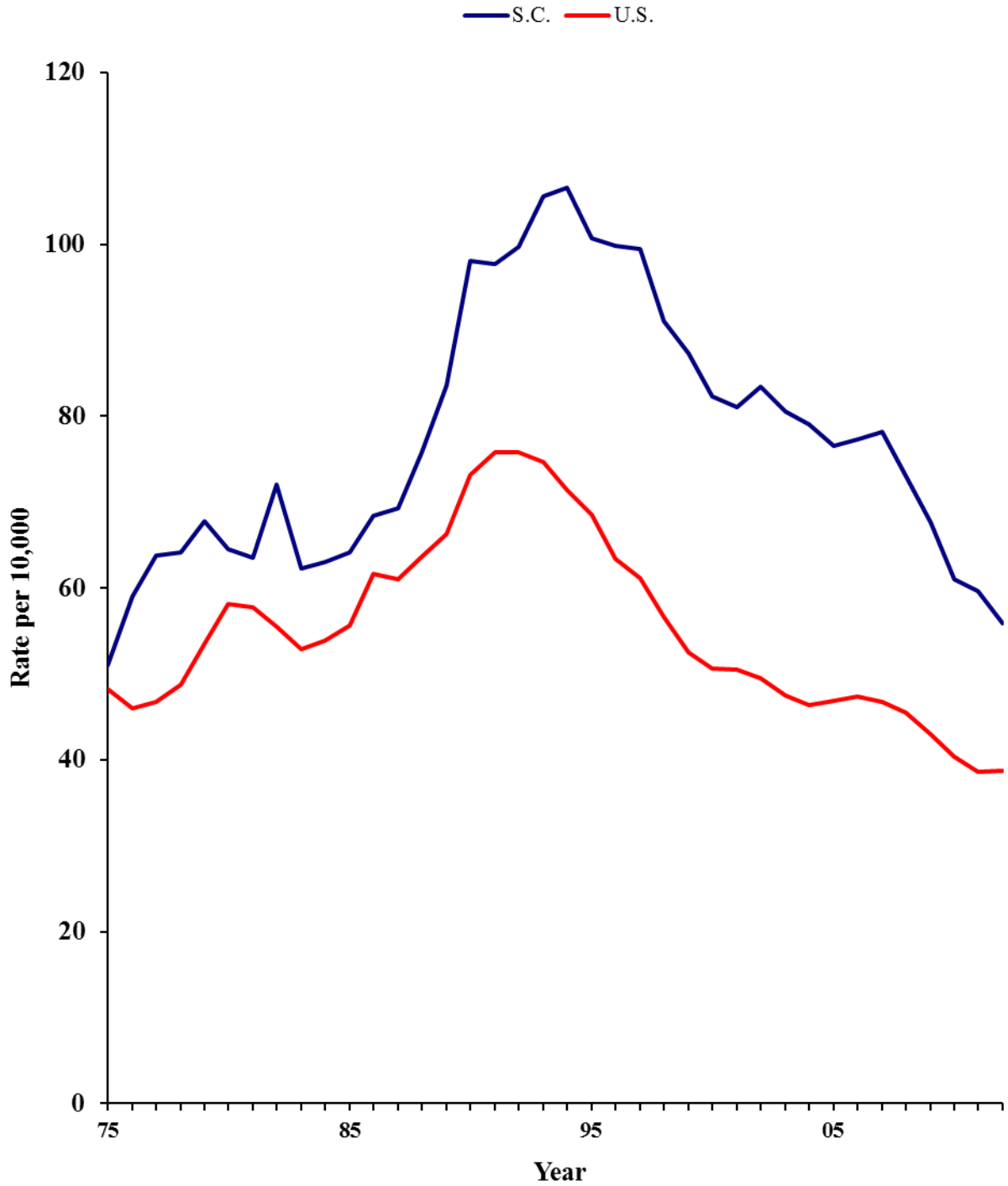

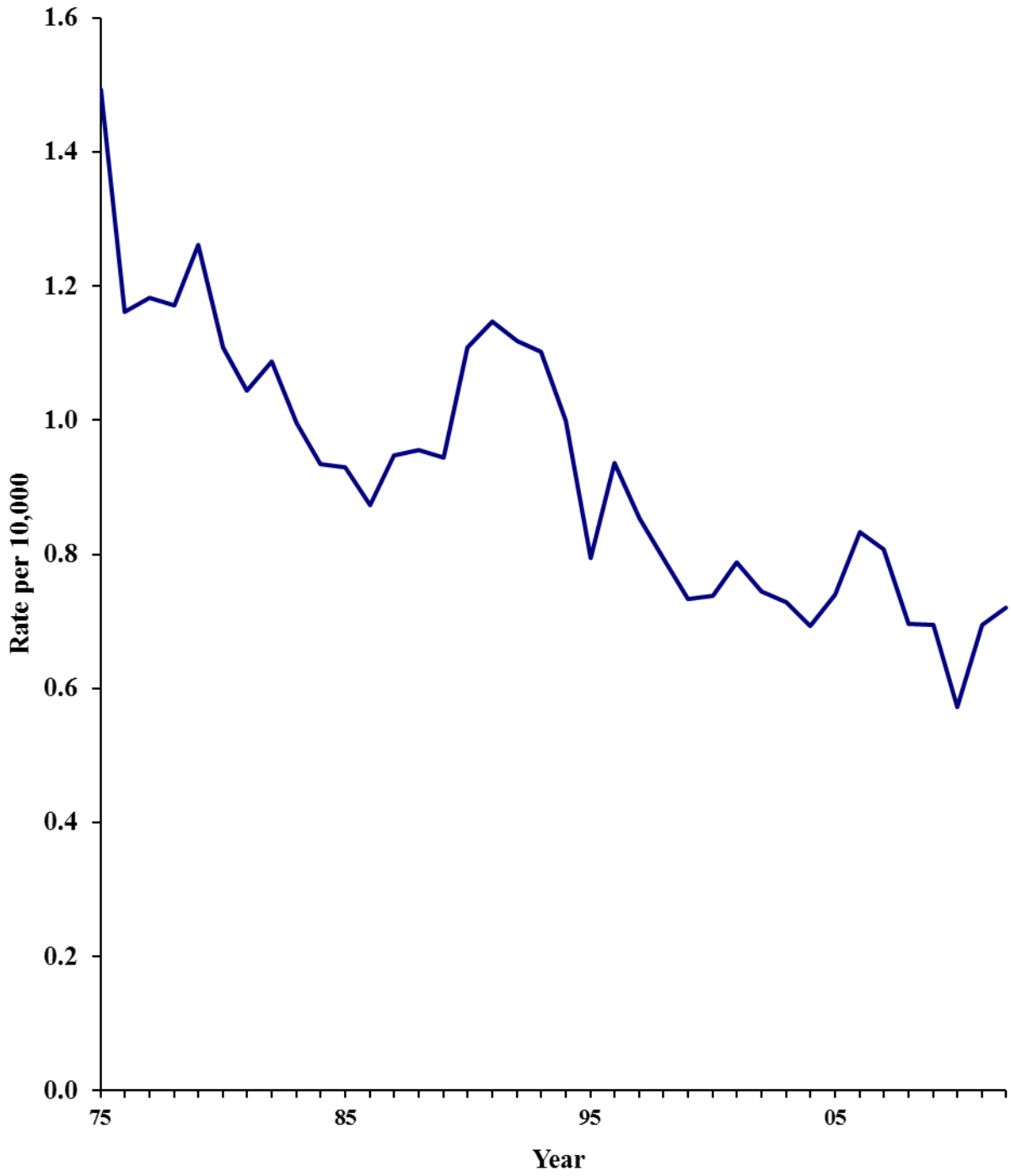
South Carolina's murder rate increased 4.3% from 2011 to 2012. The state murder rate has decreased 51.7% since 1975.

MURDER: Murder is the willful killing of one person by another. The classification of this offense is based on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury or other judicial body. Deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident or justifiable homicides are not included.

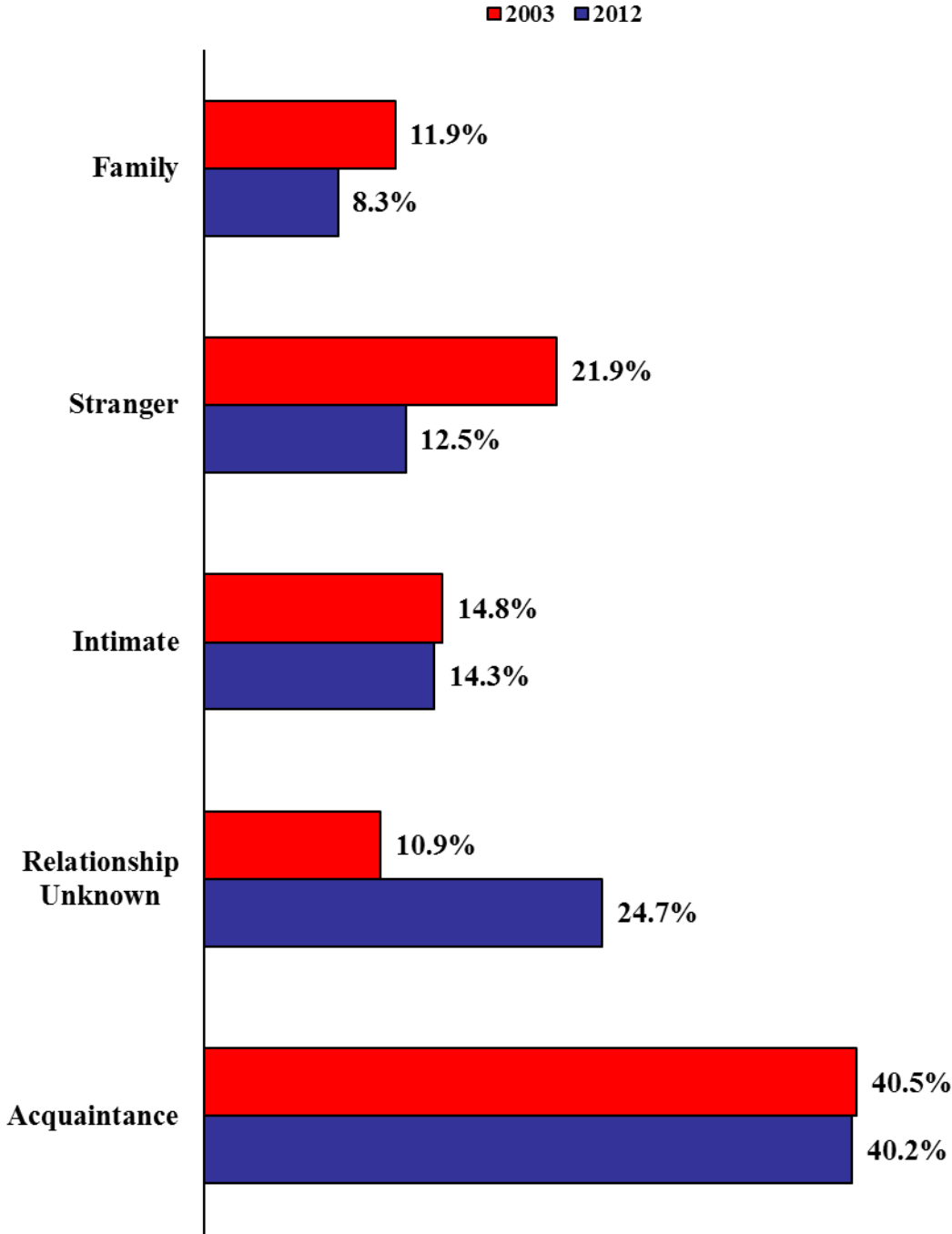

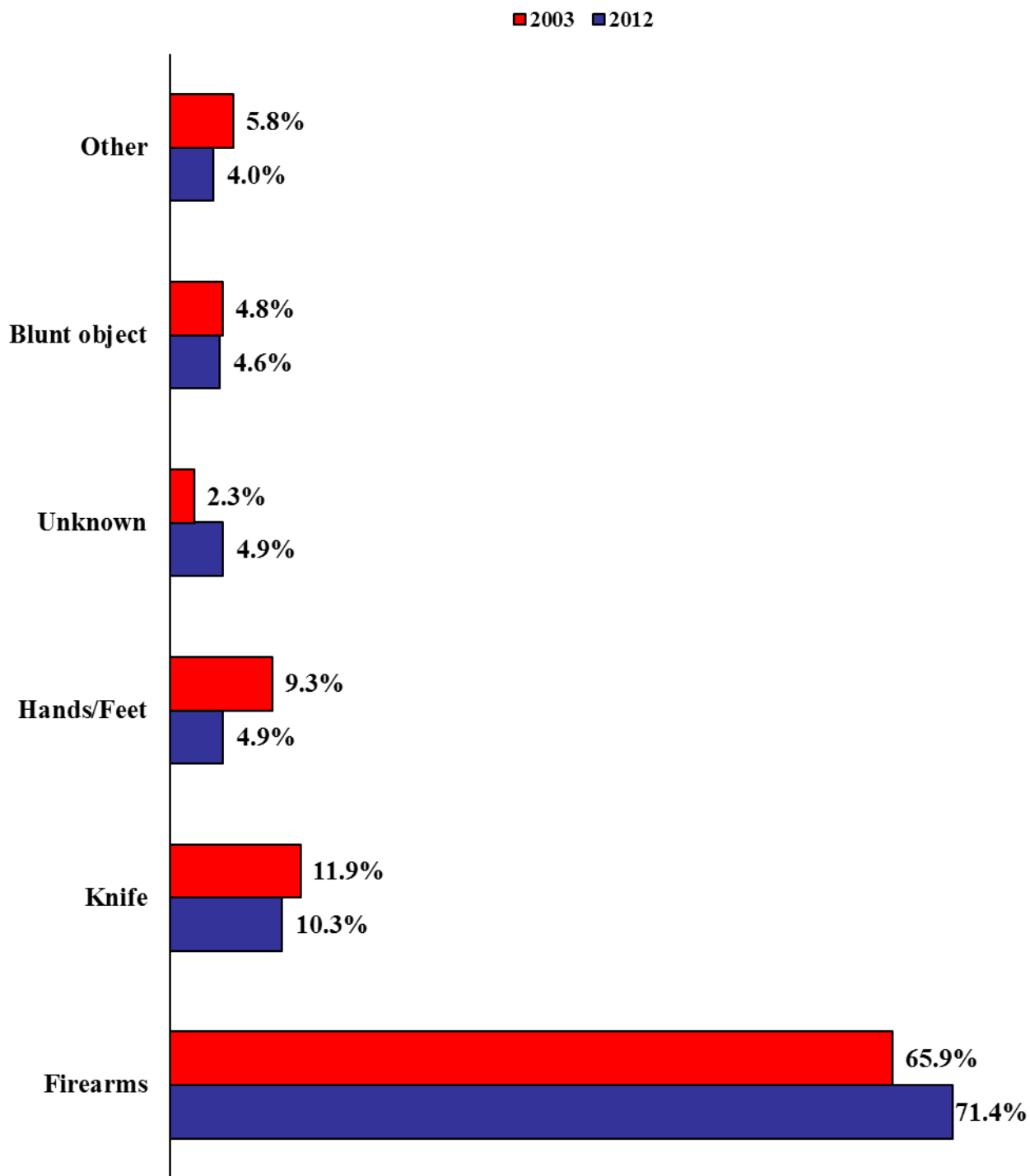
South Carolina Murder Rate

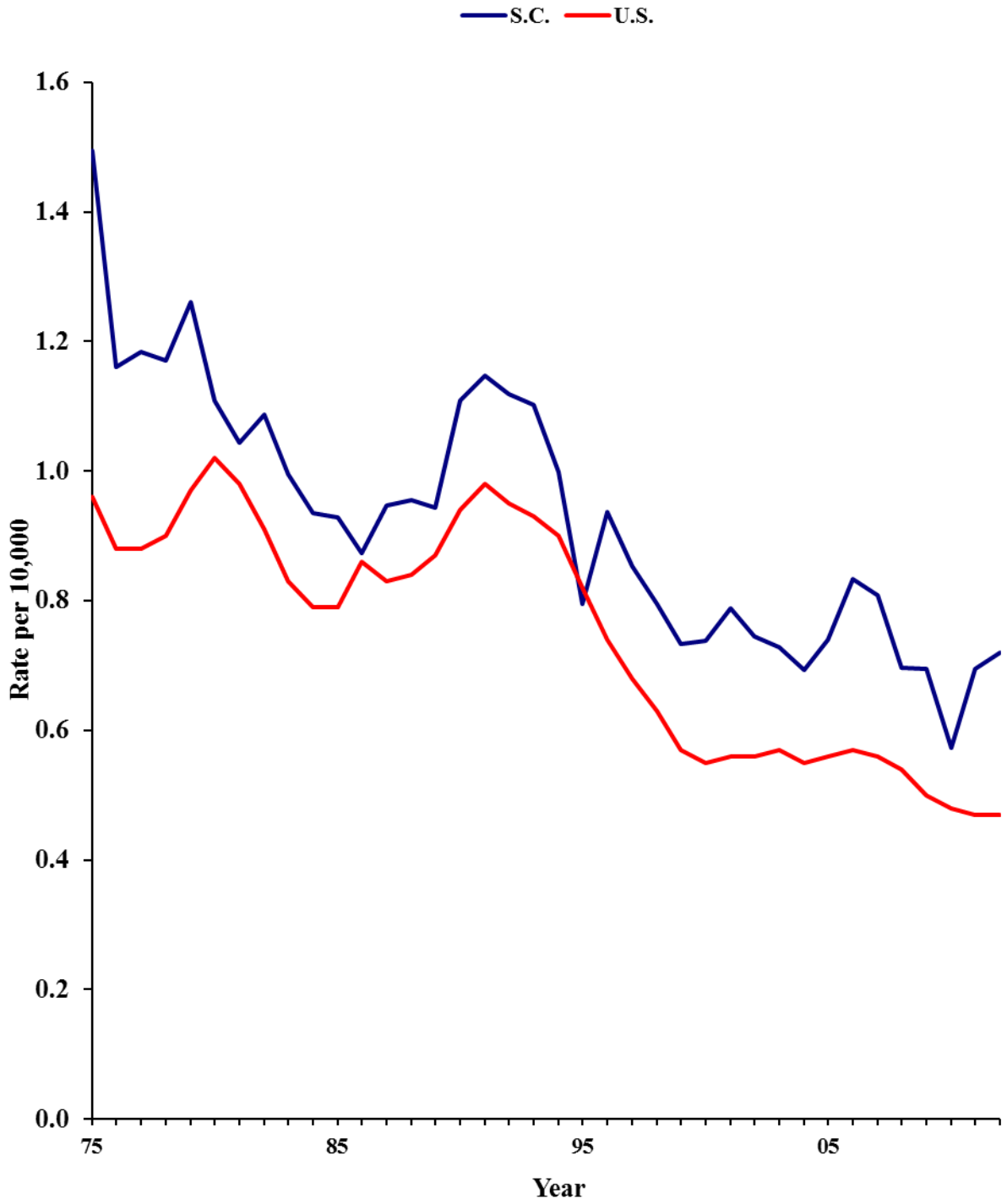

South Carolina had 2,406 rapes reported in 2012 using the revised definition, representing an increase of 697 offenses over the total using the historical definition during the same time period. The 2012 rape rate based on the revised definition was 5.09 rapes per 10,000.

RAPE: The revised (current) definition of rape is penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim. This includes victims of forcible sodomy, sexual assault with an object and male victims.

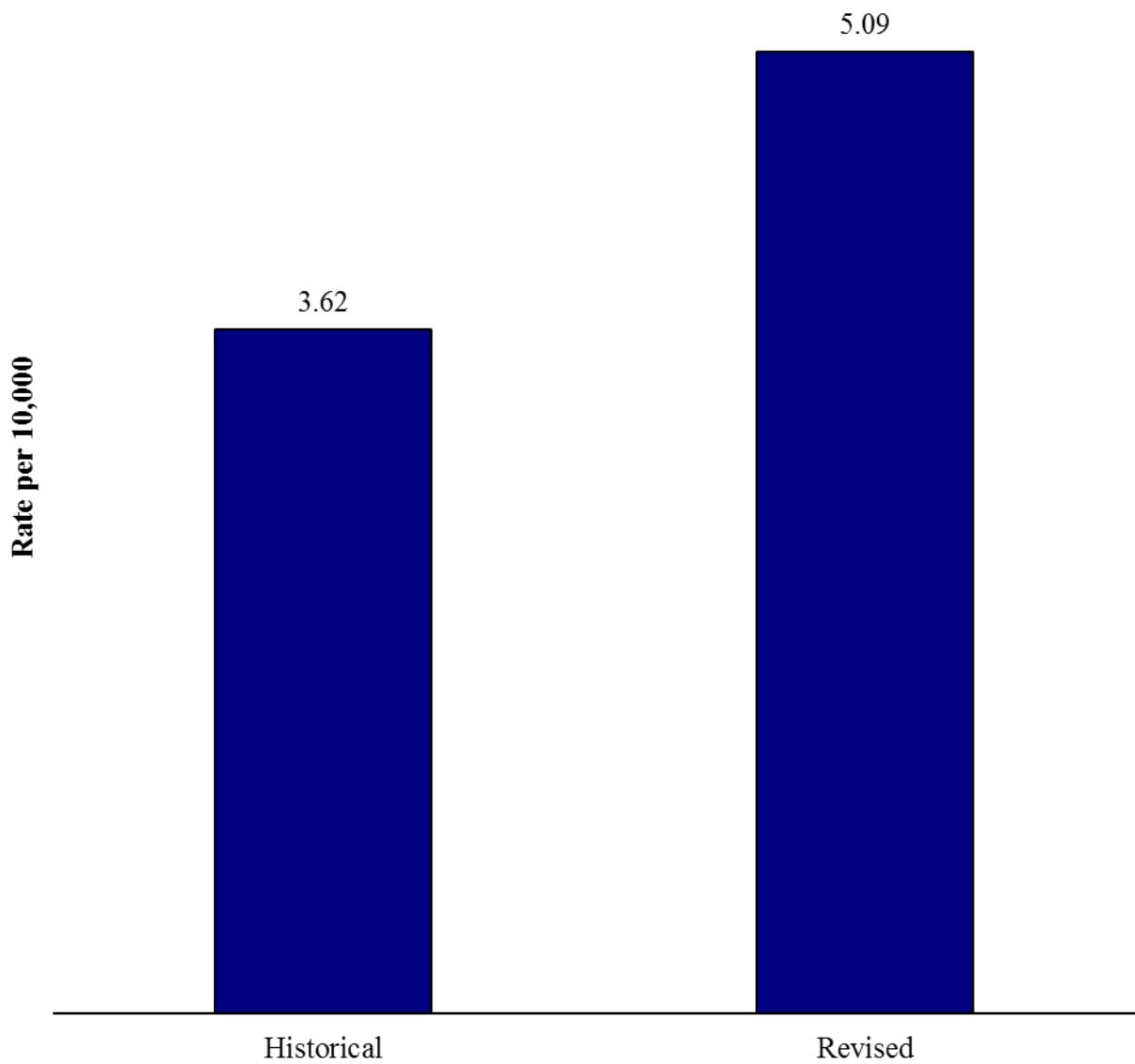

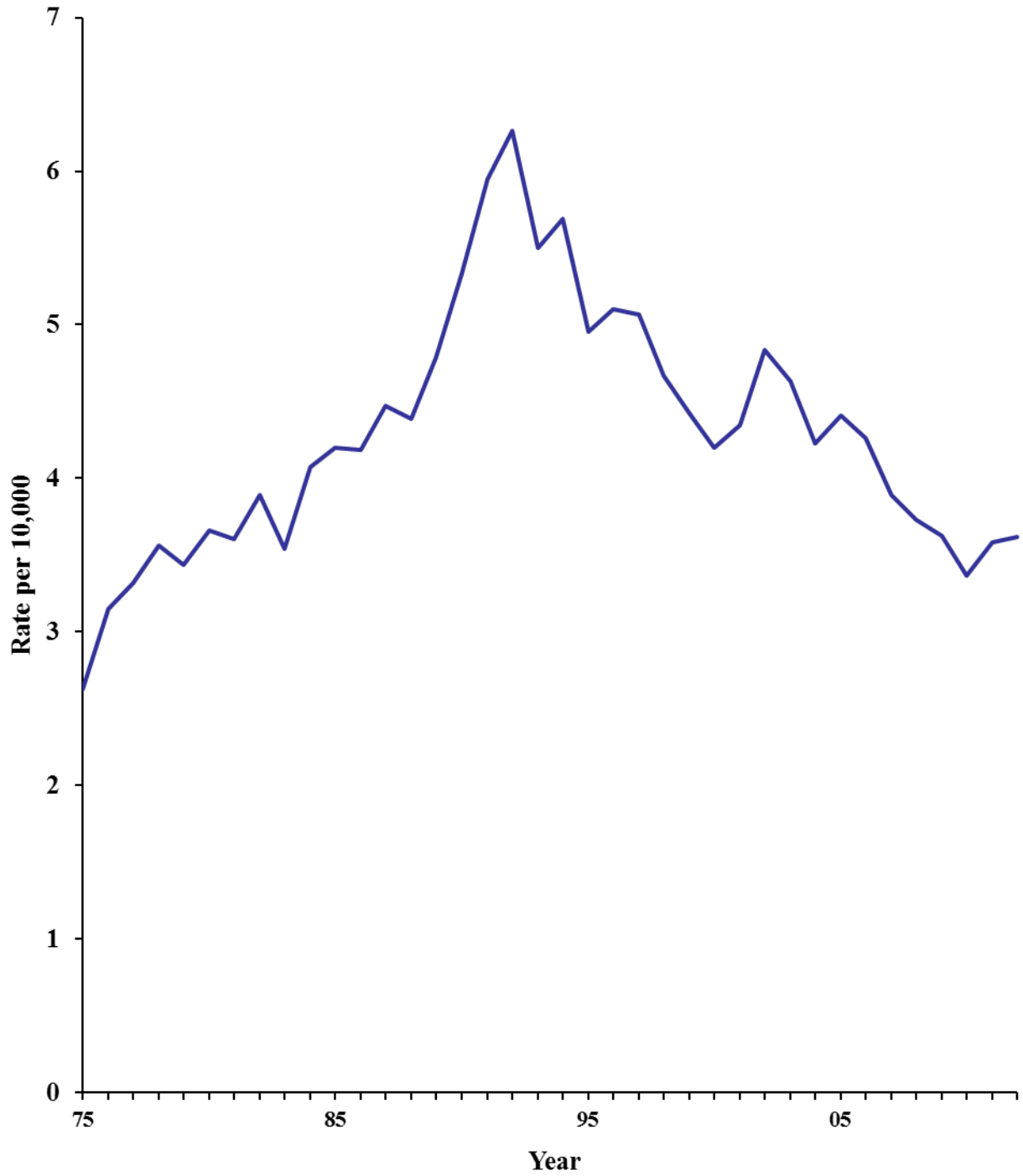
Using the definition of rape in effect prior to 2012, South Carolina's rape rate increased less than 1% from 2011 to 2012. Since 1975 the rape rate has increased 37.6%.

RAPE: Historically, rape was defined as the carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and against their will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded.

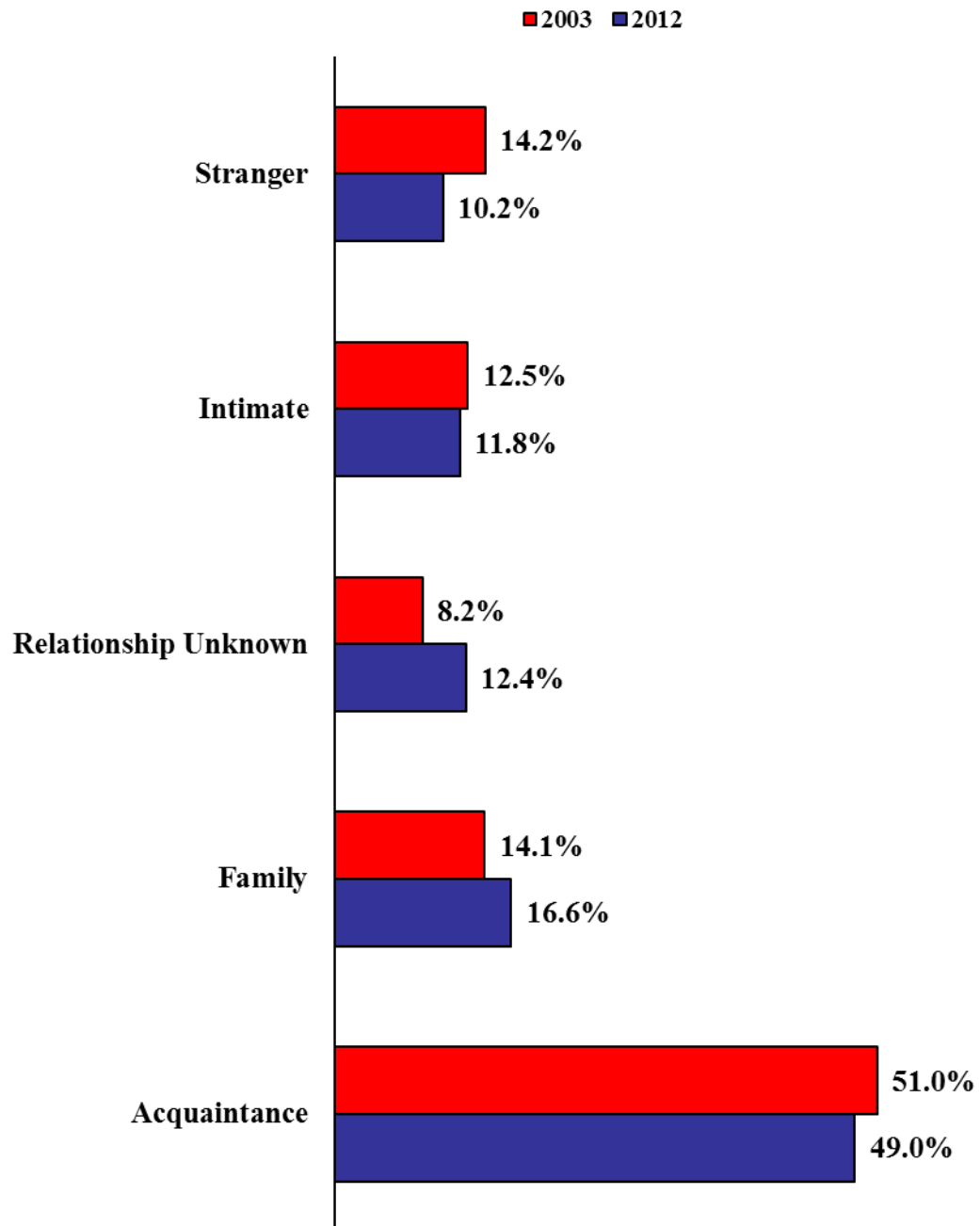

South Carolina Rape Rate



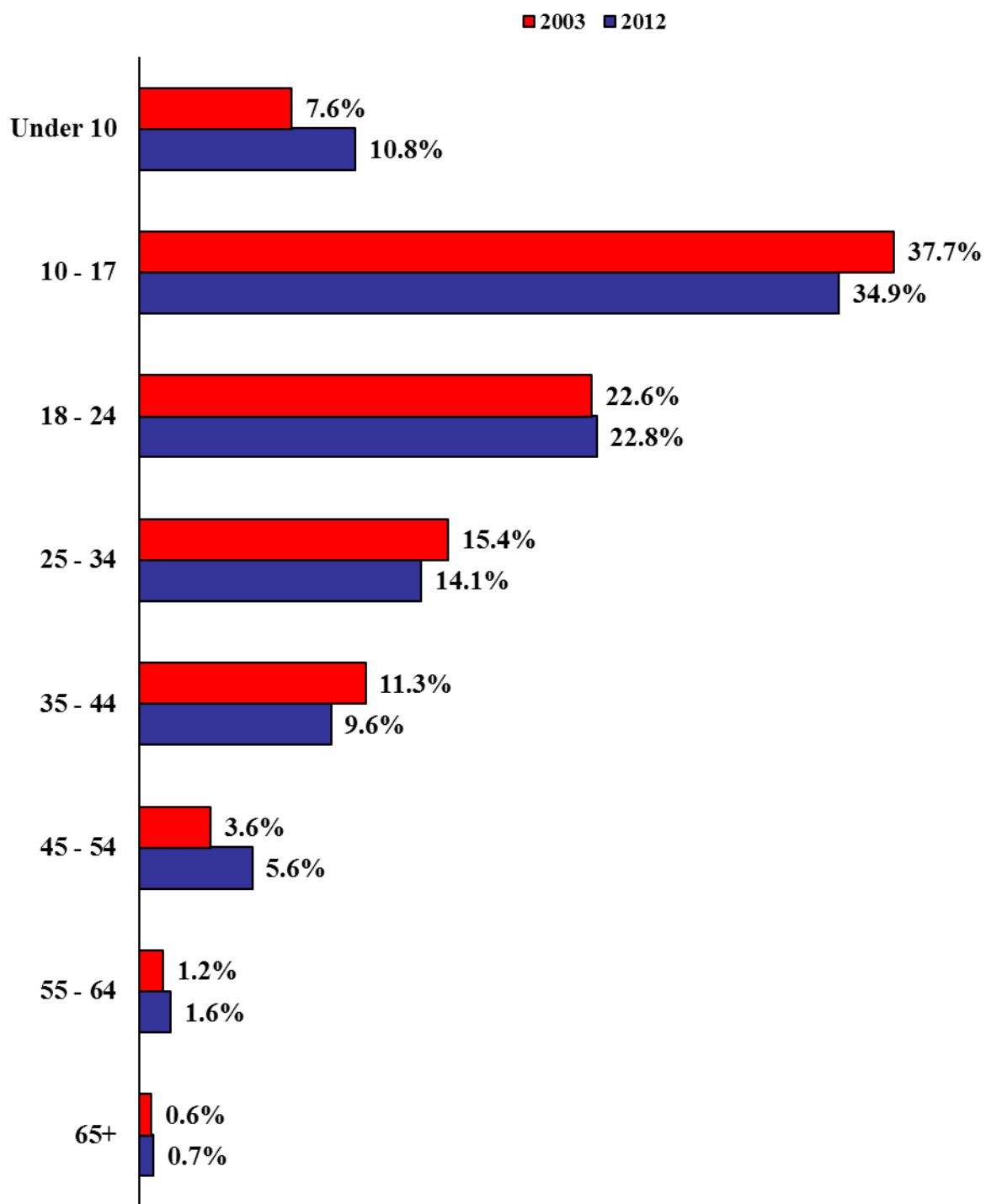

South Carolina Rape Victims by Age



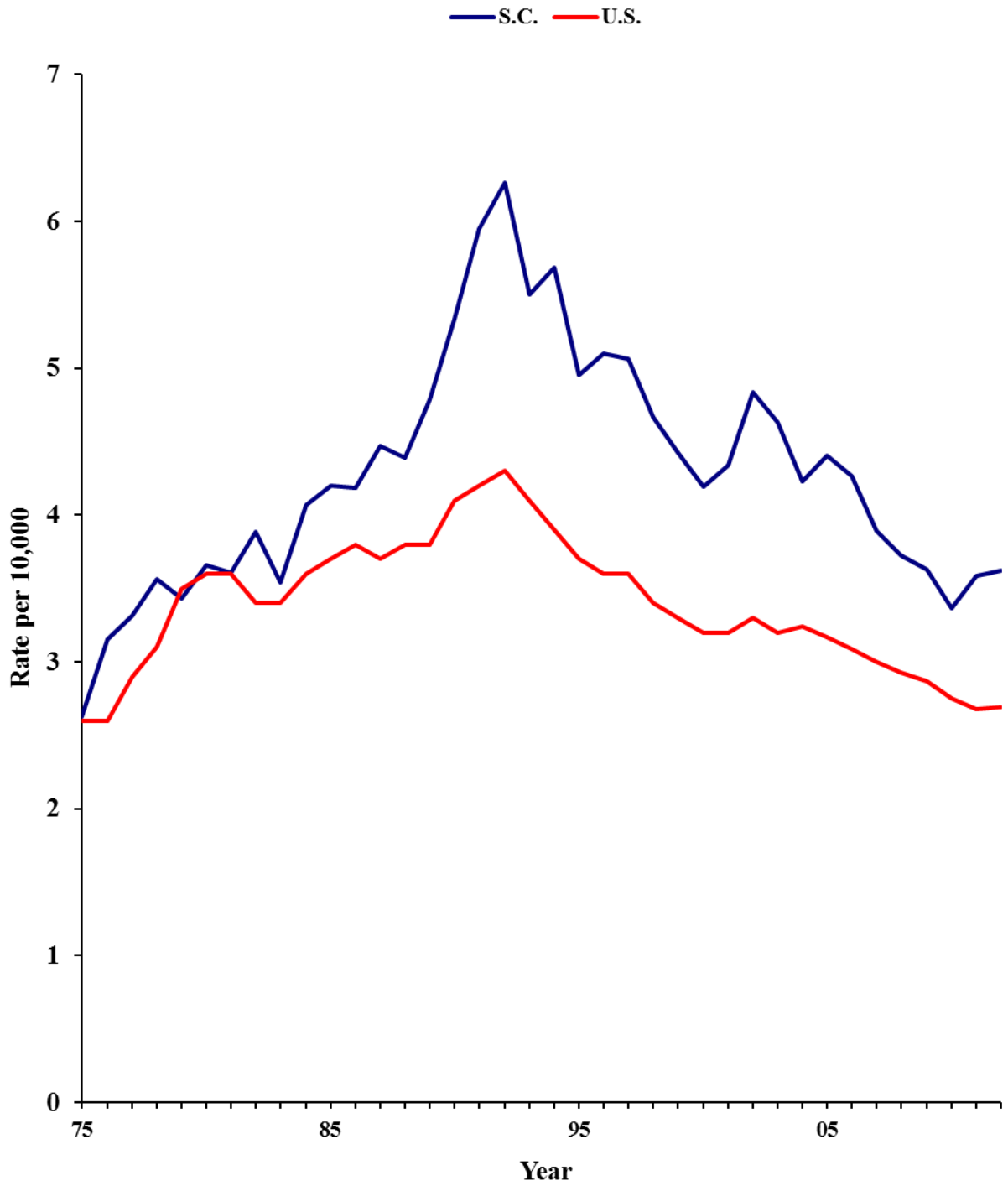

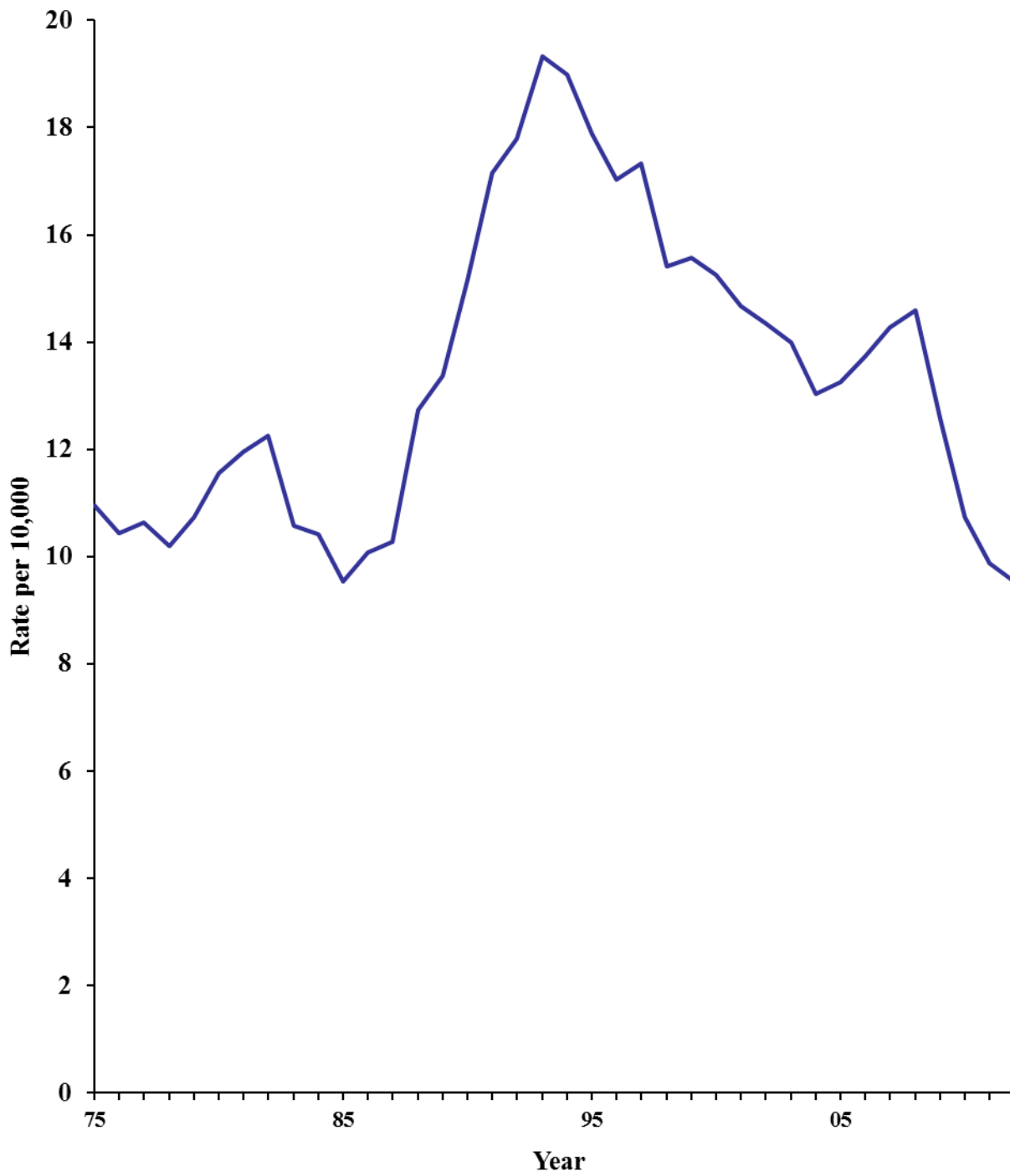
South Carolina's robbery rate decreased 3.5% from 2011 to 2012. From 1975 to 2012 the robbery rate declined 13.1%.

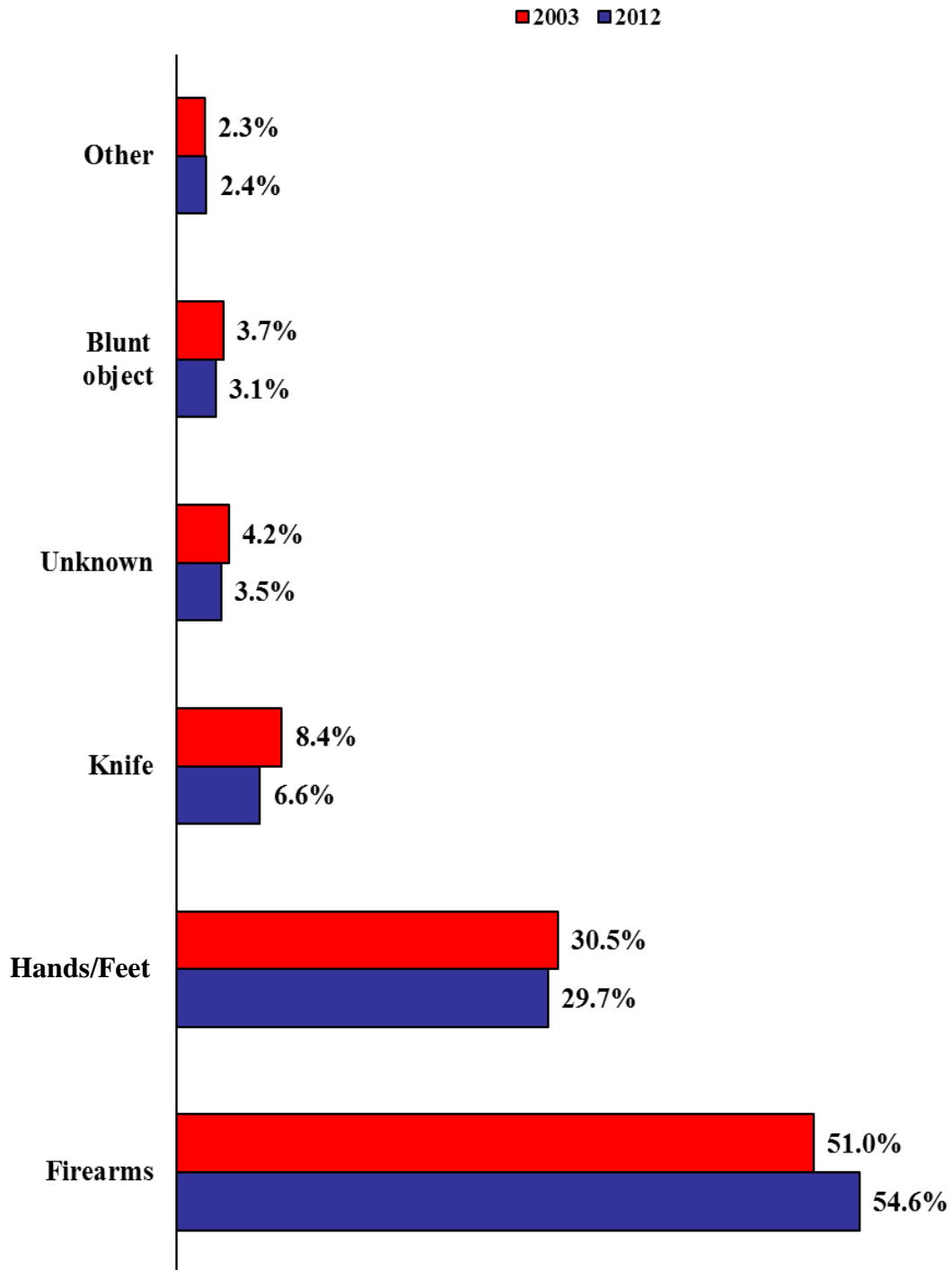

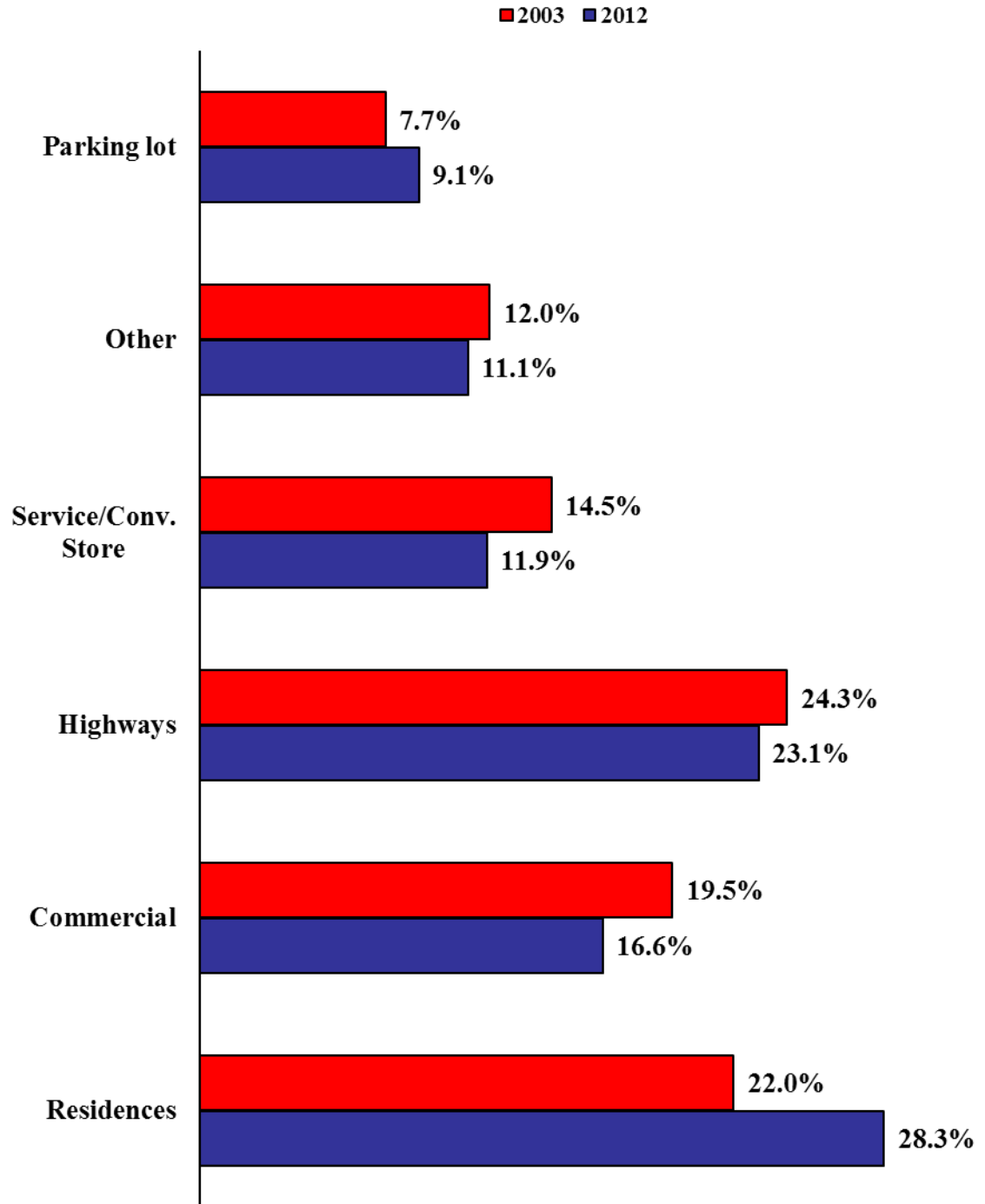
South Carolina Robbery Rate

South Carolina Robberies by Location

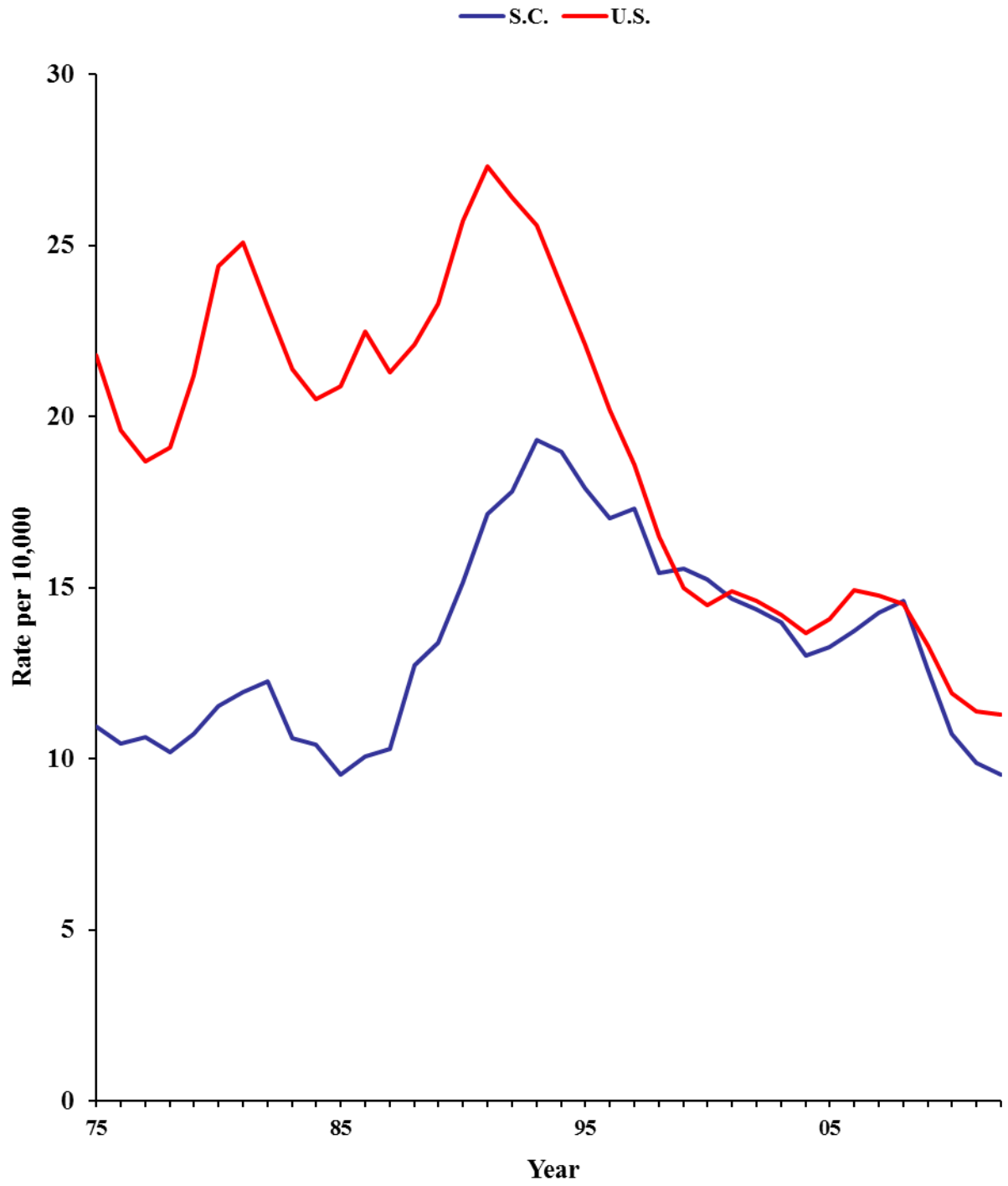

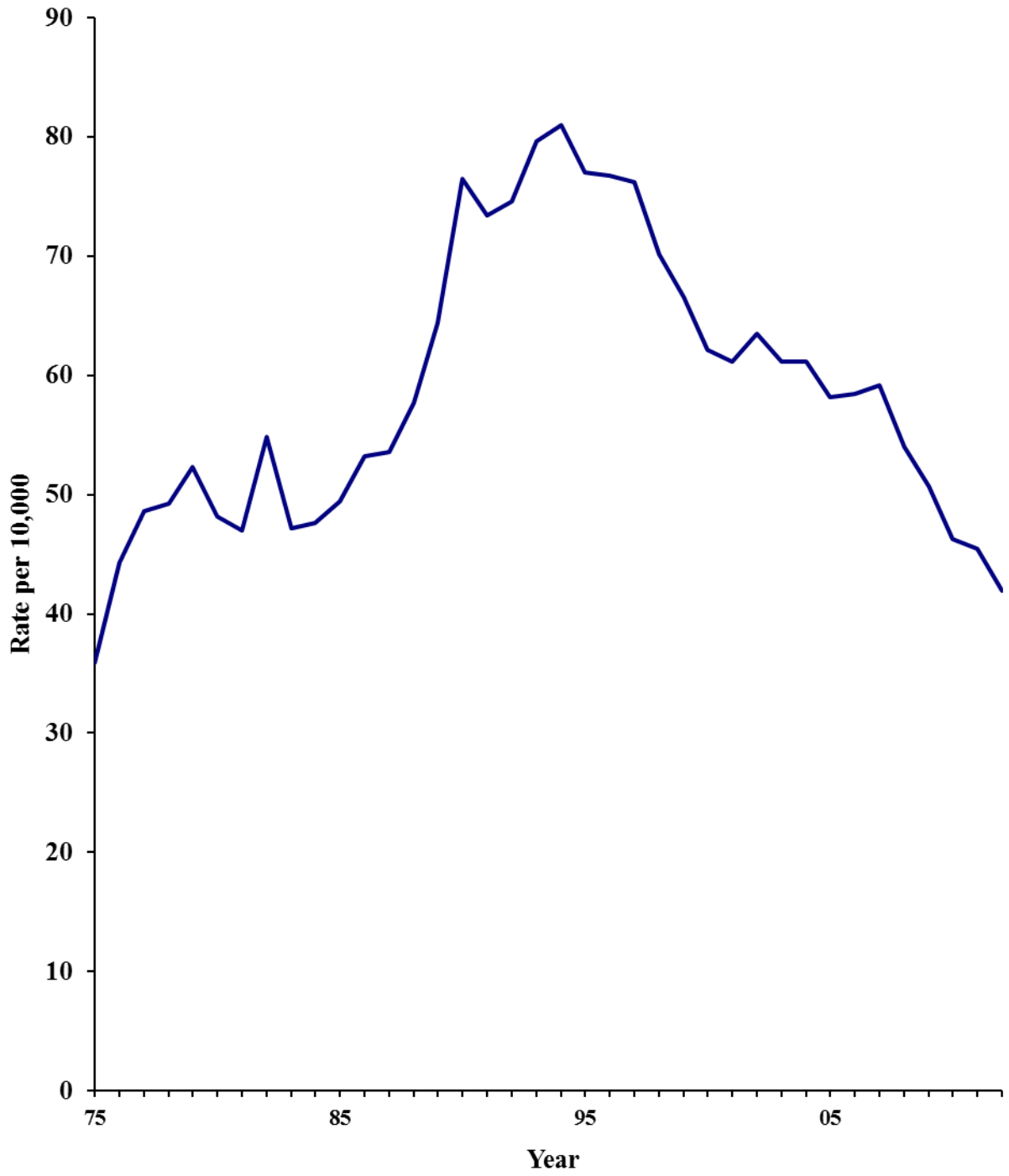
South Carolina's aggravated assault rate decreased 7.7% from 2011 to 2012, but has increased 16.9% from 1975 to 2012.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT: Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.

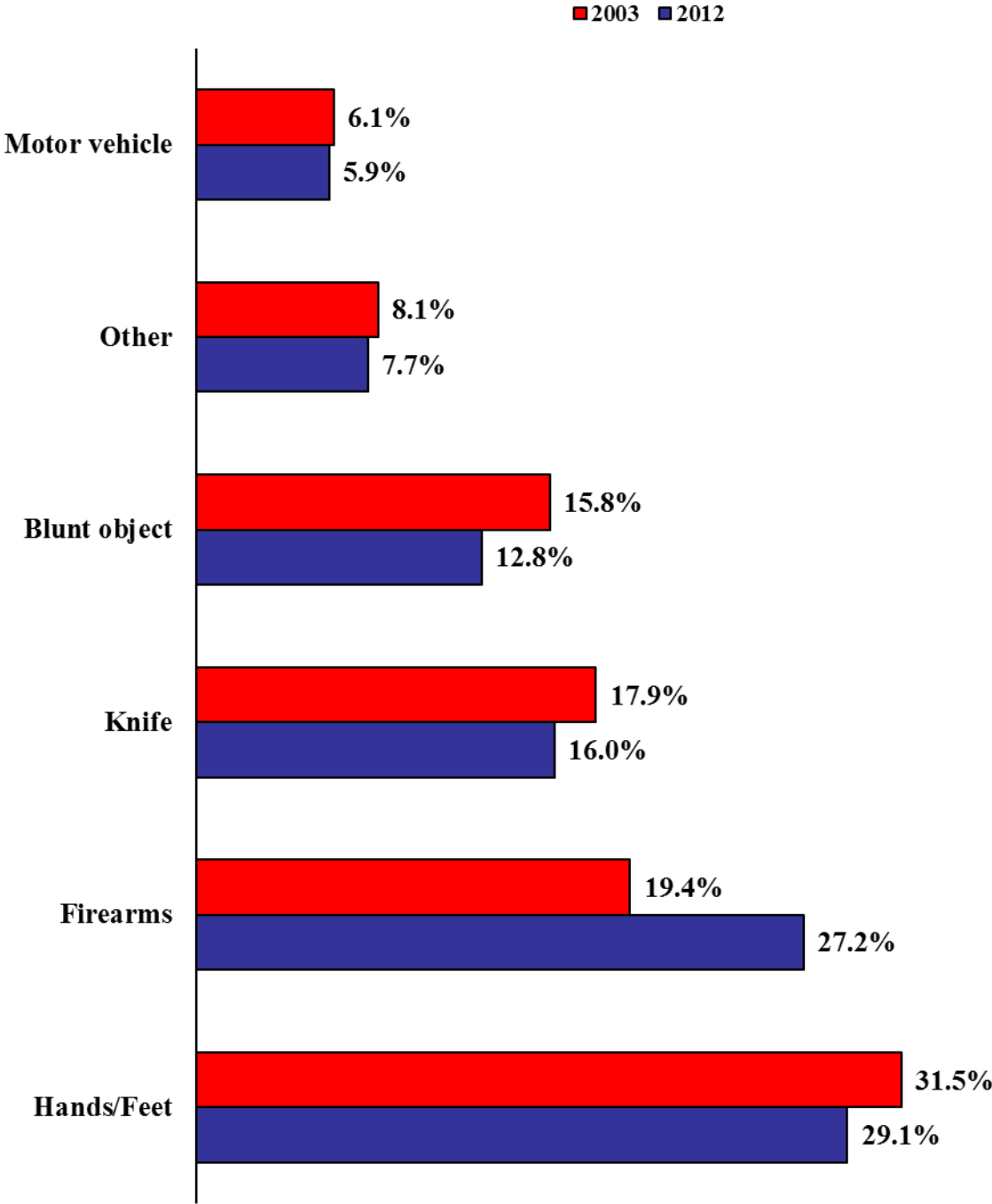

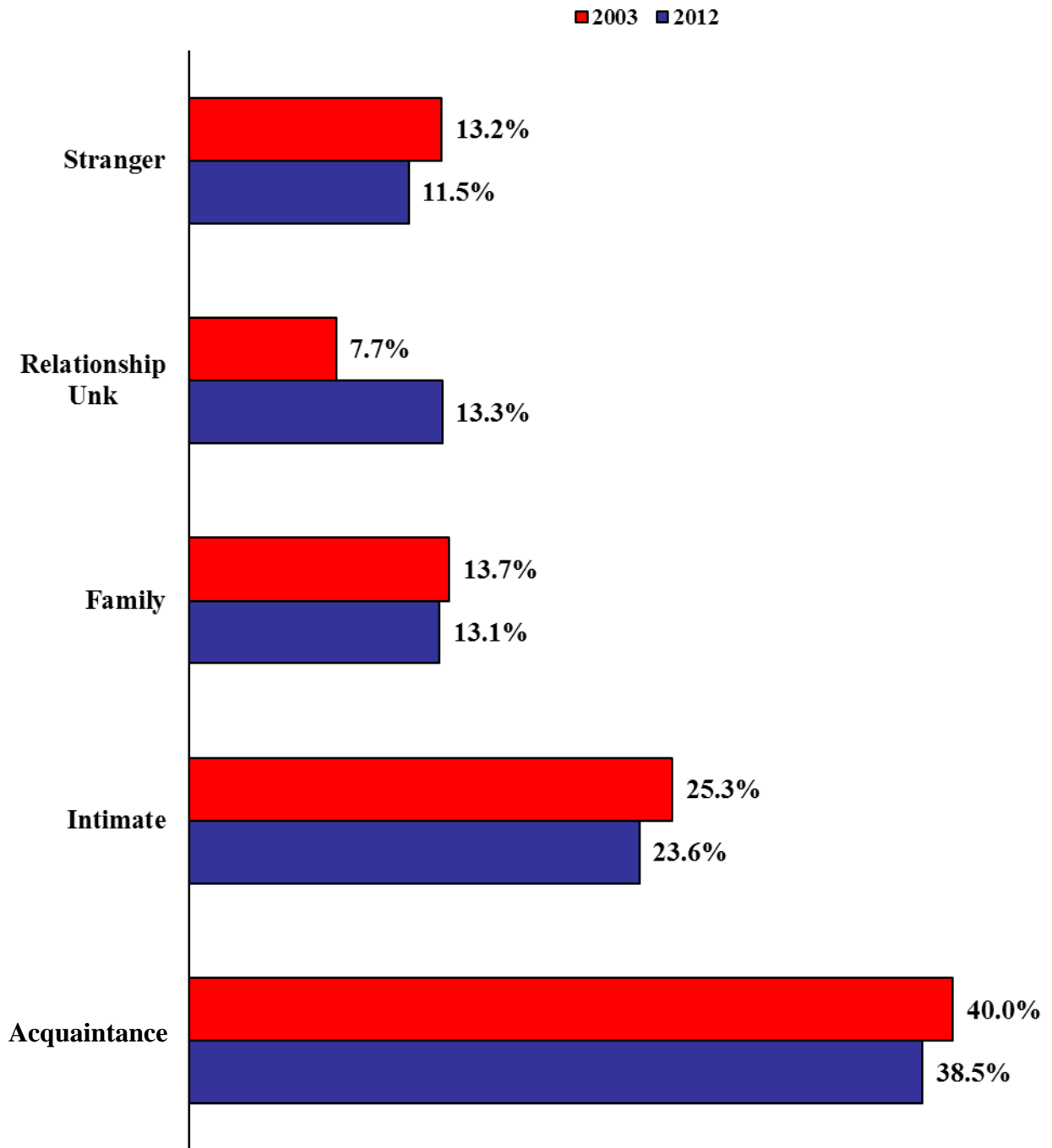
South Carolina Aggravated Assault Rate

Relationship of Victims to Offenders in South Carolina Aggravated Assaults

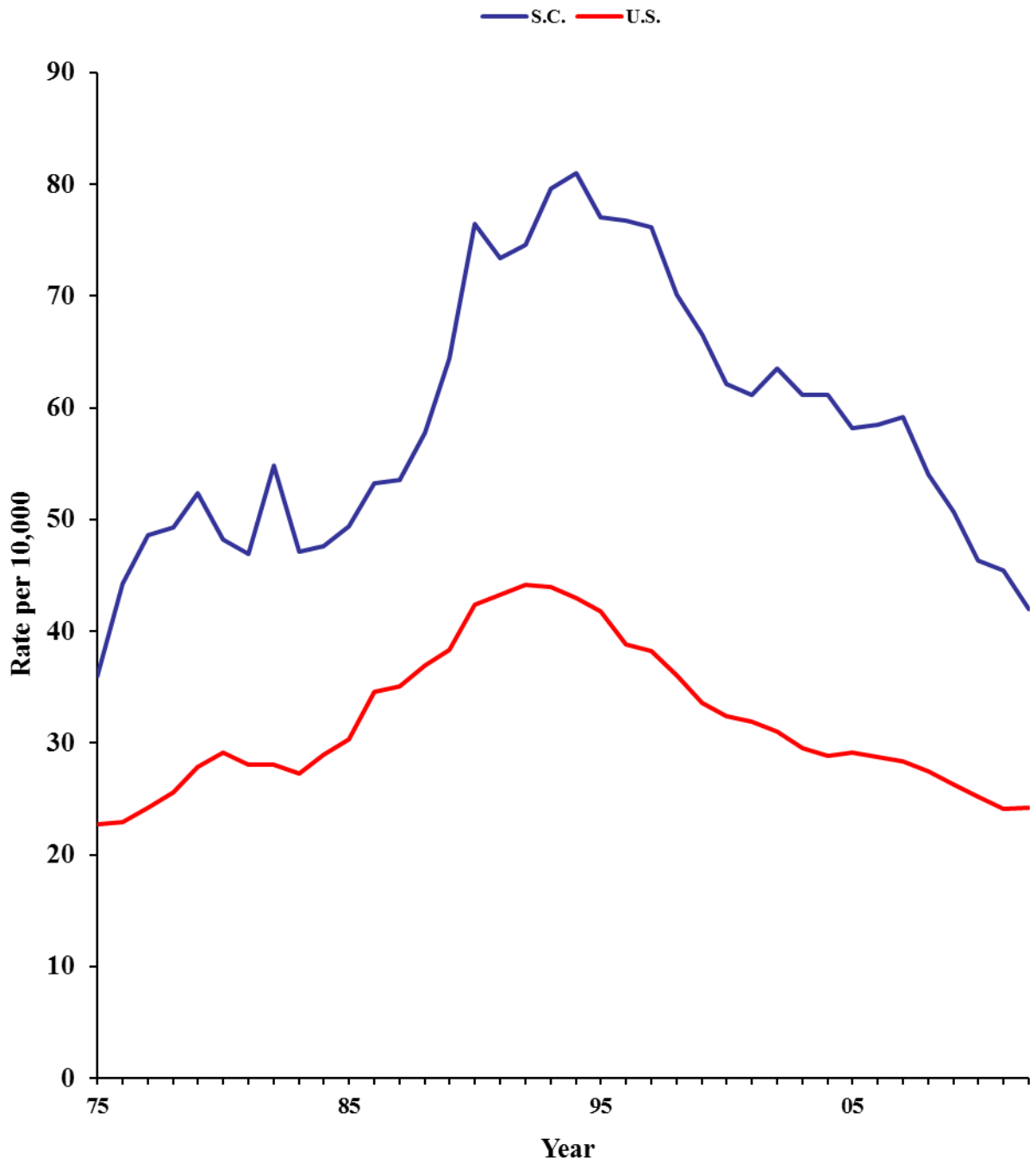

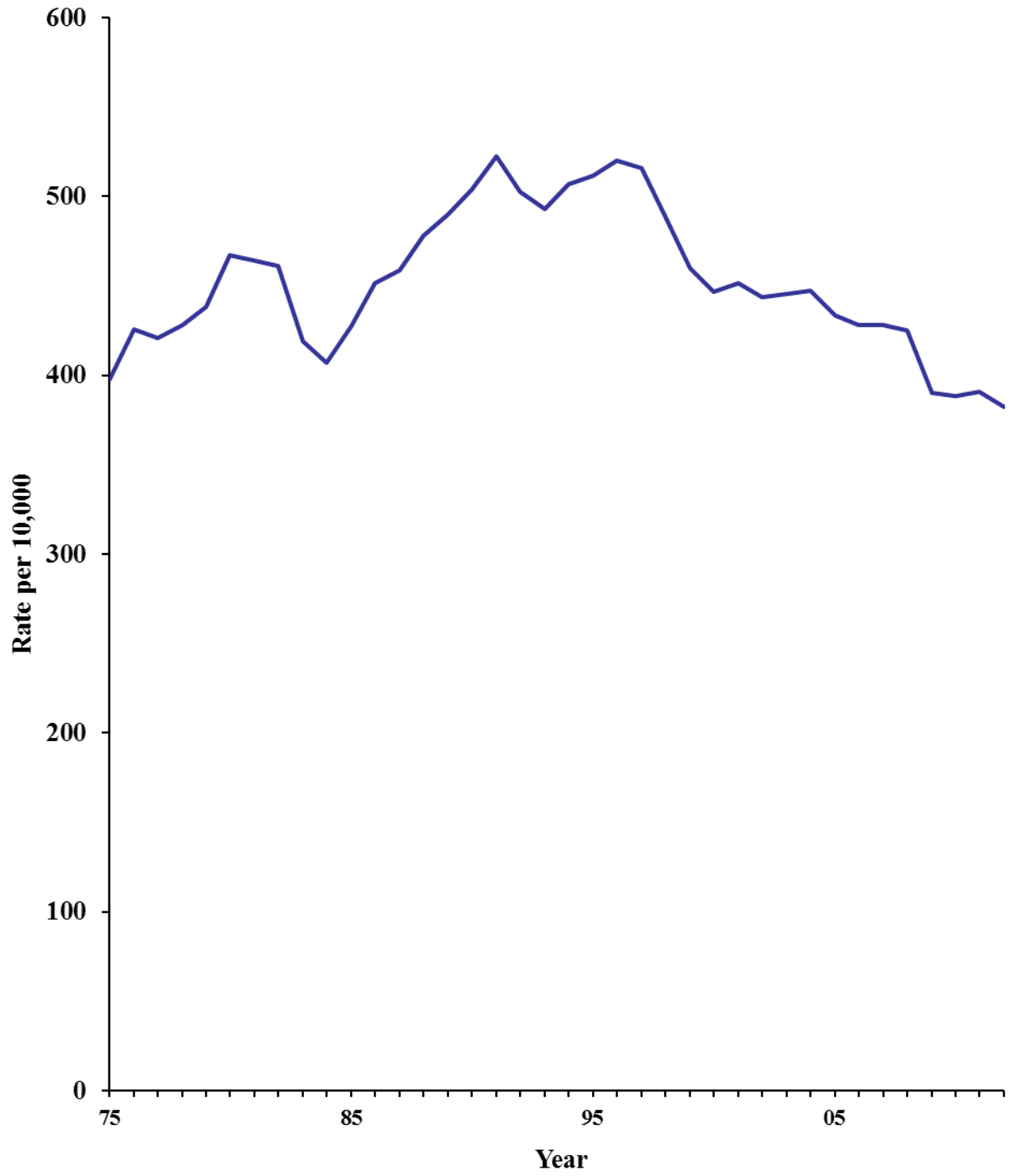

South Carolina Property Crime Rate

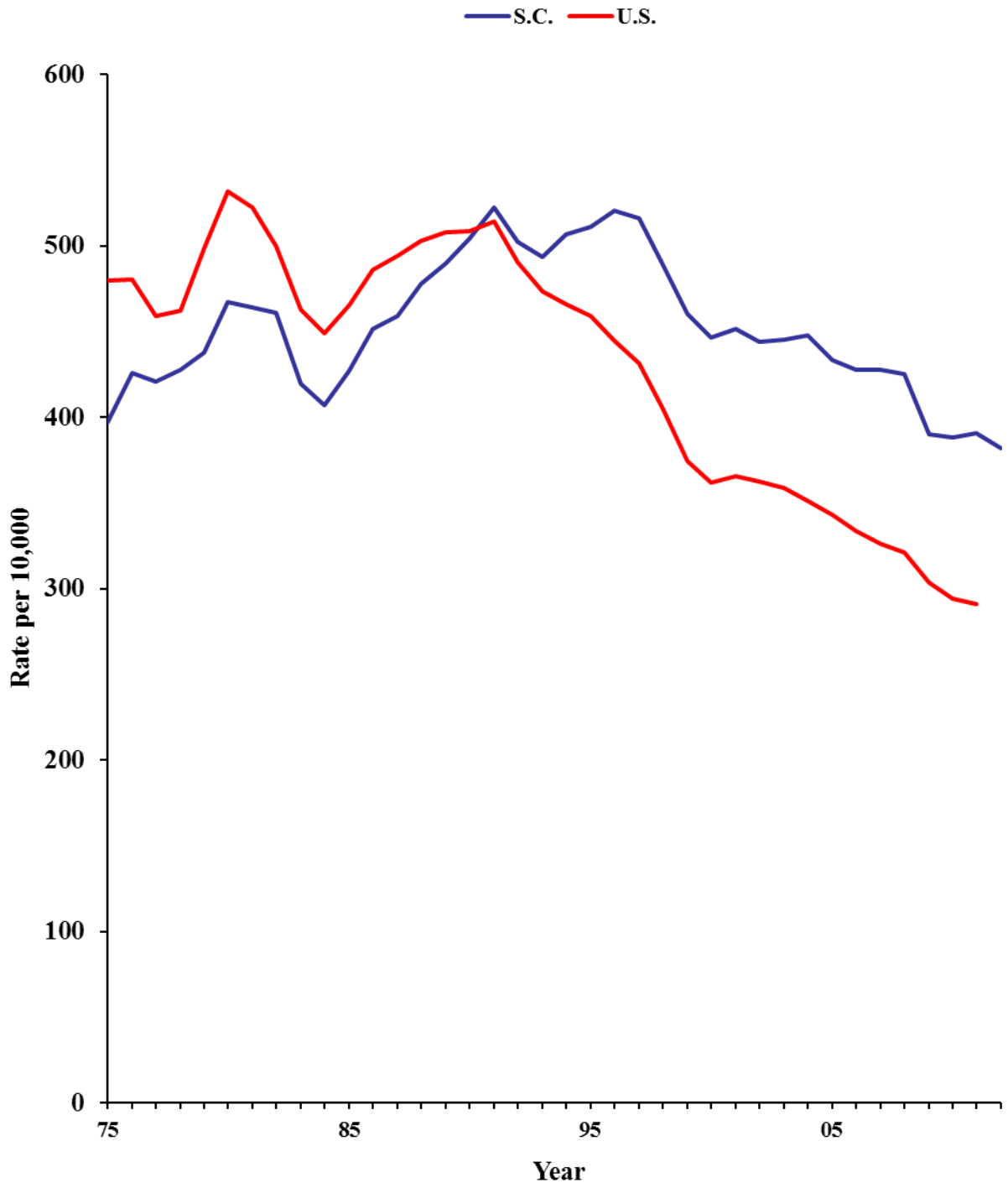

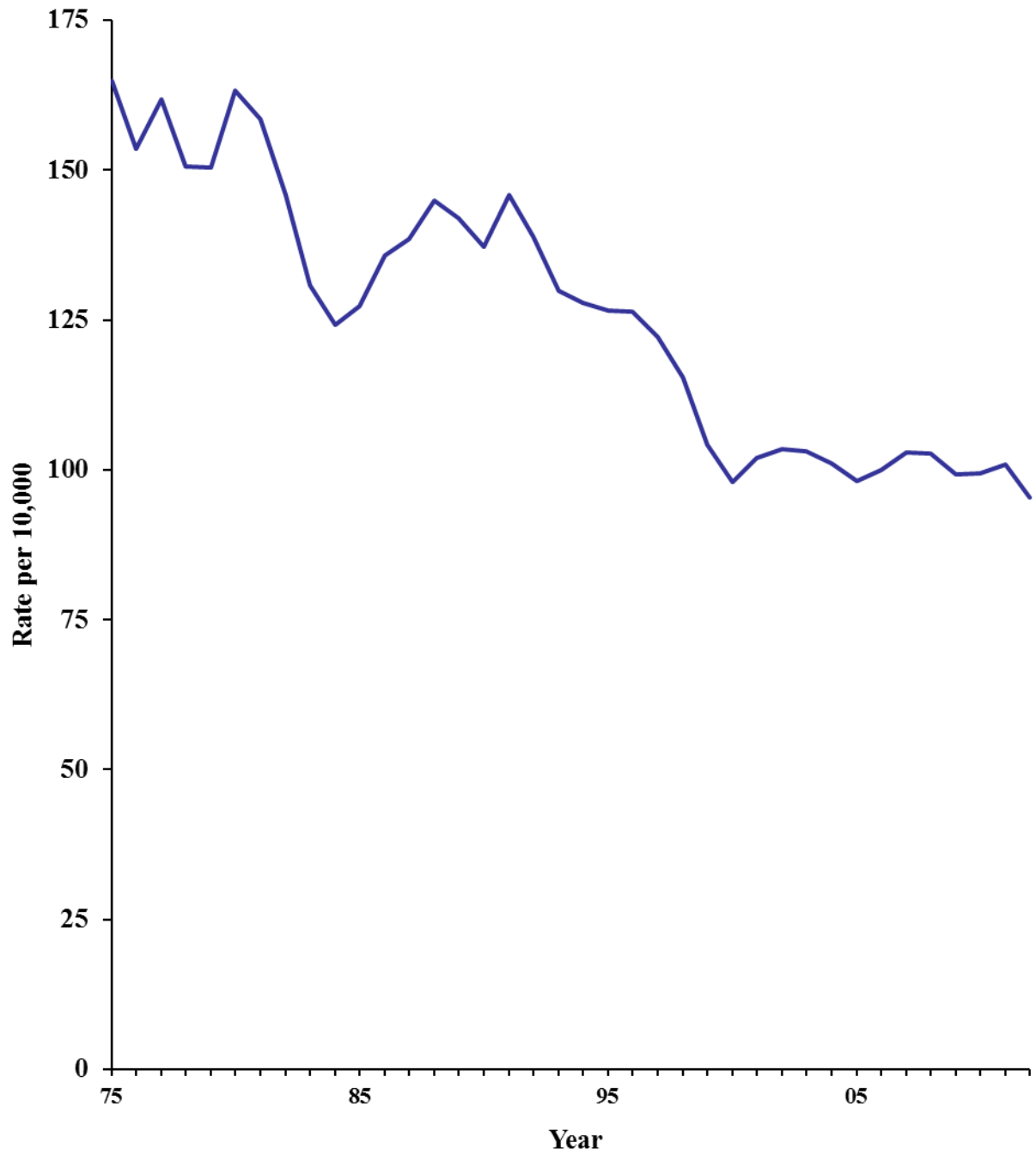

South Carolina Breaking and Entering Rate

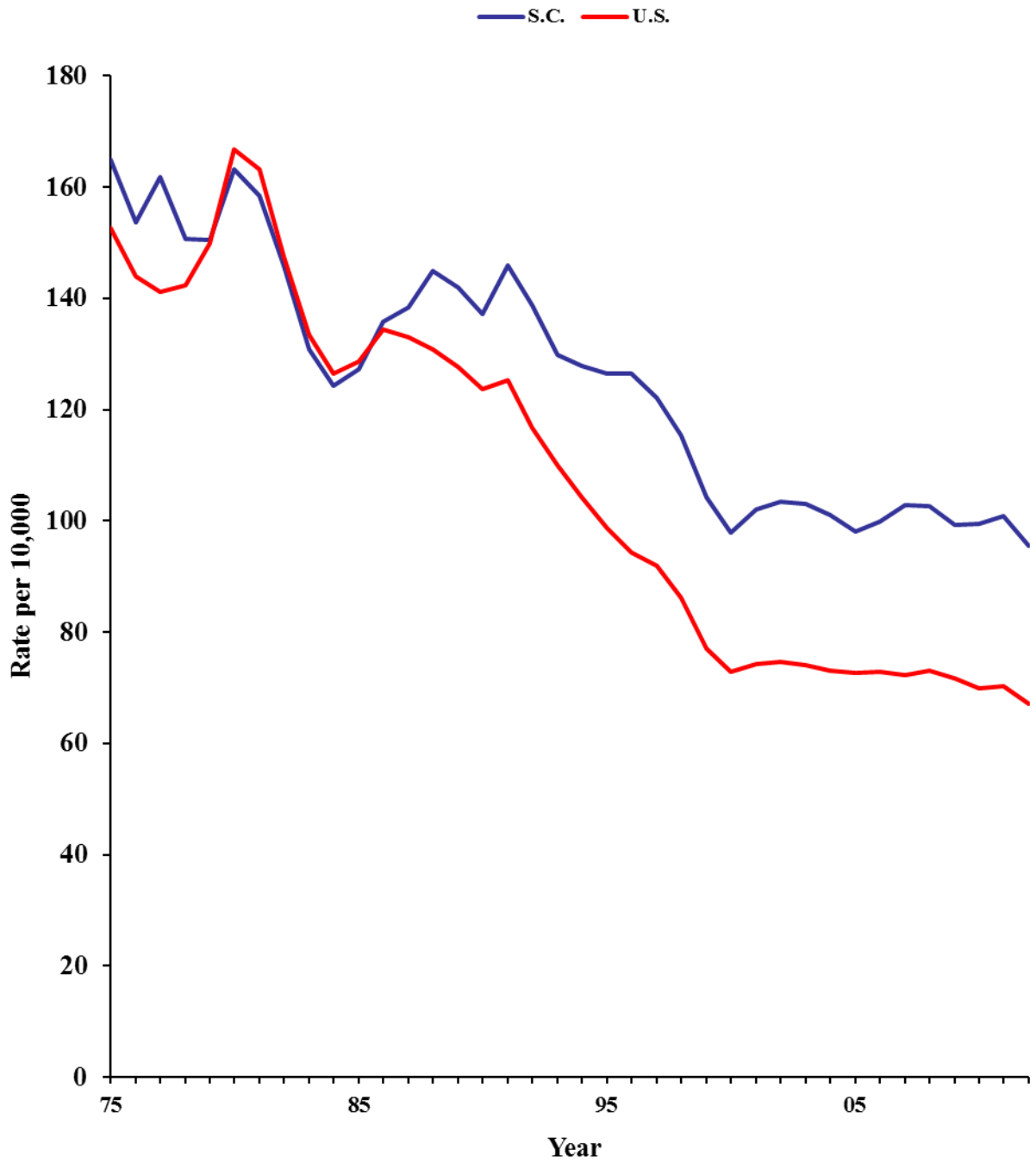

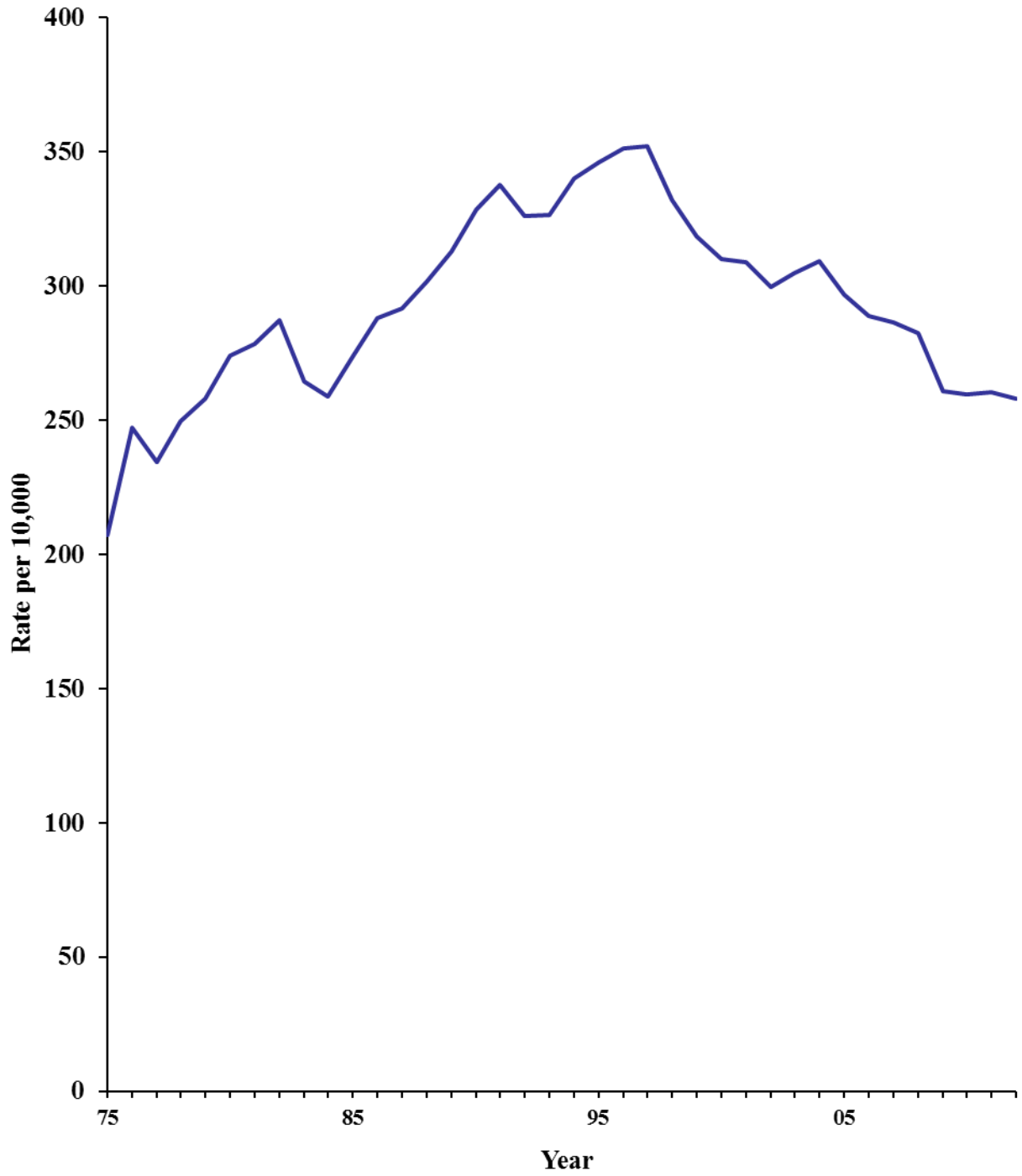

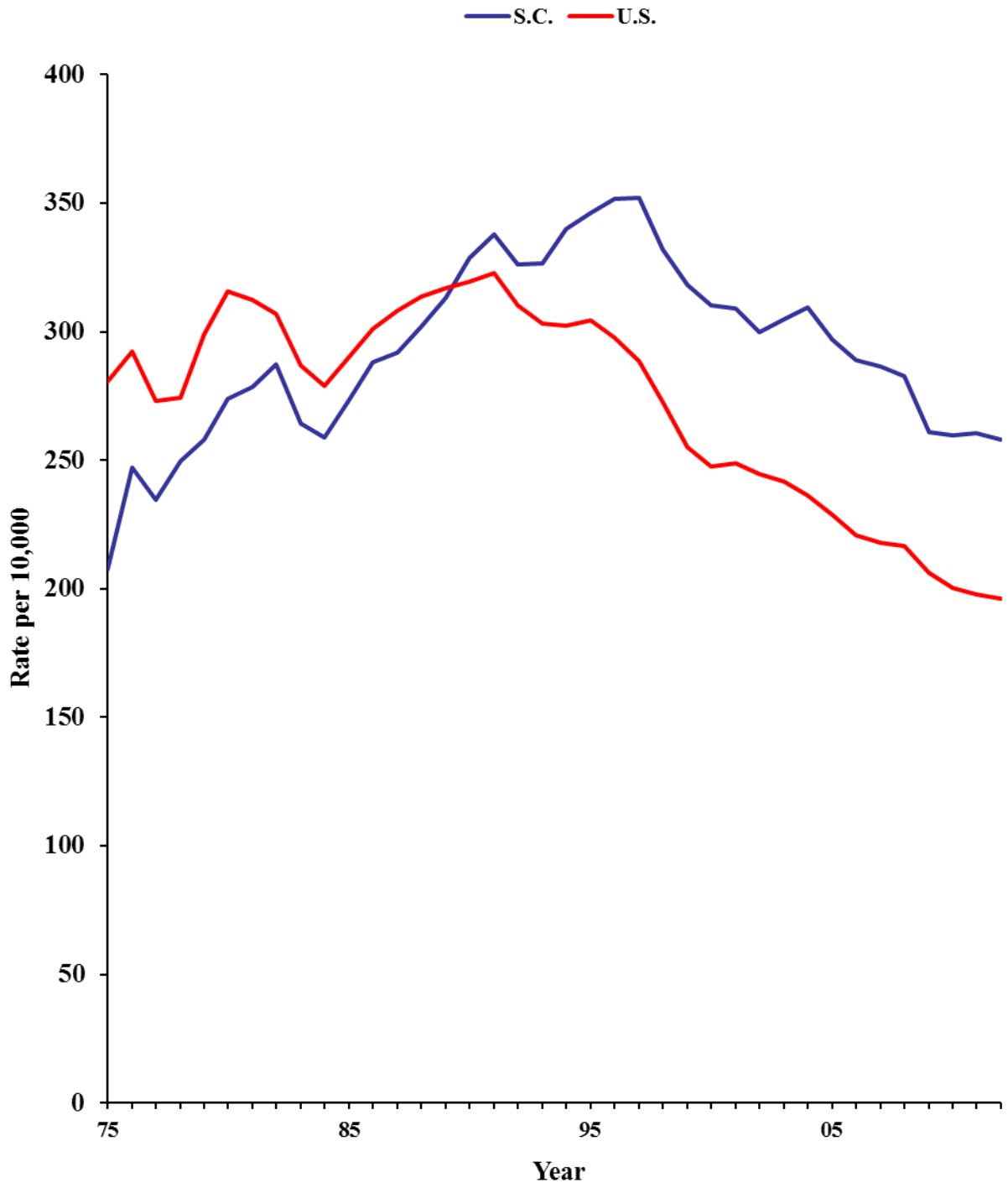

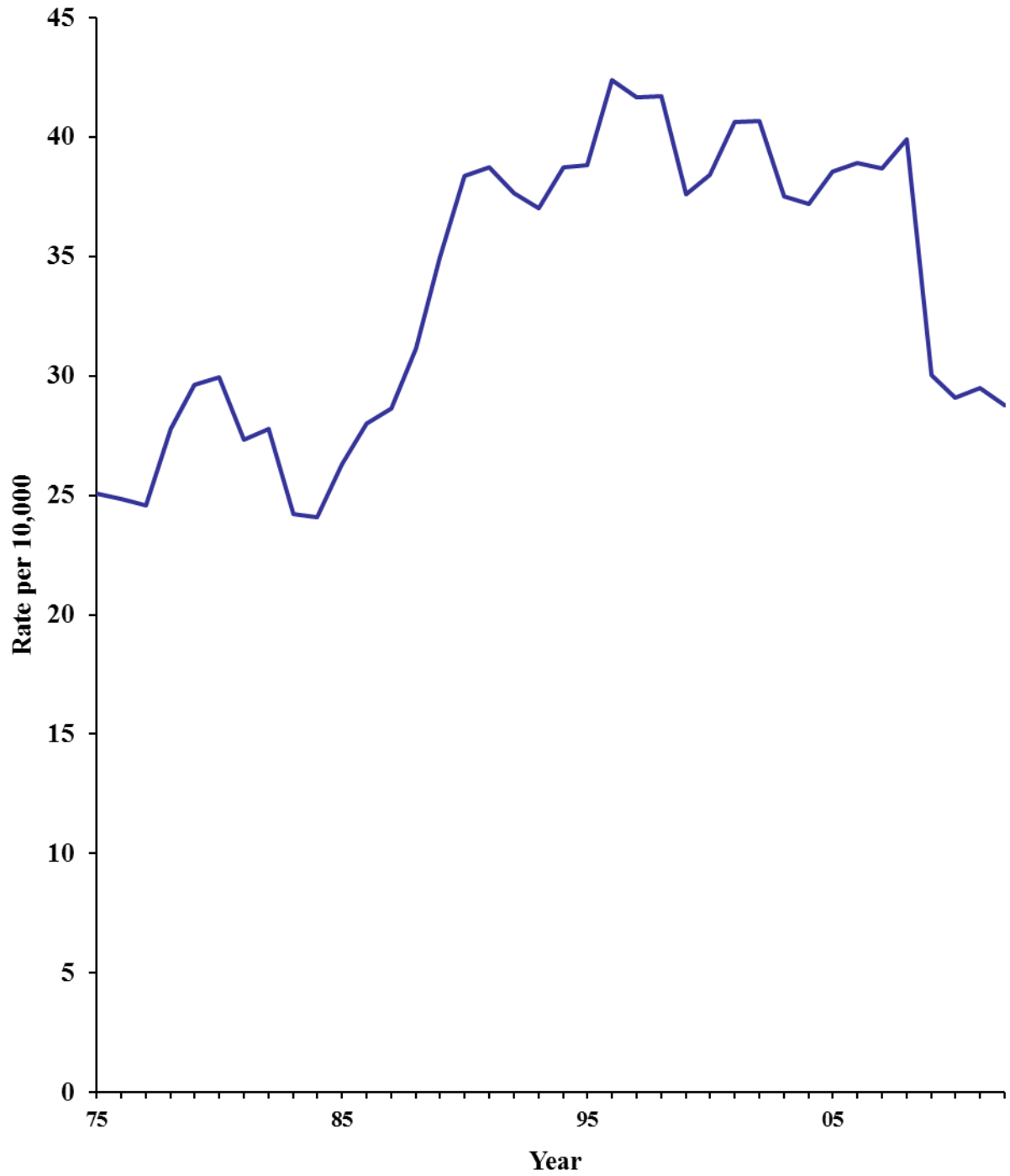

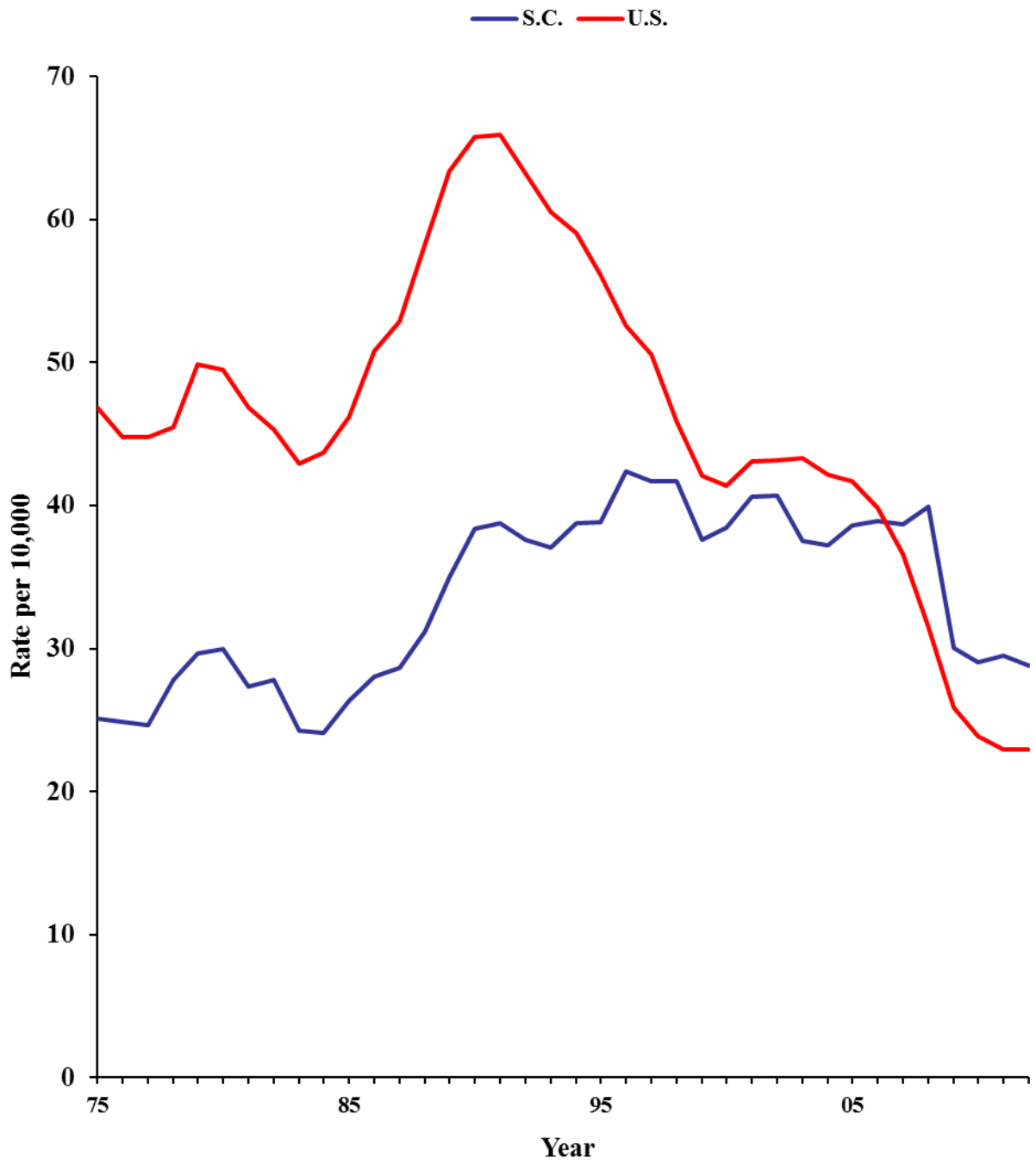

ARRESTS

Arrest counts provide a measure of law enforcement's response to crime. Arrest rates also provide estimates of criminal offenses such as illegal drug use or driving under the influence for which there are no victims who are likely to report the behavior. Arrest practices, policies, and enforcement emphases vary from place to place and even within a community over time. The arrest practices for certain unlawful conduct such as drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, and related violations may differ among agencies. But the practices for robbery, burglary, and other serious crime arrests are more likely to be uniform and consistent throughout all jurisdictions. Uniform Crime Reporting procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. Annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested, since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different offenses. In this report, arrests are presented either as the actual number of arrests or as arrest rates per 10,000 unit of population. Arrest rates are calculated using the following formula:

$$\text{Arrest Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Arrests}}{\text{Population}} \times 10,000$$

State and county population estimates used to calculate arrest rates were provided by the South Carolina Budget and Control Board, Office of Research and Statistics. Arrest data are available for the 1976 through 2012 time period, with the exception of arrest data for 2001. Arrest data for 2001 are not available and are not included in any of the data tables or charts that follow.

Clearance rates provide a measure of the degree to which crimes are resolved. This was calculated by dividing the sum of incidents cleared and not cleared, by the number incidents cleared.

South Carolina had 8,846 arrests for violent crimes in 2012 using the revised definition of rape, and the violent crime arrest rate was 18.72 per 10,000. This represents an increase of 1.5% over the number of violent crime arrests and the violent crime arrest rate for the same period of time based on the historical definition of rape.

VIOLENT CRIME: Violent crime consists of murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault, and involves the element of personal confrontation between the victim and offender. The 2012 total below uses the current definition of rape. It is not possible to go back and apply this definition to arrests prior to 2012 in order to identify trends or make comparisons.

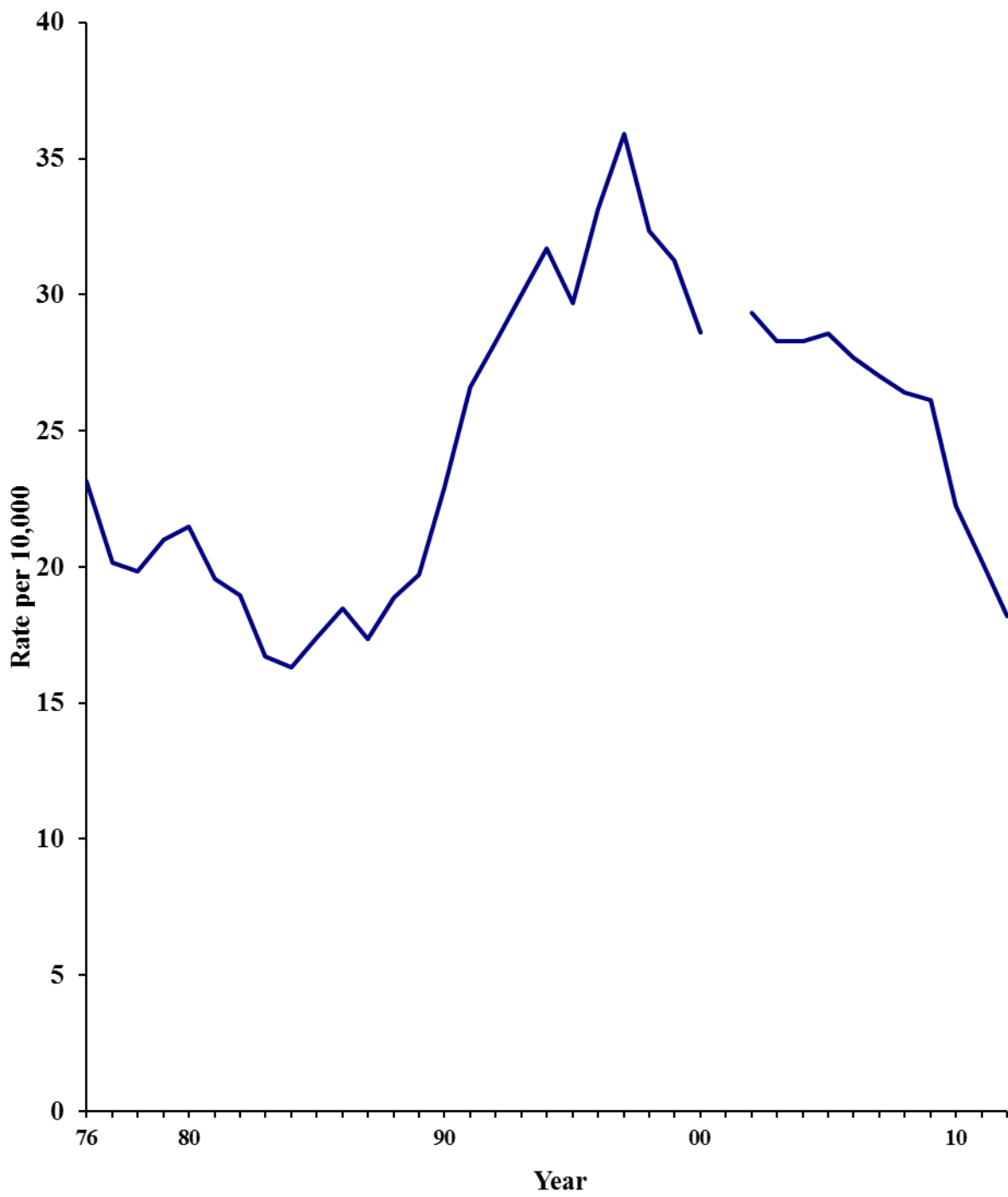

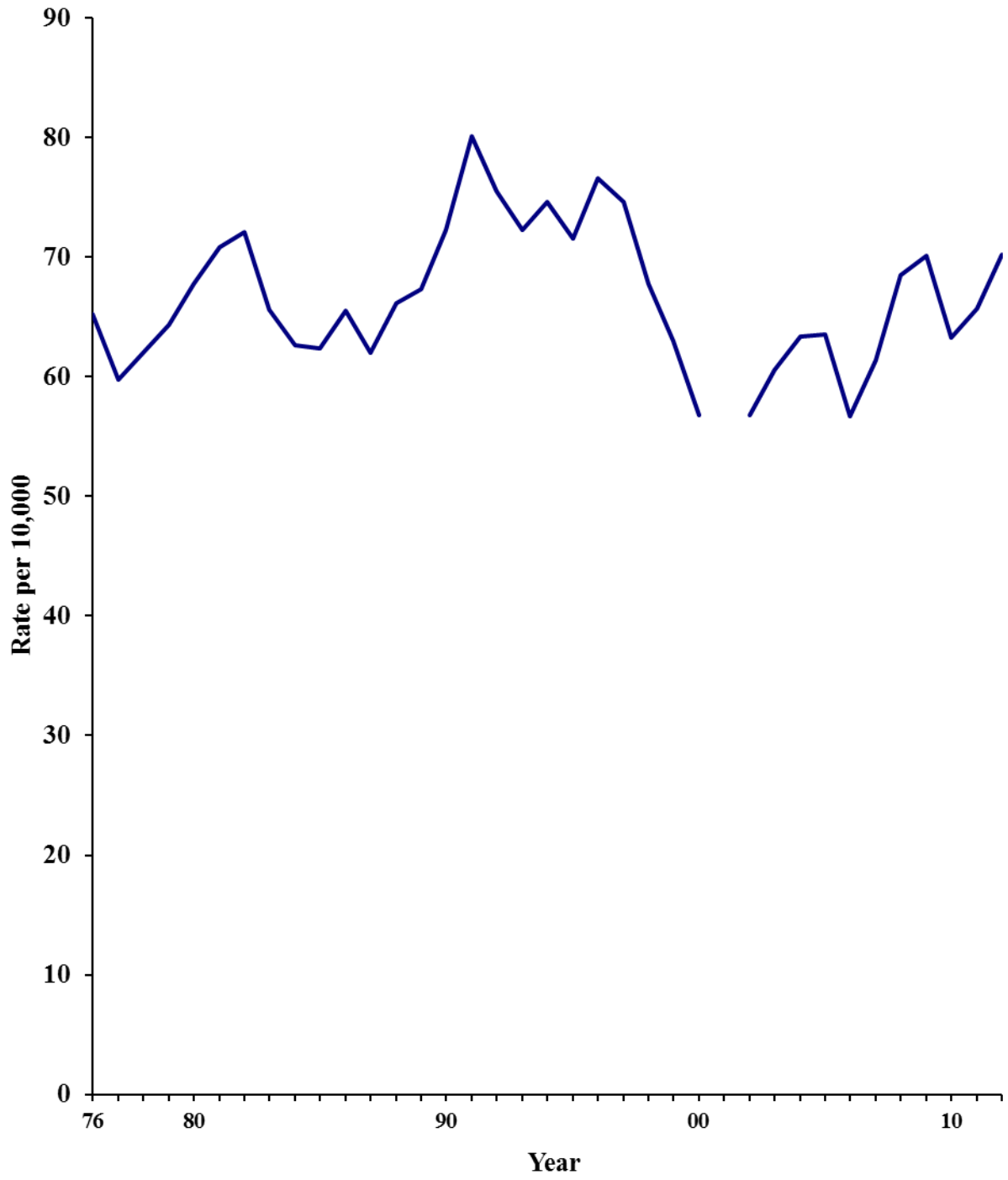

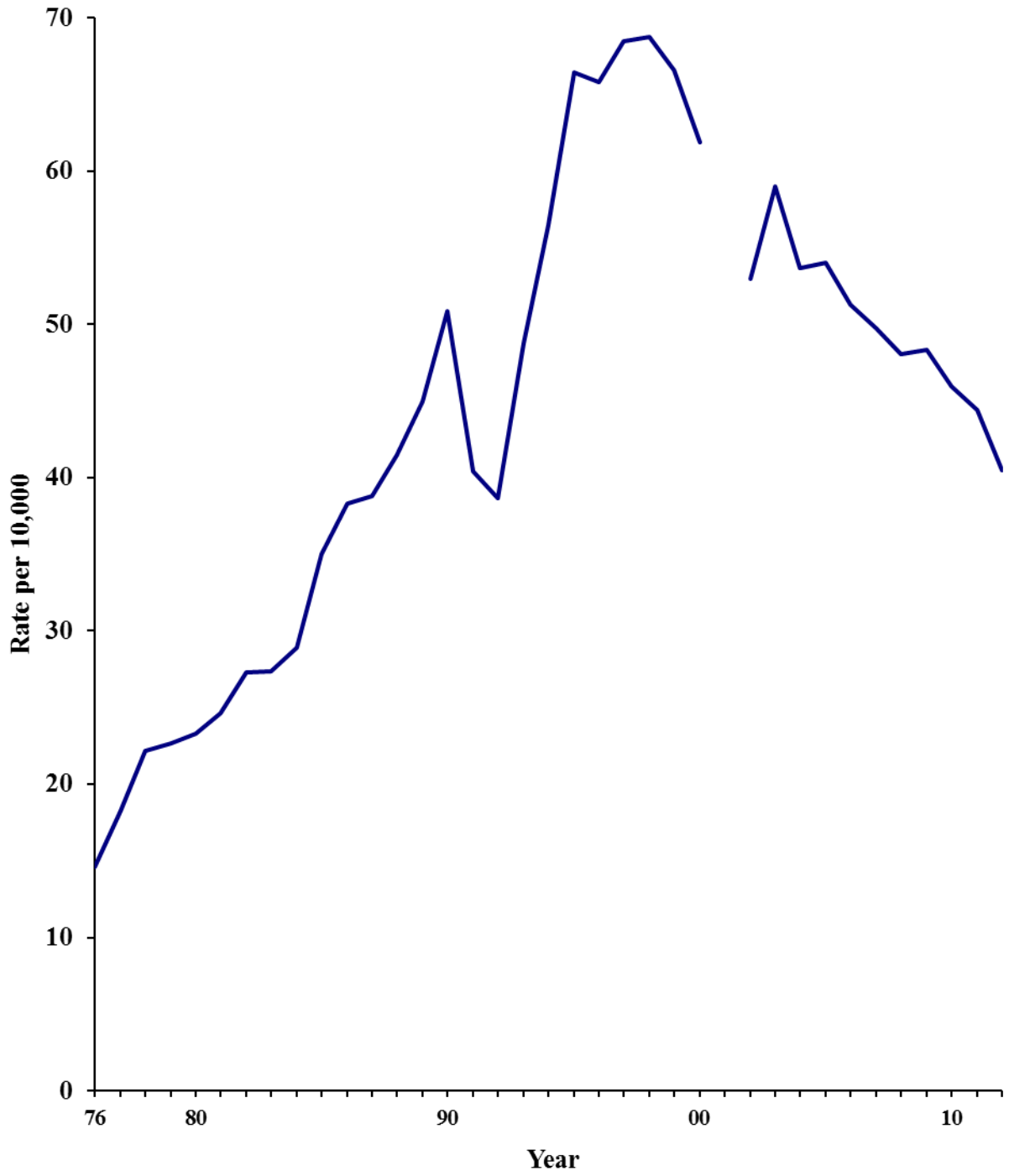

South Carolina Simple Assault Arrest Rate



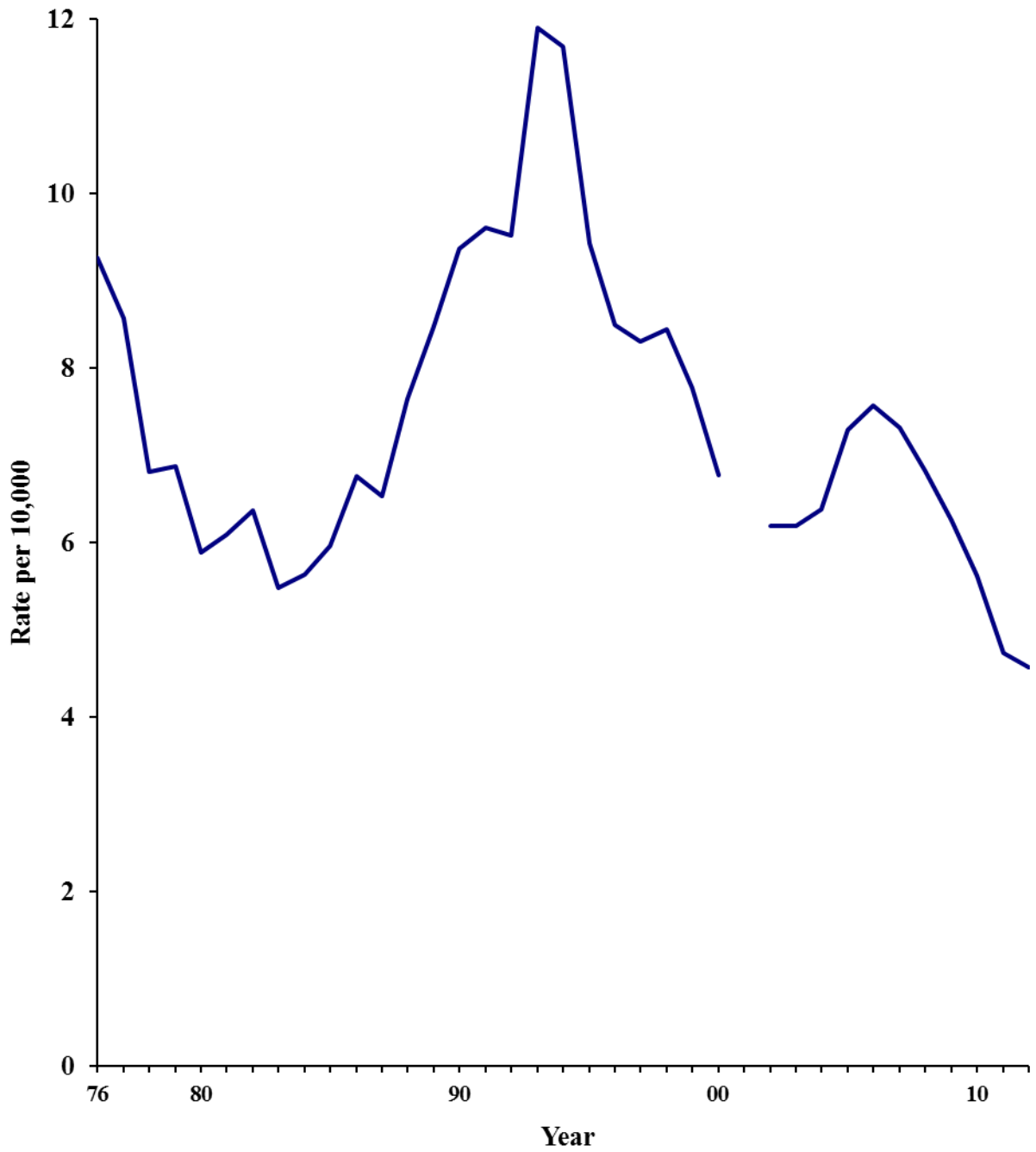

South Carolina Weapons Law Violation Arrest Rate



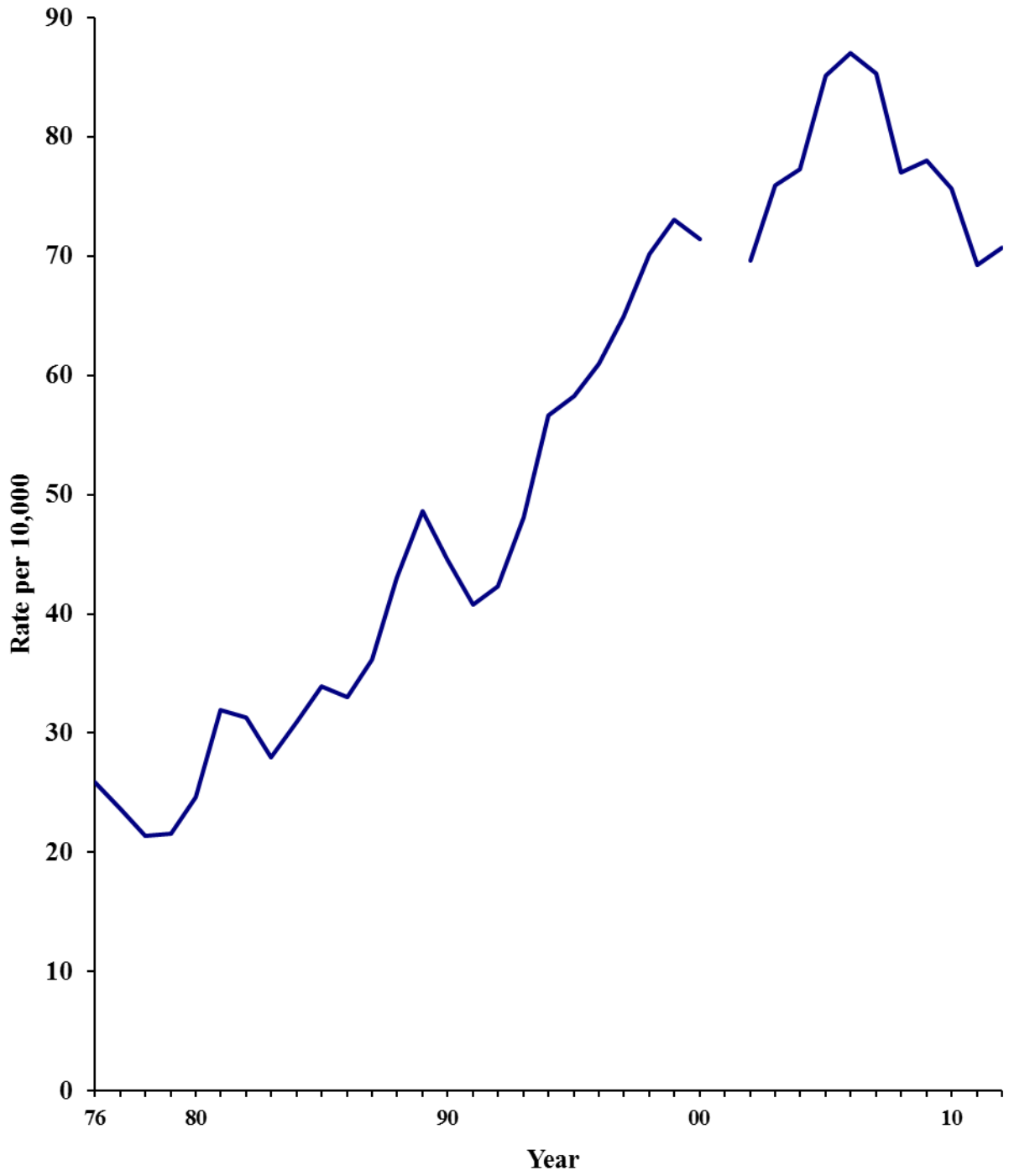

South Carolina Drug Law Arrest Rate



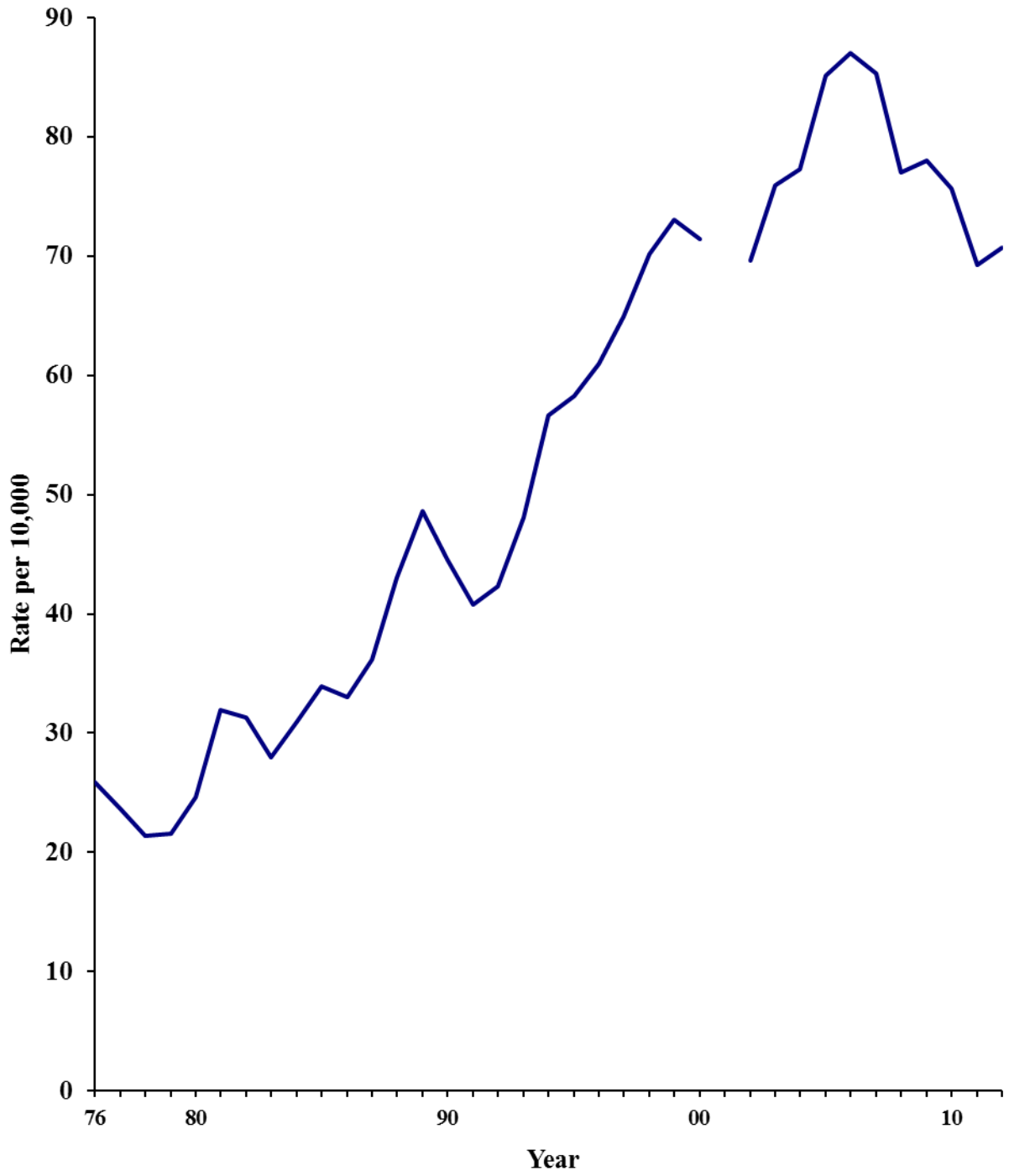

South Carolina Drug Law Arrest Rate



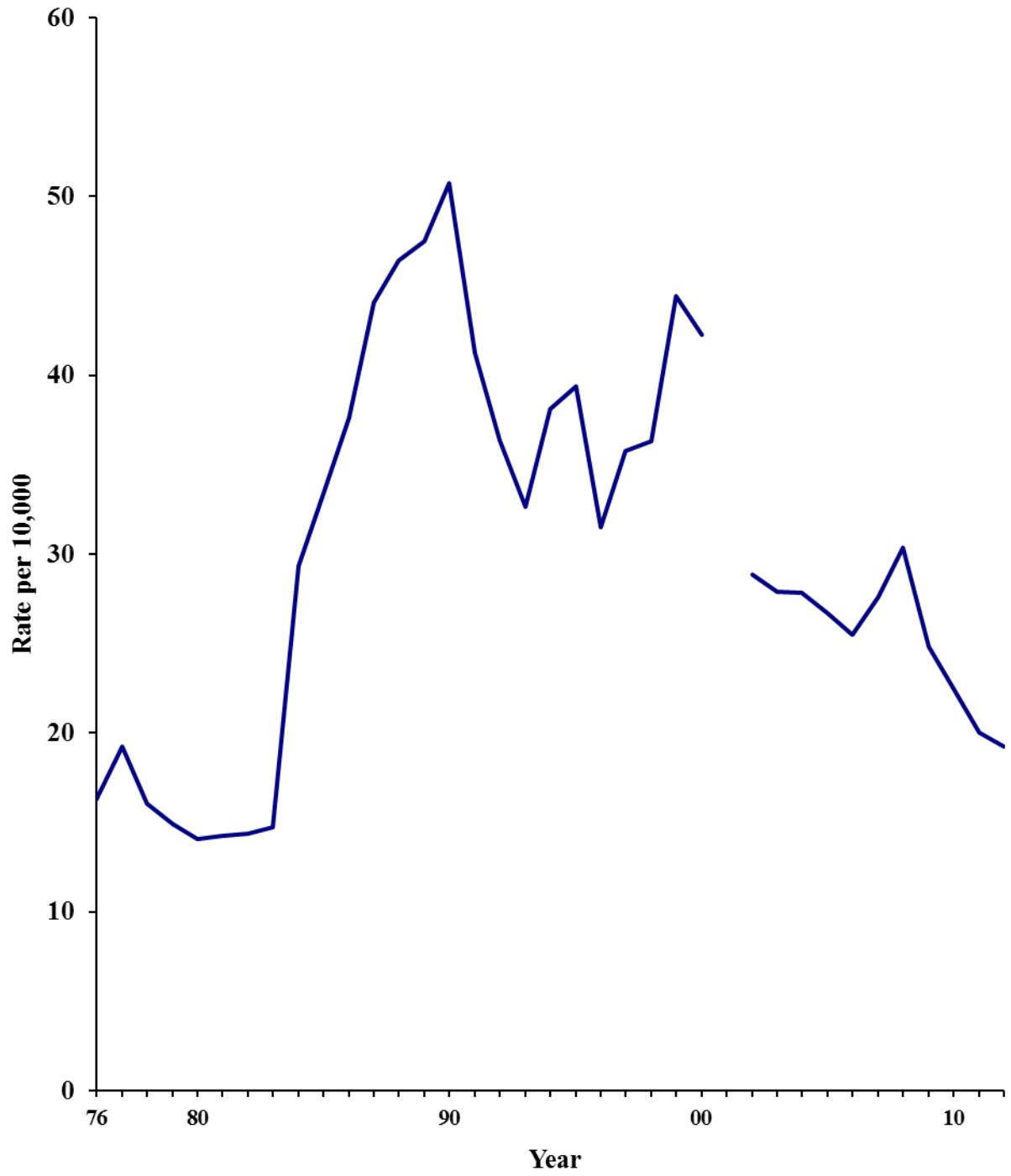

South Carolina Liquor Law Arrest Rate



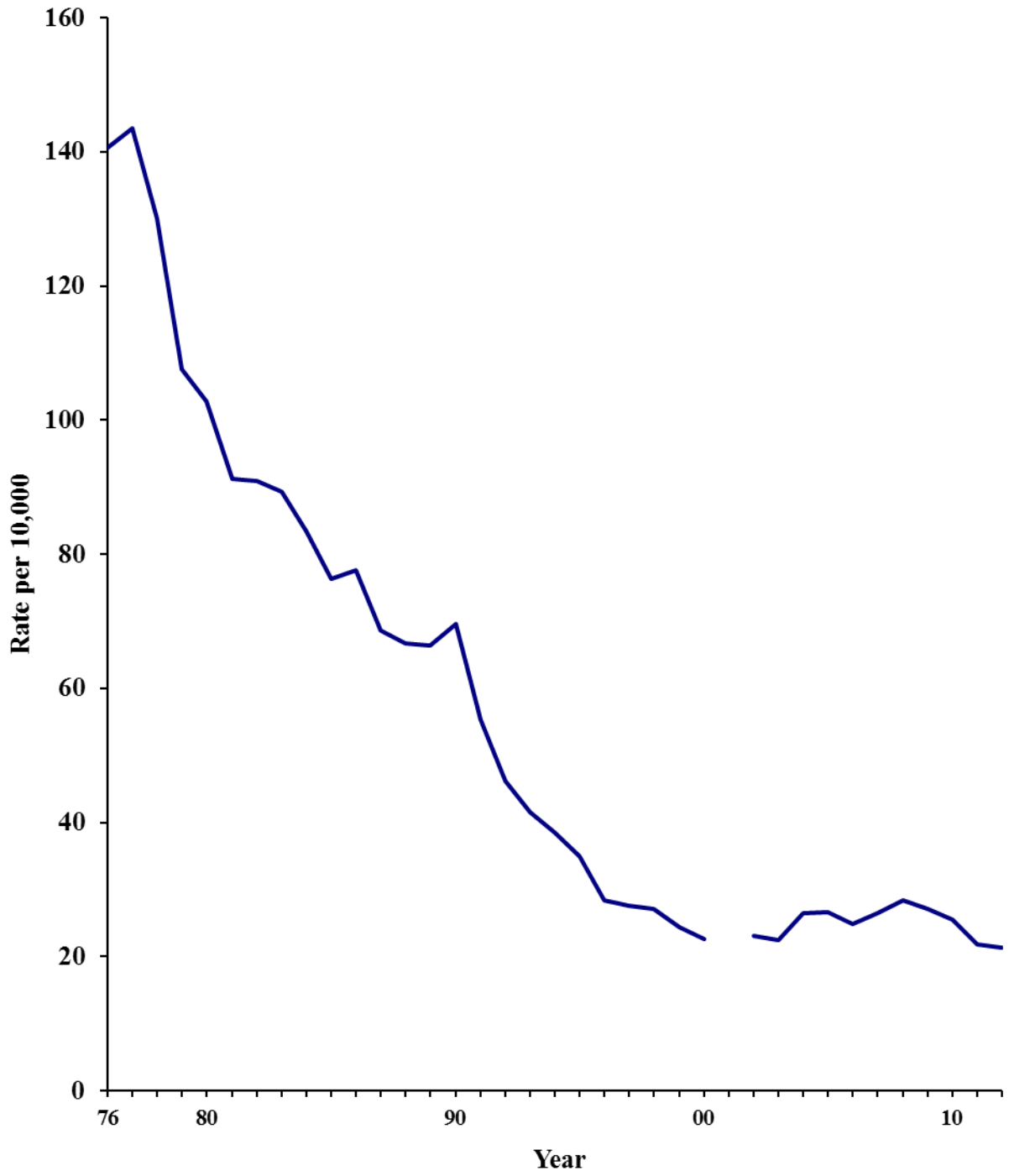

JUVENILE ARRESTS

Besides being a gauge of law enforcement's response to crime, arrests provide reliable information concerning the age of apprehended offenders. Consequently, arrest rates by age provide one of the better readily available measures of juvenile delinquency. Uniform Crime Reporting procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. As a result, annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individual juveniles arrested, since one juvenile might be arrested several times during a year. State law sets the age of adult responsibility in most criminal matters at seventeen years of age, so juvenile arrest rates were calculated on the basis of the juvenile (age 0 through 16) population for each year from 1976 through 2012.

$$\text{Juvenile Arrest Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Juveniles Arrested} \times 10,000}{\text{Juvenile Population}}$$

State population estimates used to identify the 0 through 16 age population group and calculate arrest rates were provided by the South Carolina Budget and Control Board, Office of Research and Statistics. Juvenile arrest data for 2001 are not available, and are not included in any of the data tables or charts that follow.

South Carolina had 498 juvenile arrests for violent crimes in 2012 using the revised definition of rape, and the violent crime arrest rate was 4.85 per 10,000. This represents an increase of 8.2% over the number of violent crime juvenile arrests and the violent crime juvenile arrest rate for the same period of time based on the historical definition of rape.

VIOLENT CRIME: Violent crime consists of murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault, and involves the element of personal confrontation between the victim and offender. The 2012 total below uses the current definition of rape. It is not possible to go back and apply this definition to arrests prior to 2012 in order to identify trends or make comparisons.

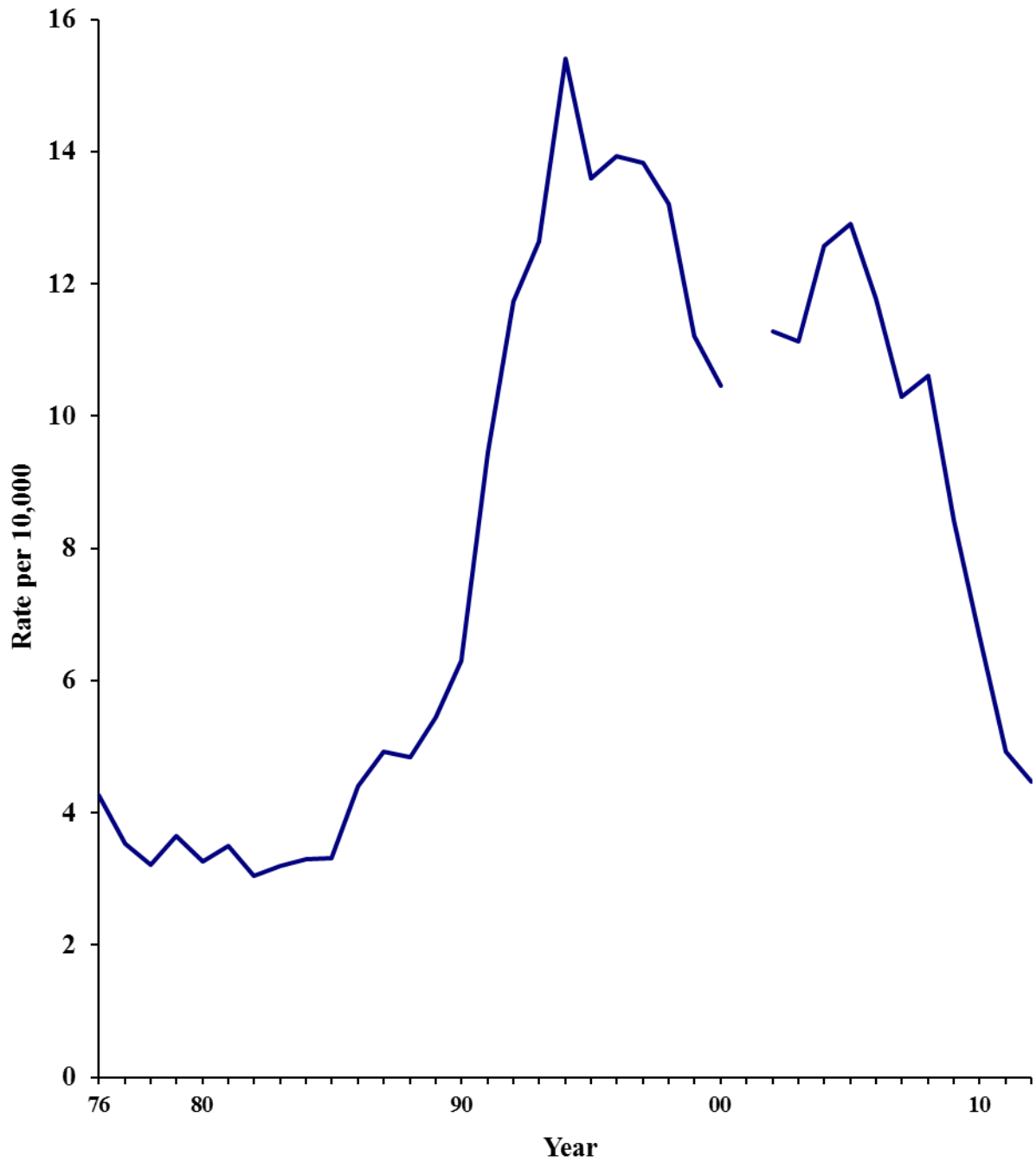
South Carolina's juvenile arrest rate for violent crimes decreased 8.9% from 2011 to 2012. The juvenile arrest rate for violent crimes has increased 5.2% since 1976.

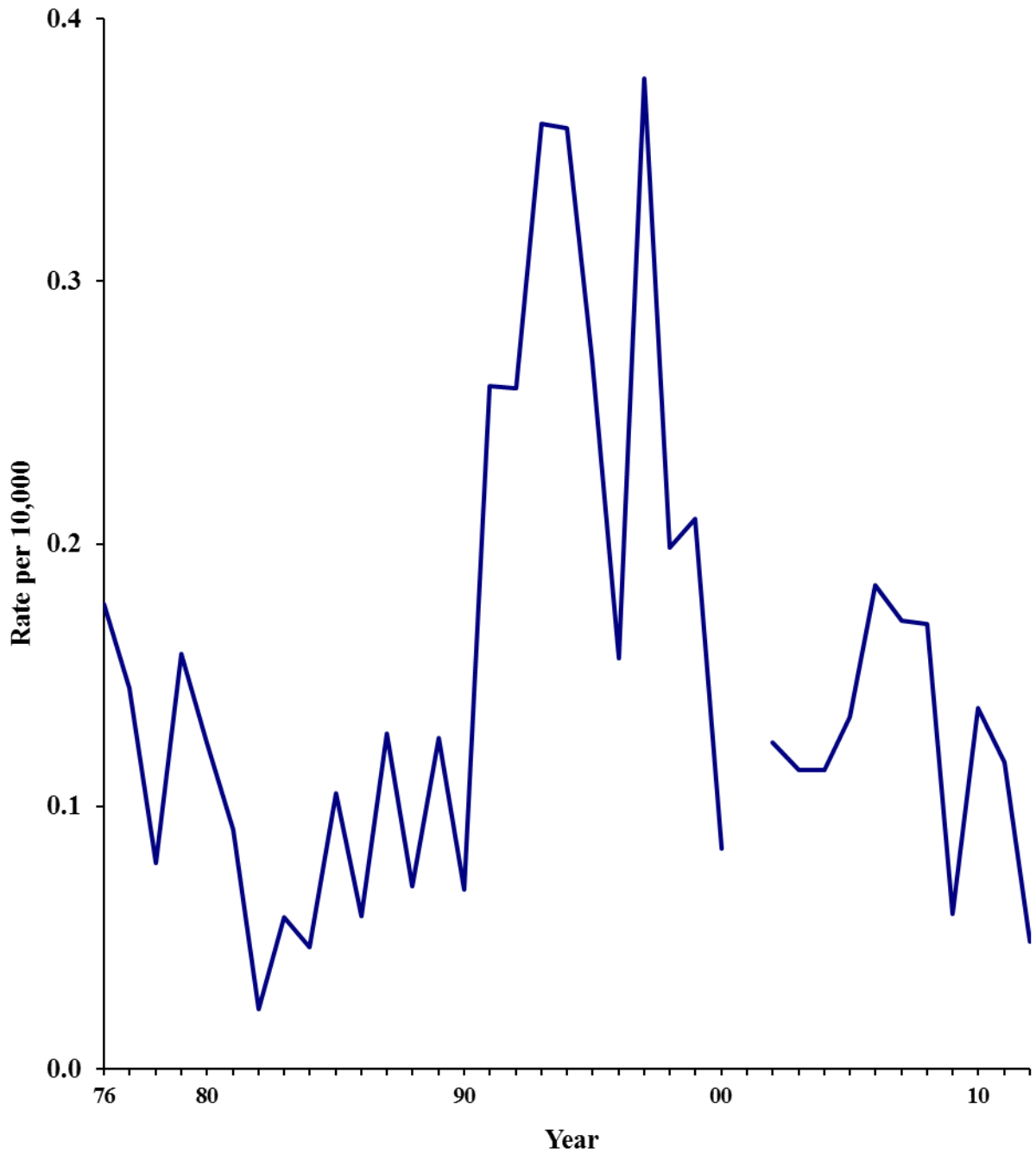

Using the revised definition of rape, South Carolina had 73 juvenile arrests for rape in 2012 representing an increase of 38 arrests over the total juvenile arrests using the historical definition during the same period of time. The 2012 juvenile arrest rate for rape based on the revised definition was 0.71 rapes per 10,000.

RAPE: The revised (current) definition of rape is penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim. This includes victims of forcible sodomy, sexual assault with an object and male victims.

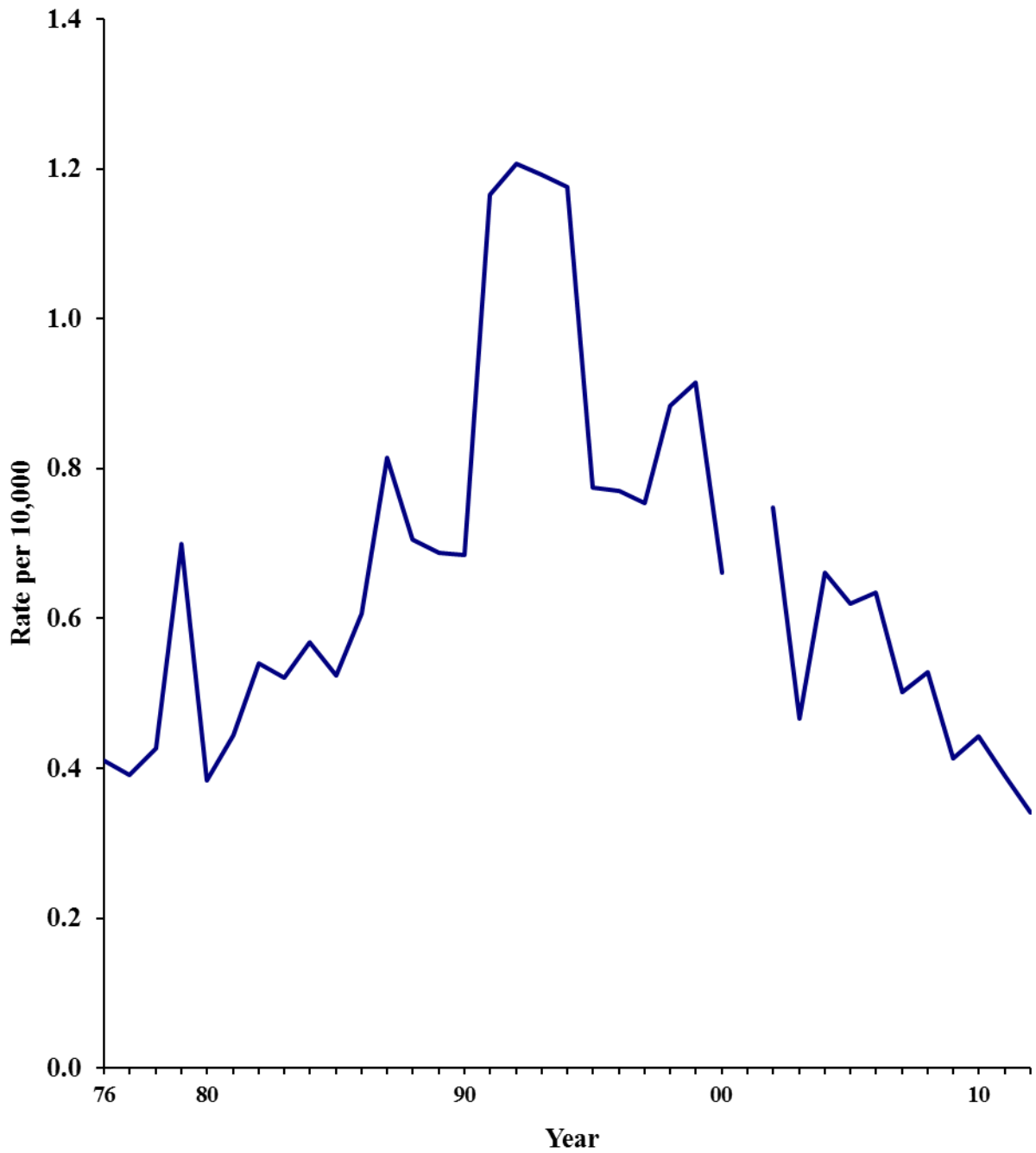

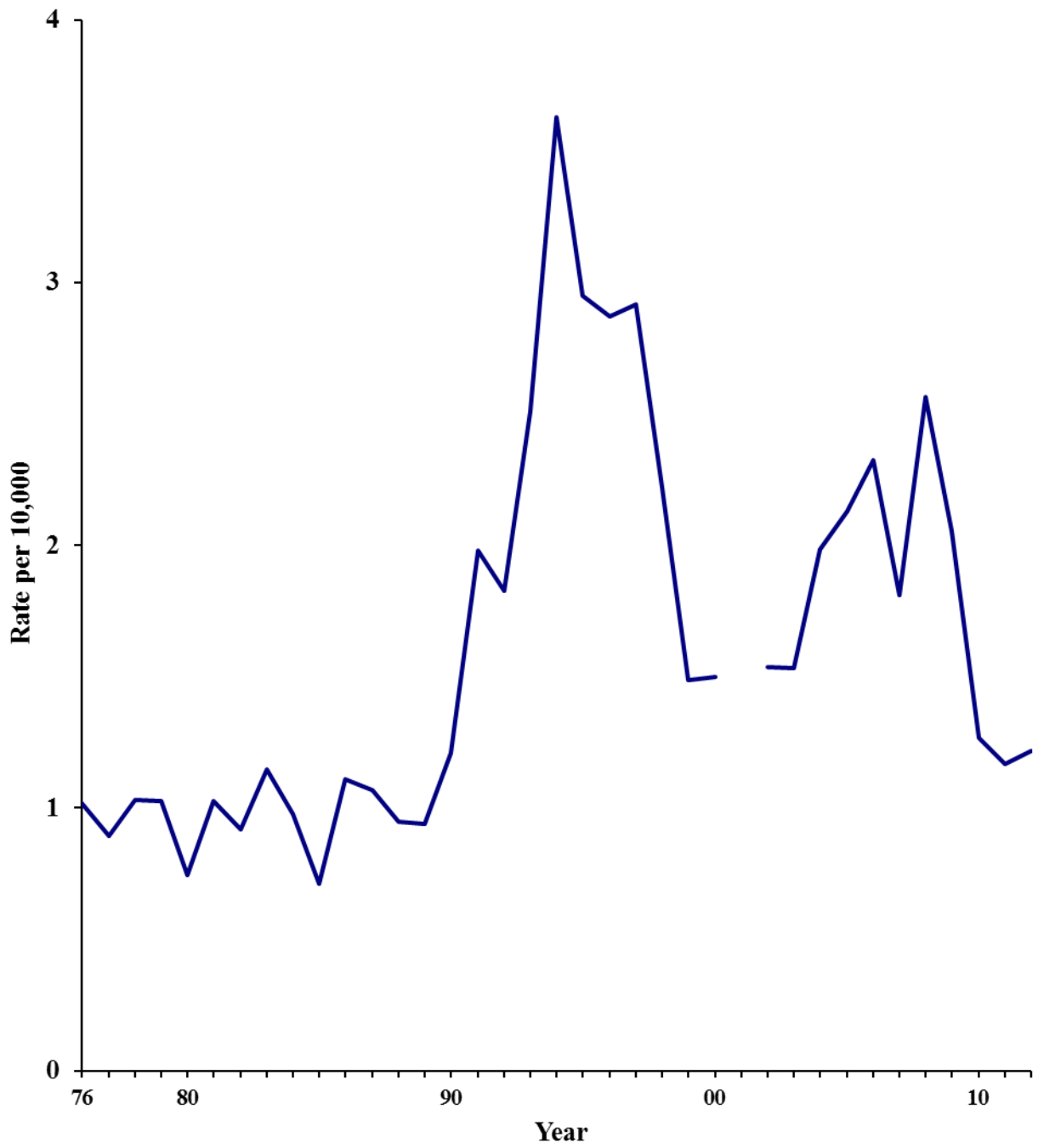

South Carolina Juvenile Arrest Rate for Robbery



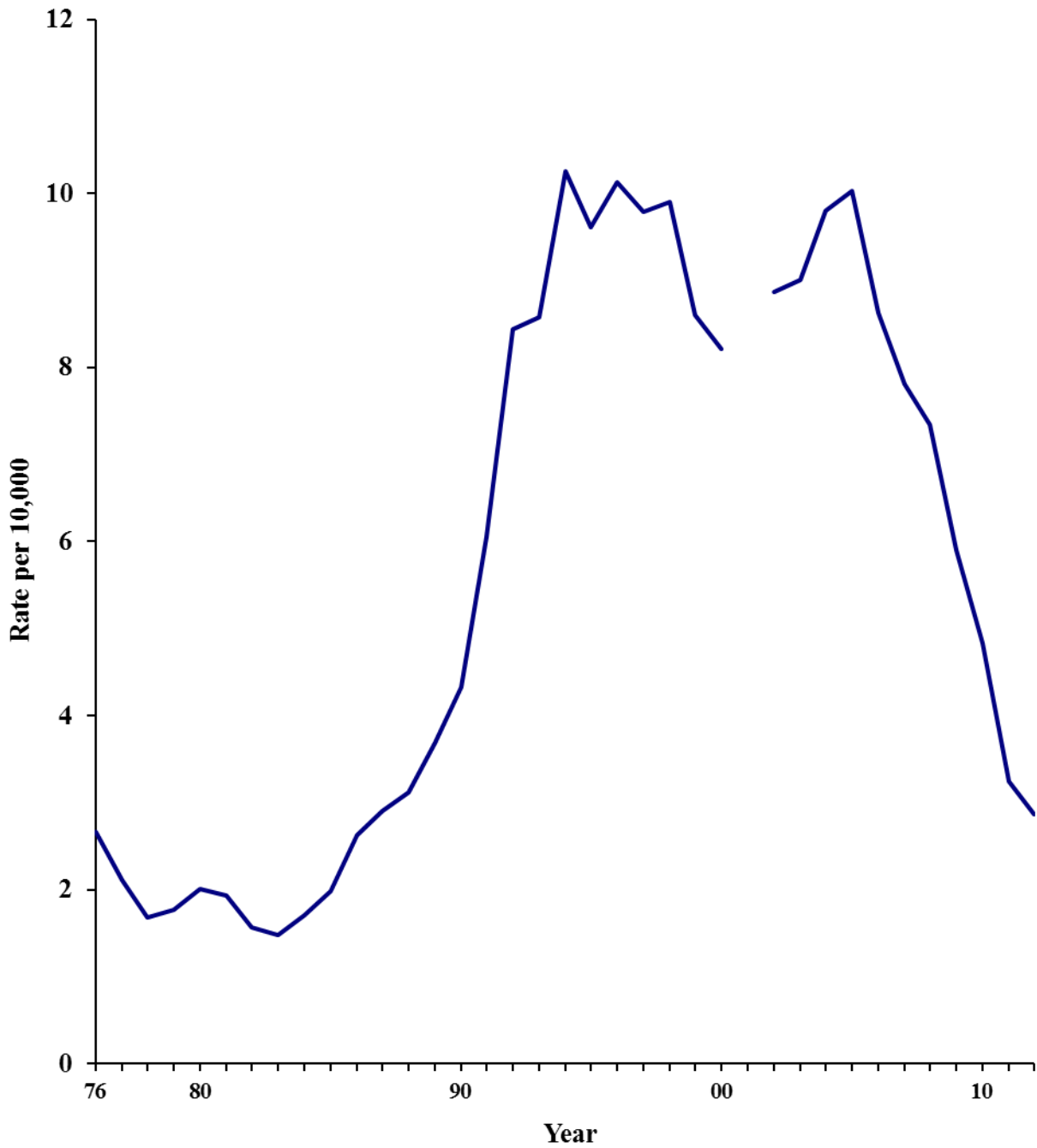

South Carolina Juvenile Arrest Rate for Aggravated Assault



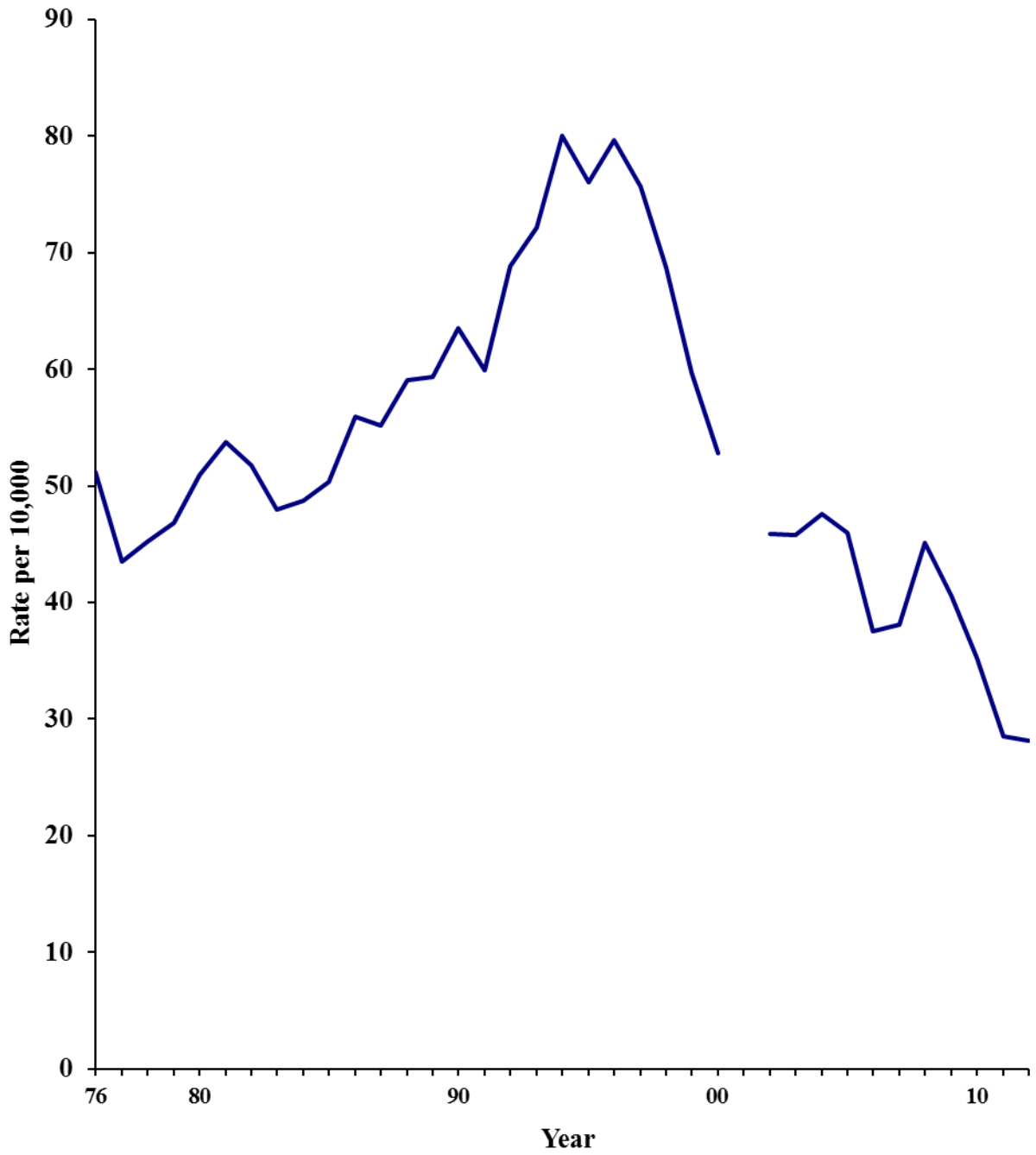

South Carolina Juvenile Arrest Rate for Property Crimes



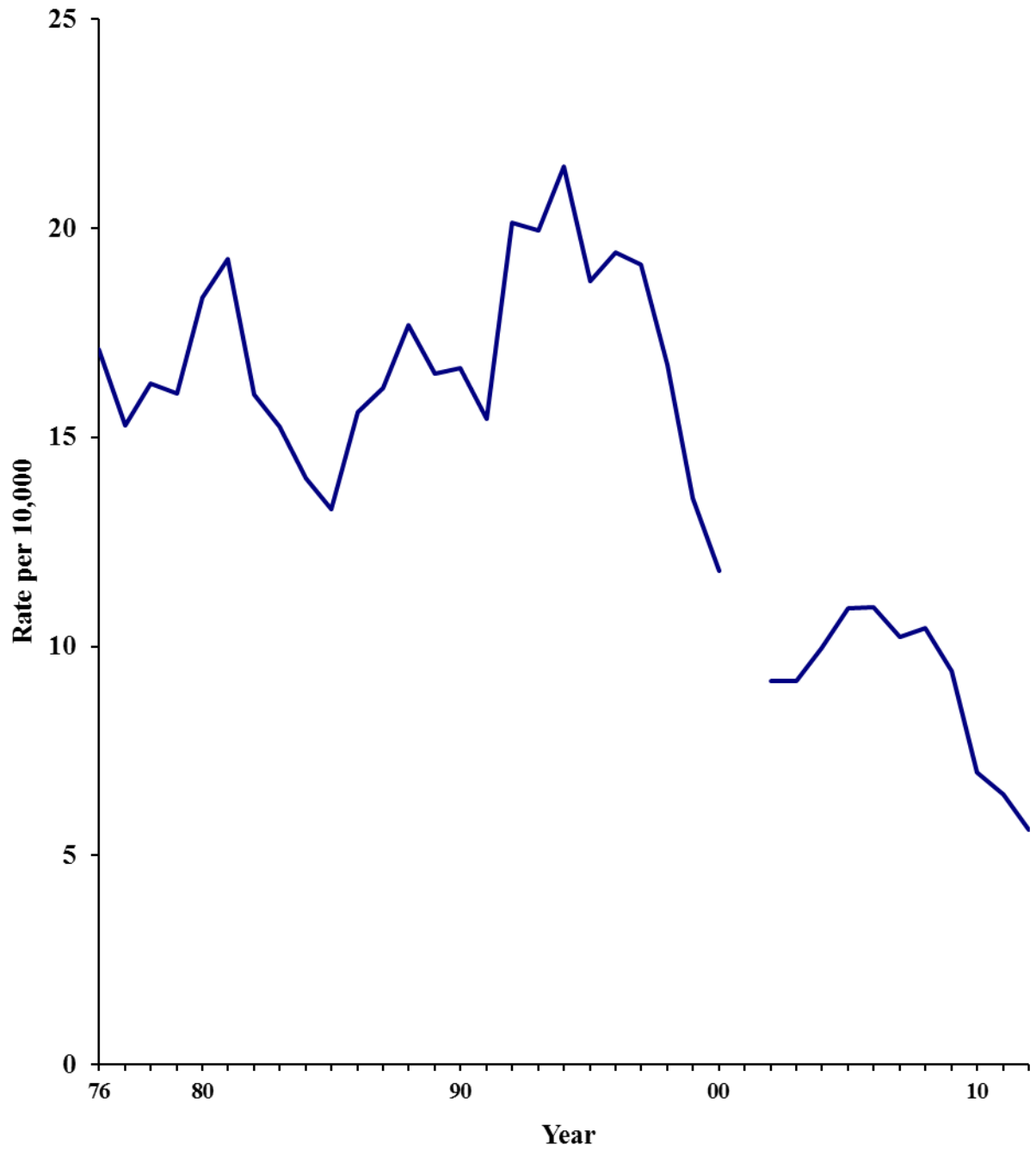

South Carolina Juvenile Arrest Rate for Breaking and Entering



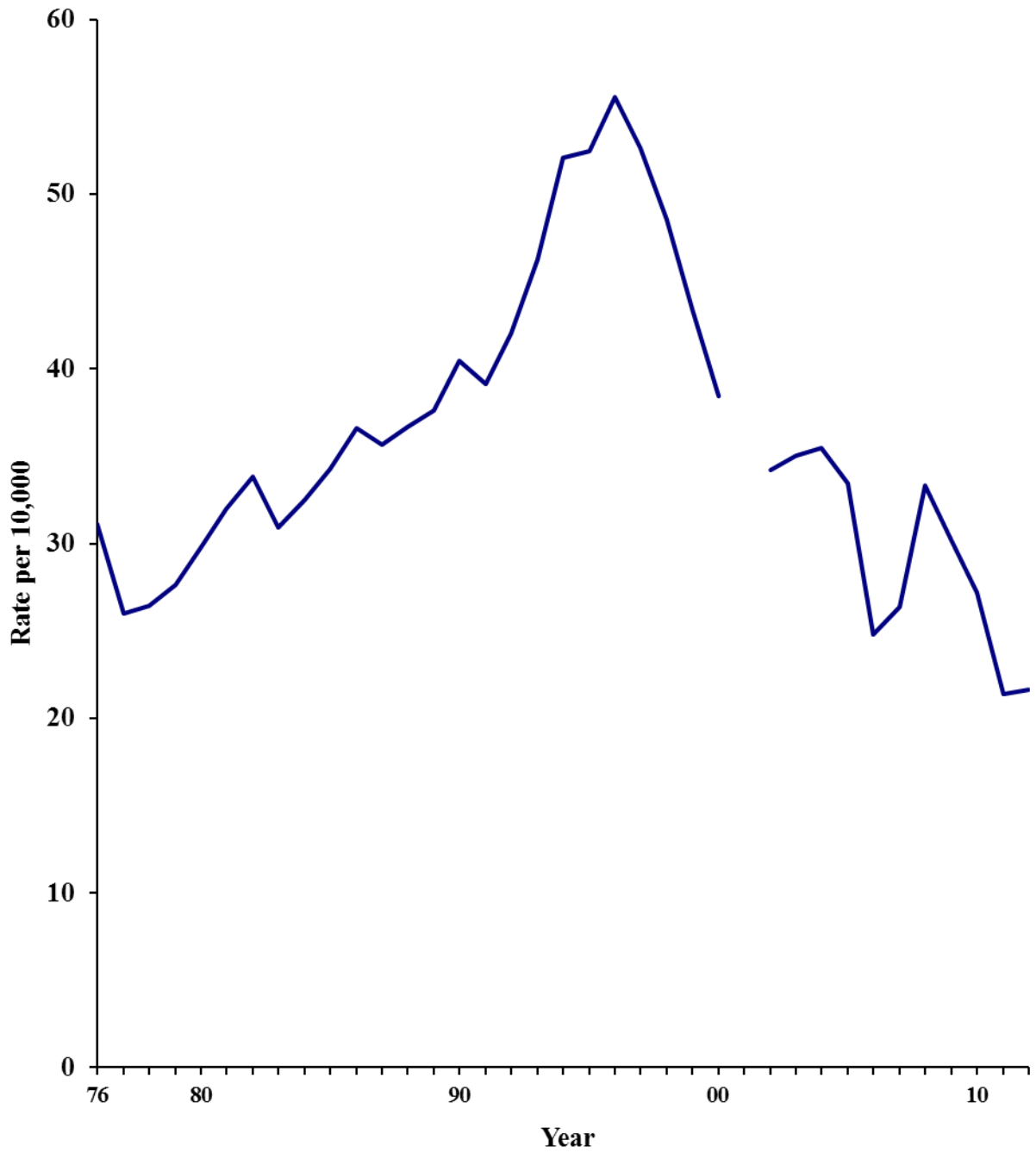

South Carolina Juvenile Arrest Rate for Larceny



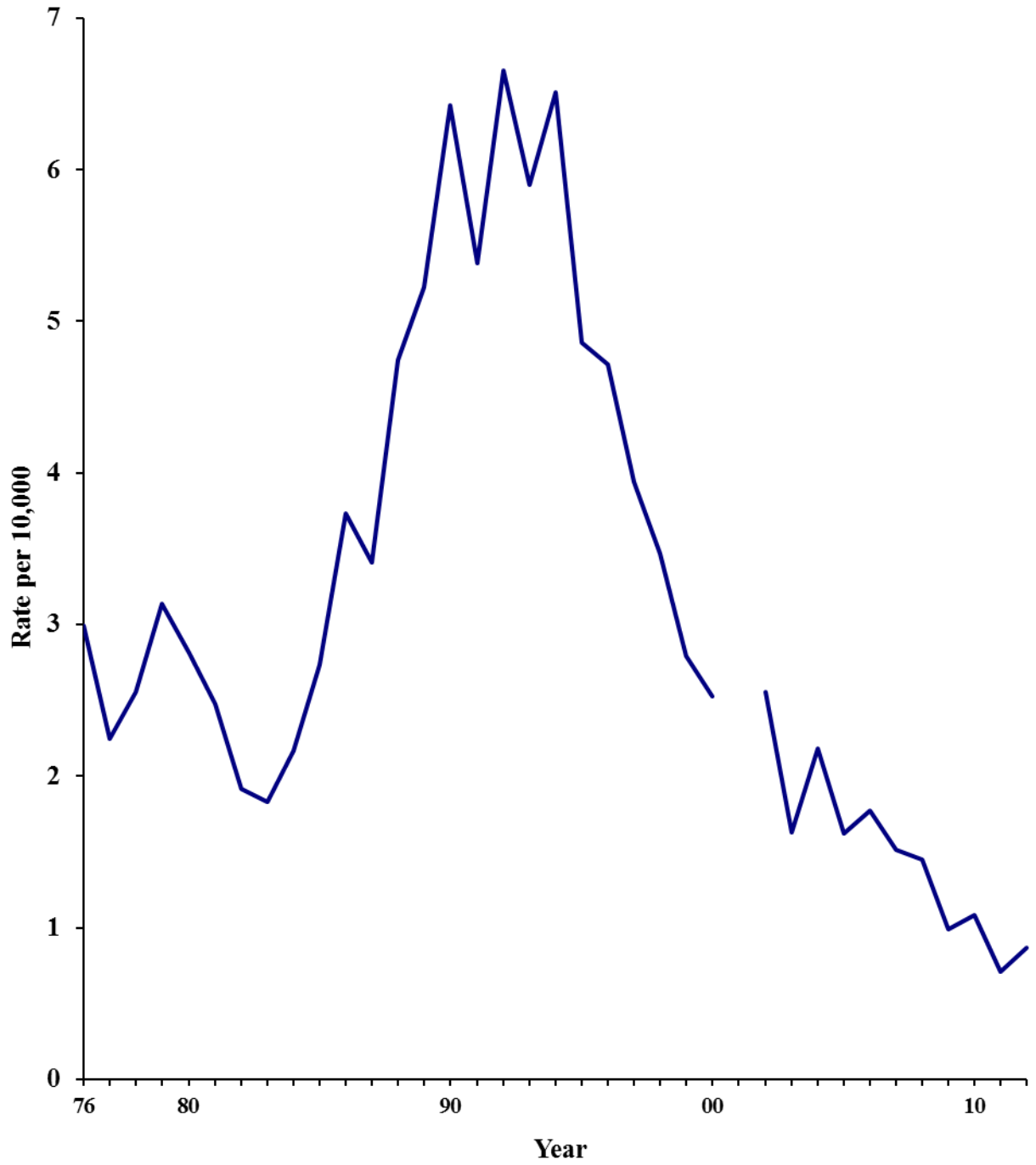

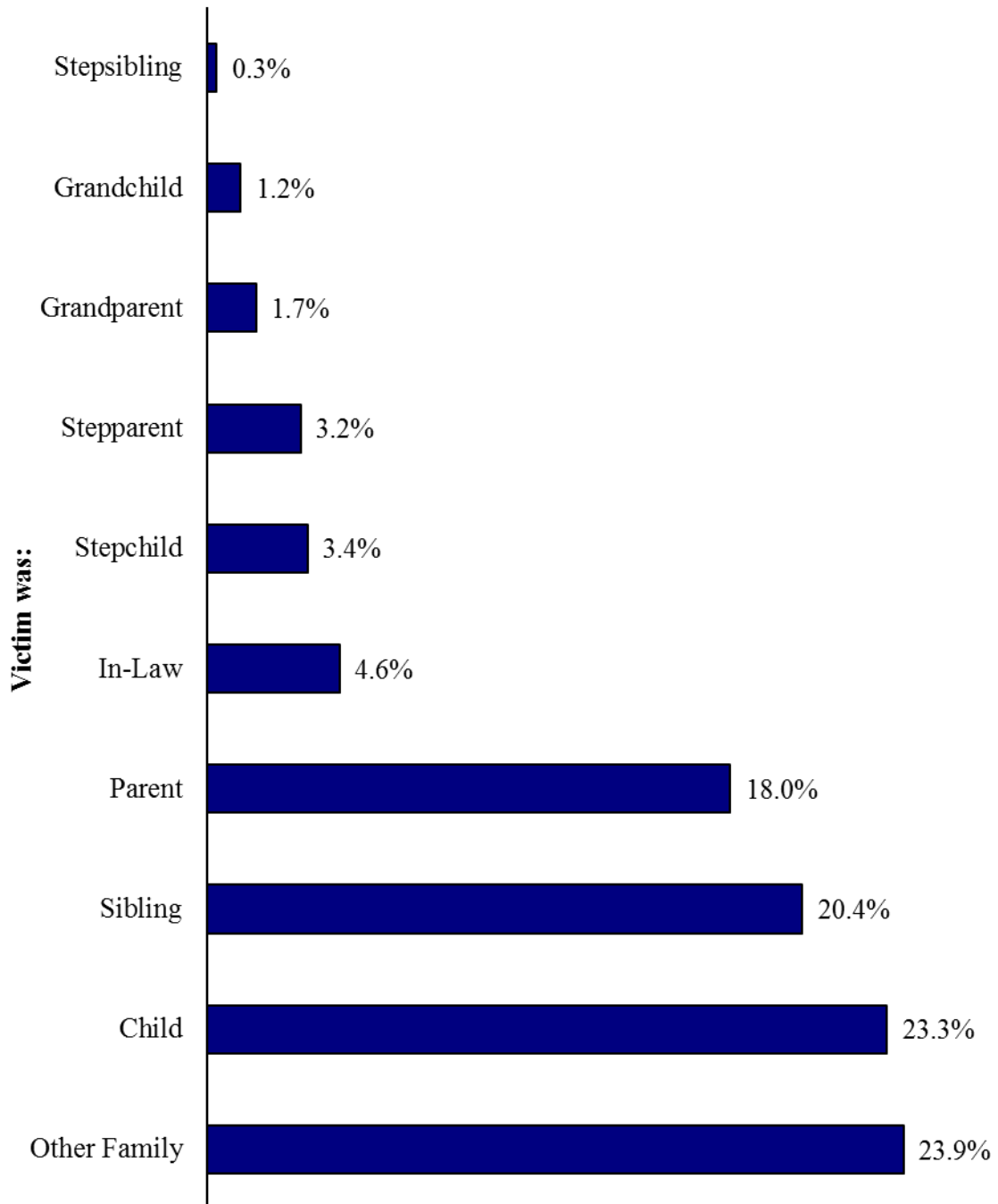

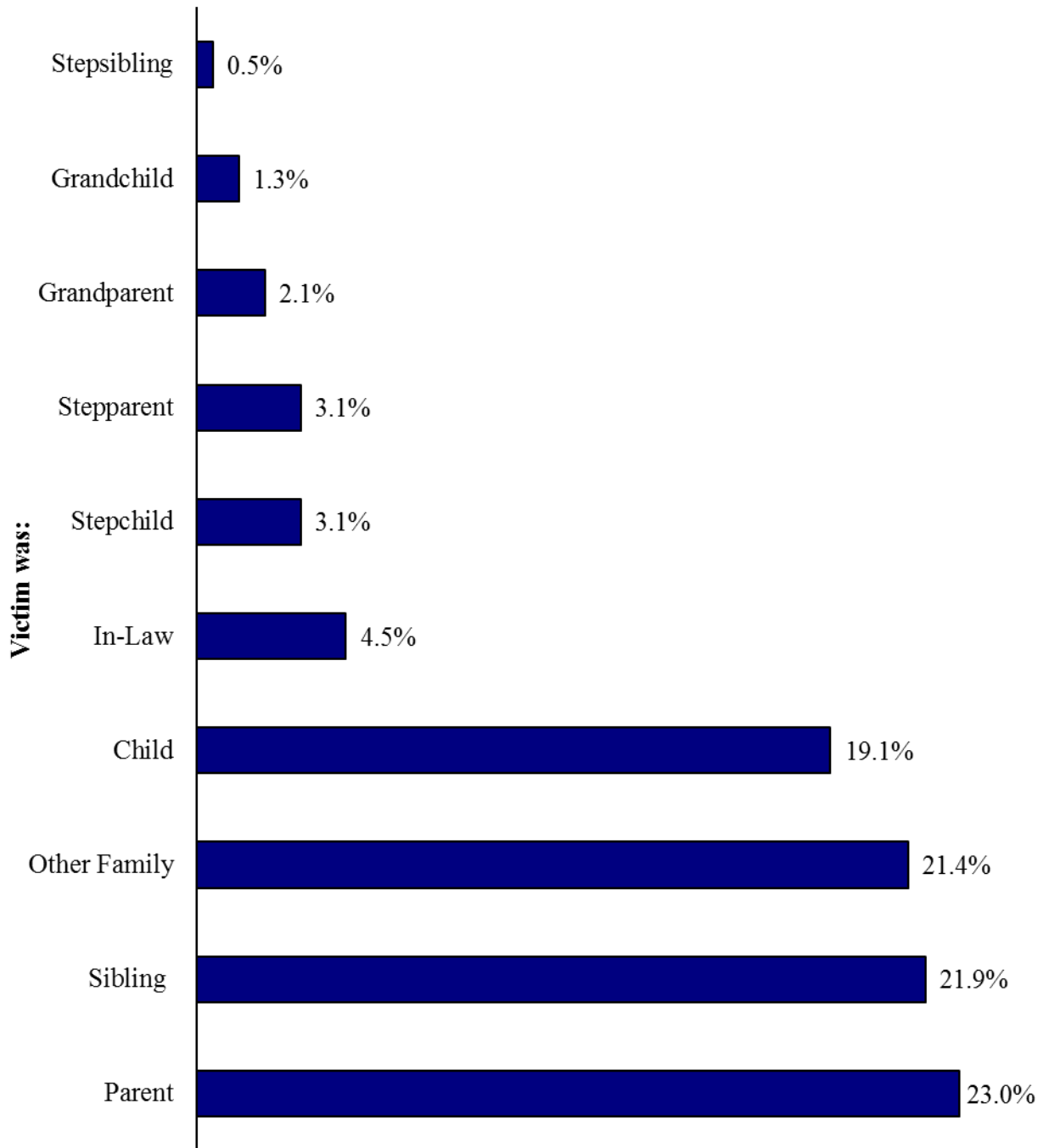

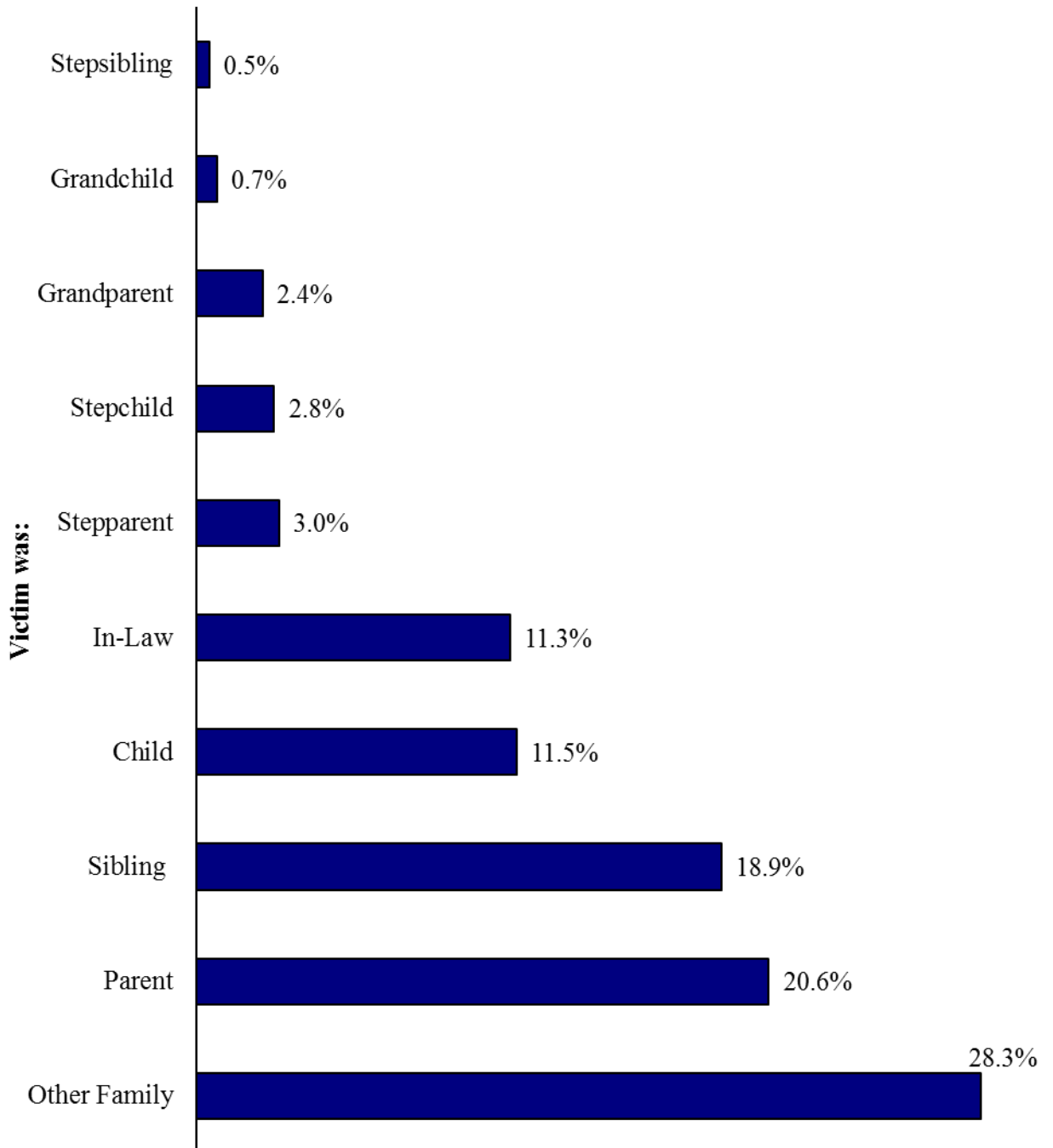

Family Intimidation 2012

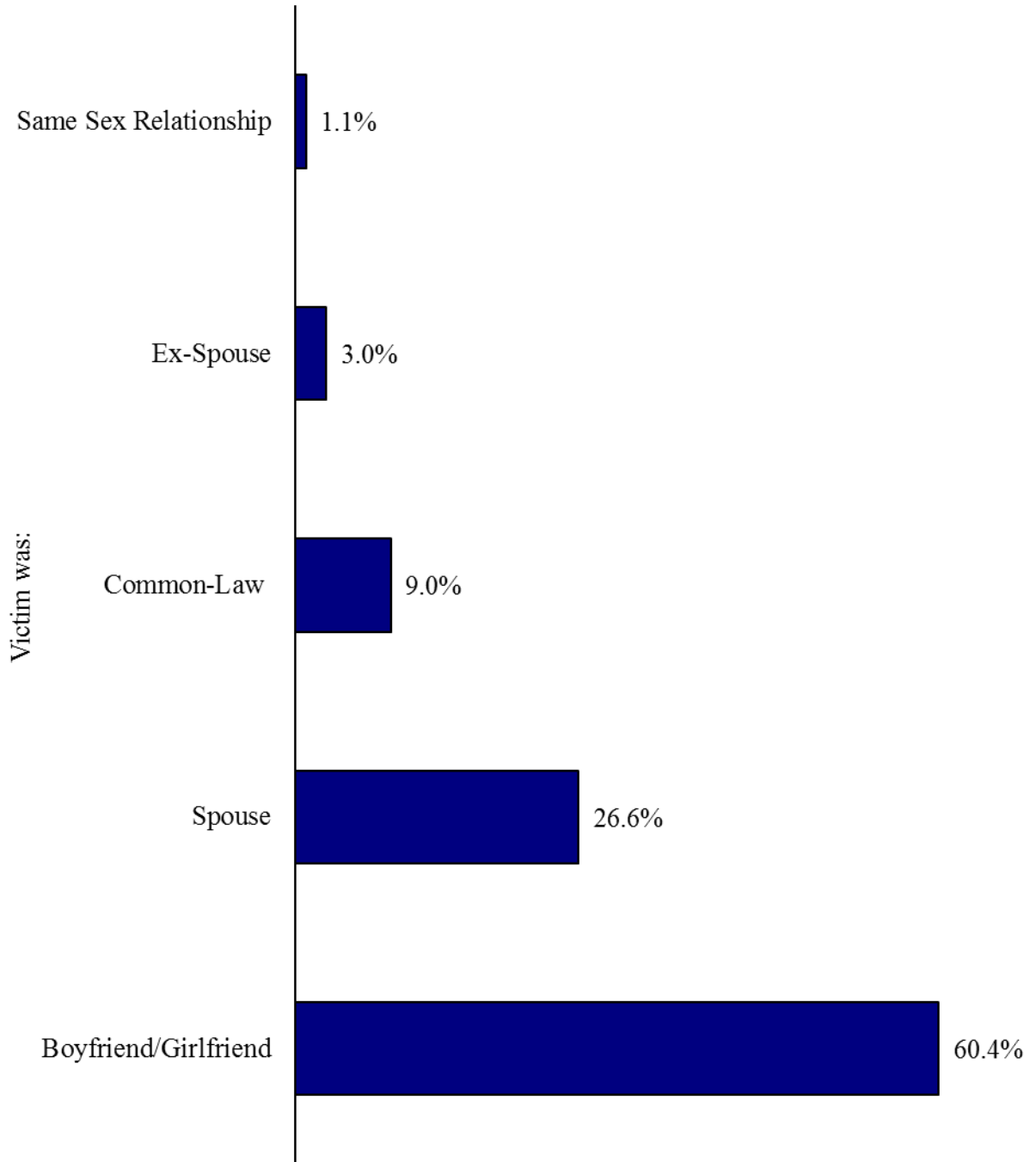

Intimate Aggravated Assaults 2012

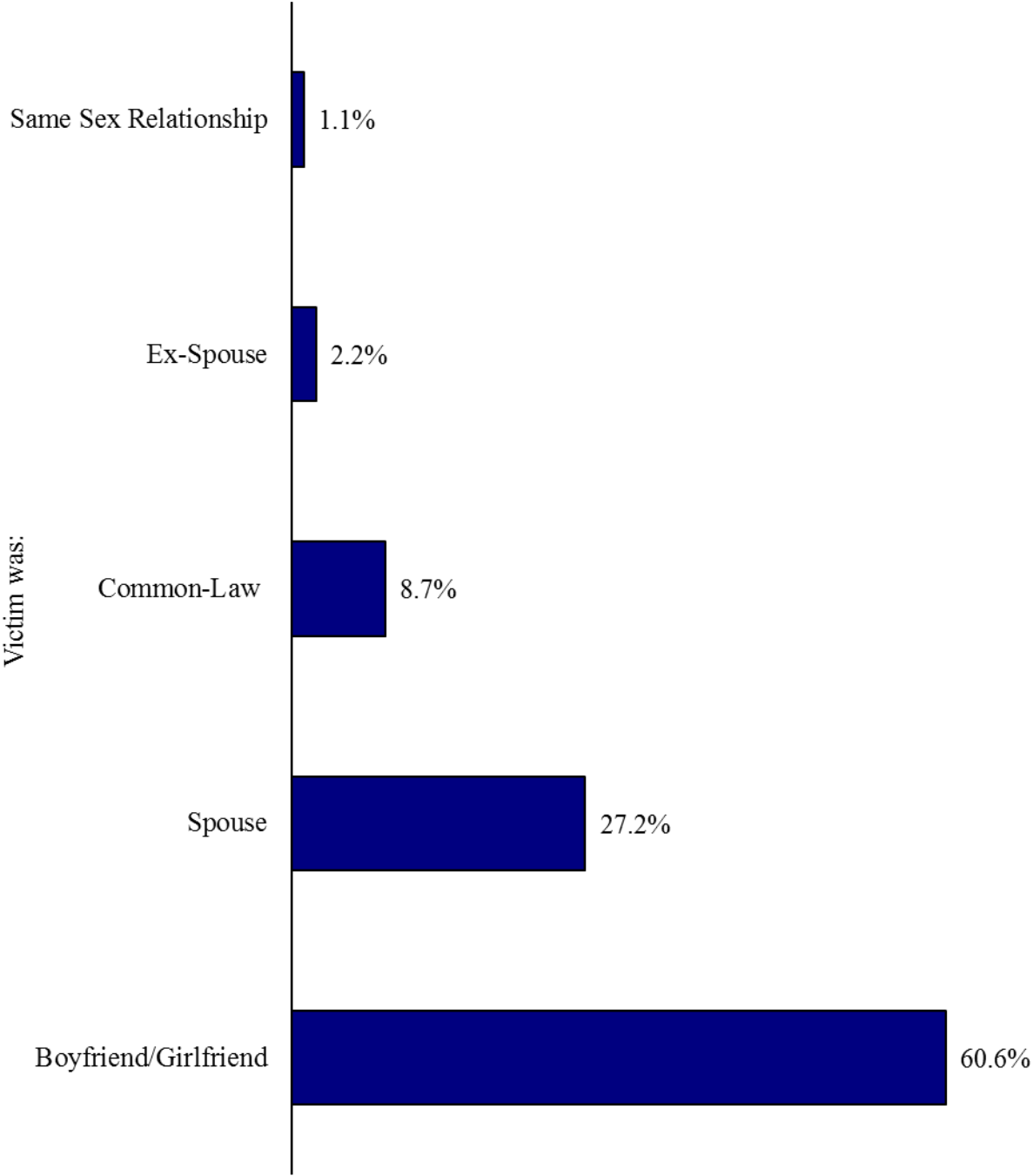

Intimate Simple Assaults 2012

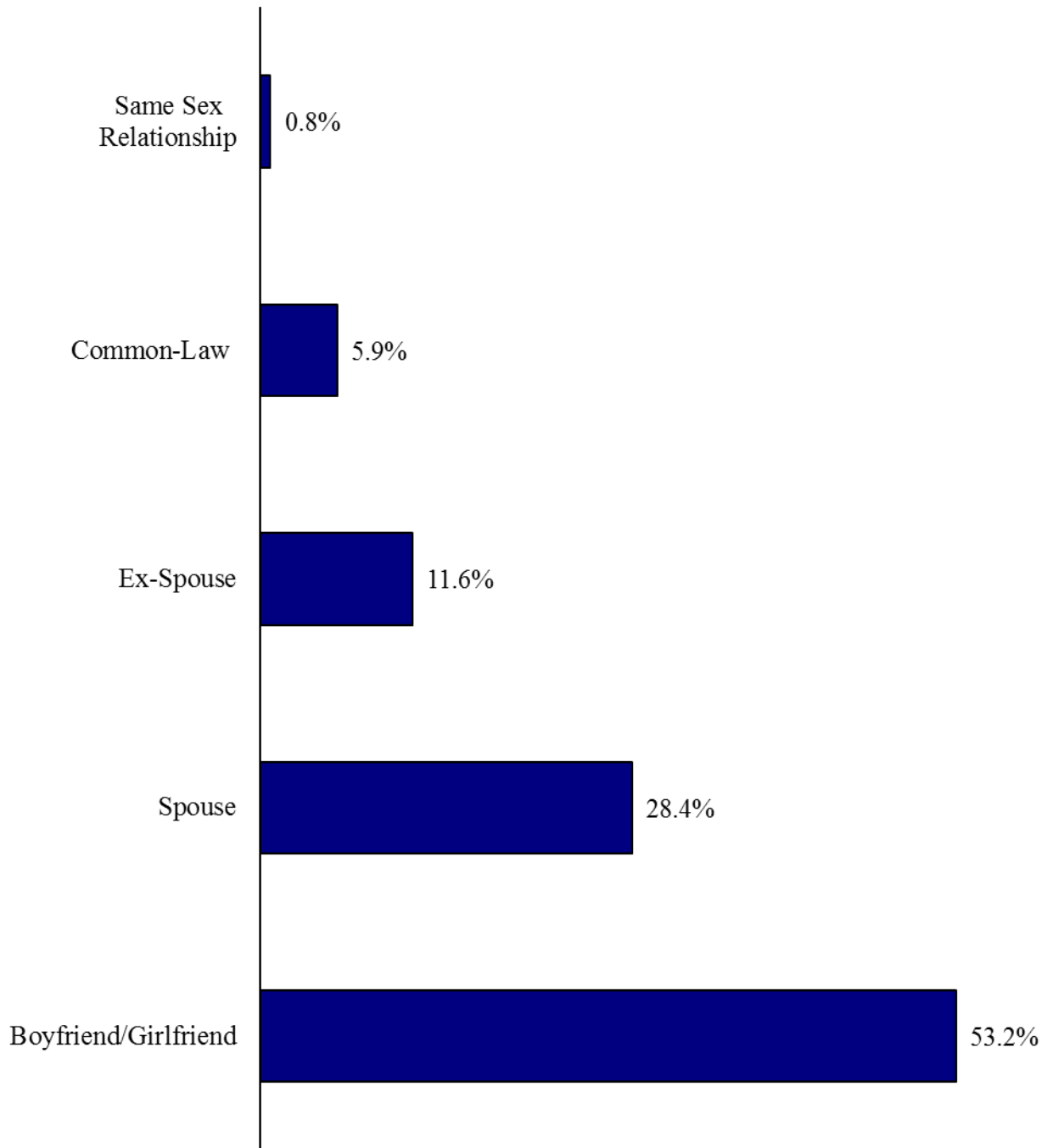

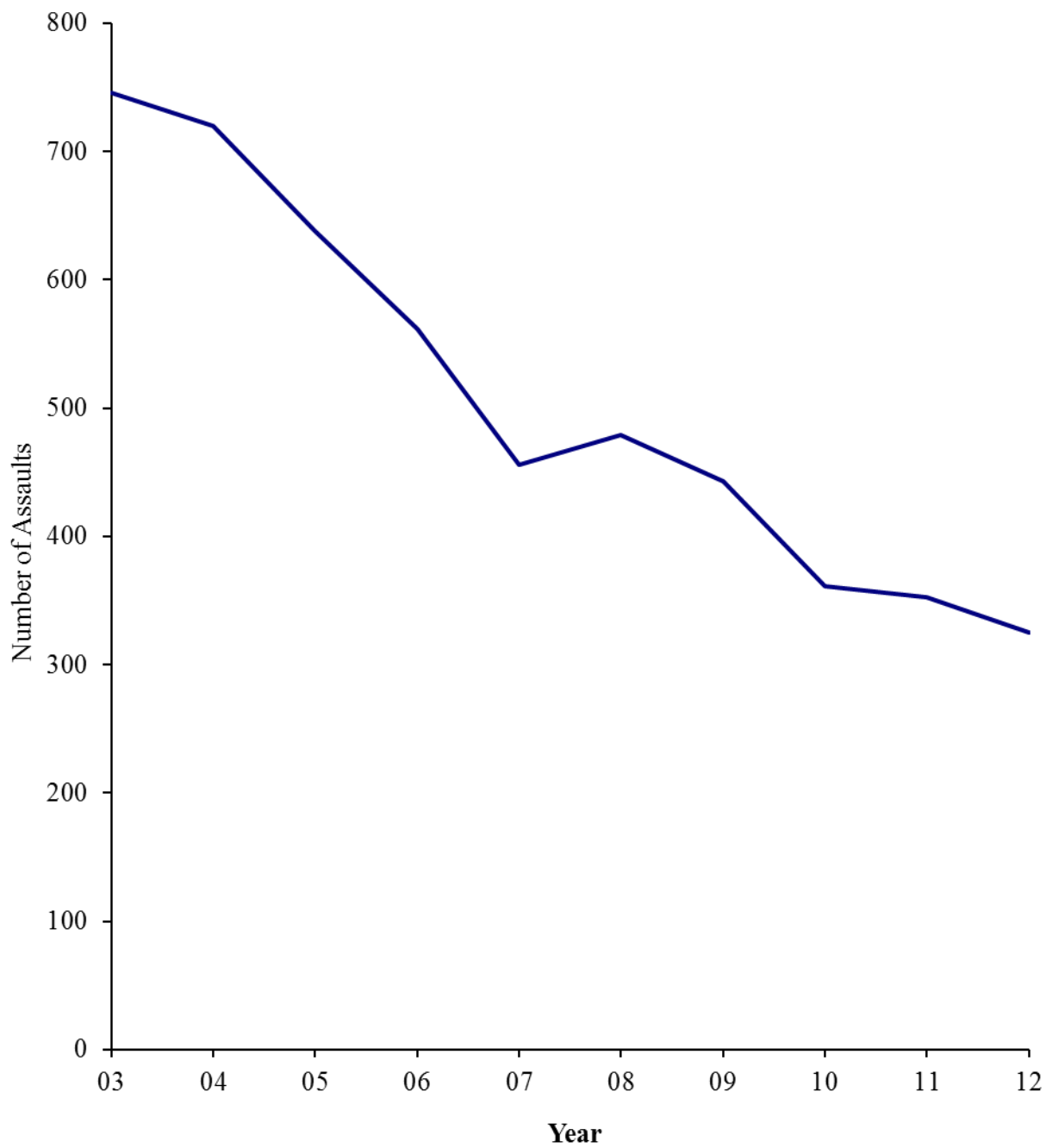

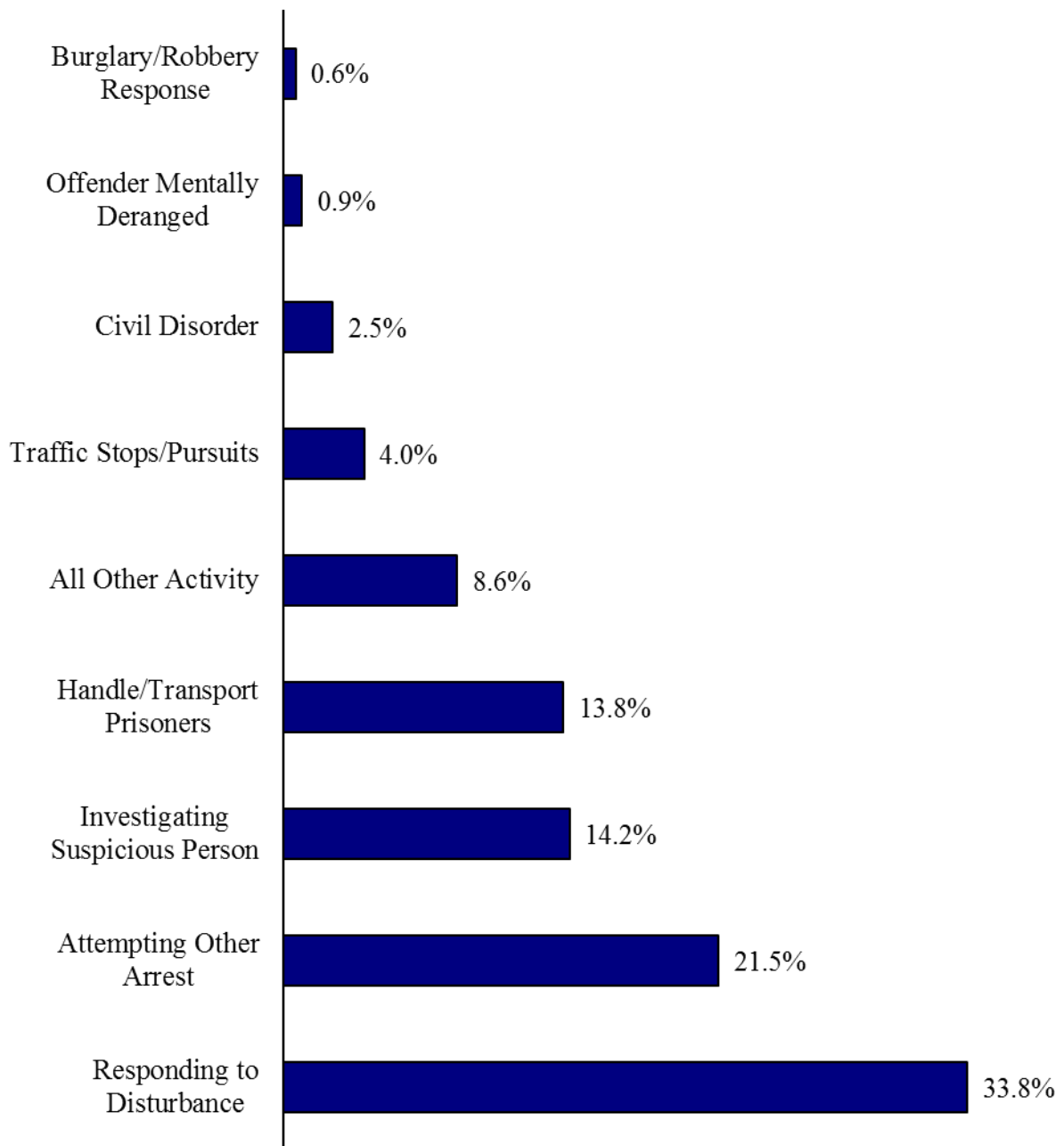

Circumstances of Simple Assault against Law Enforcement 2012

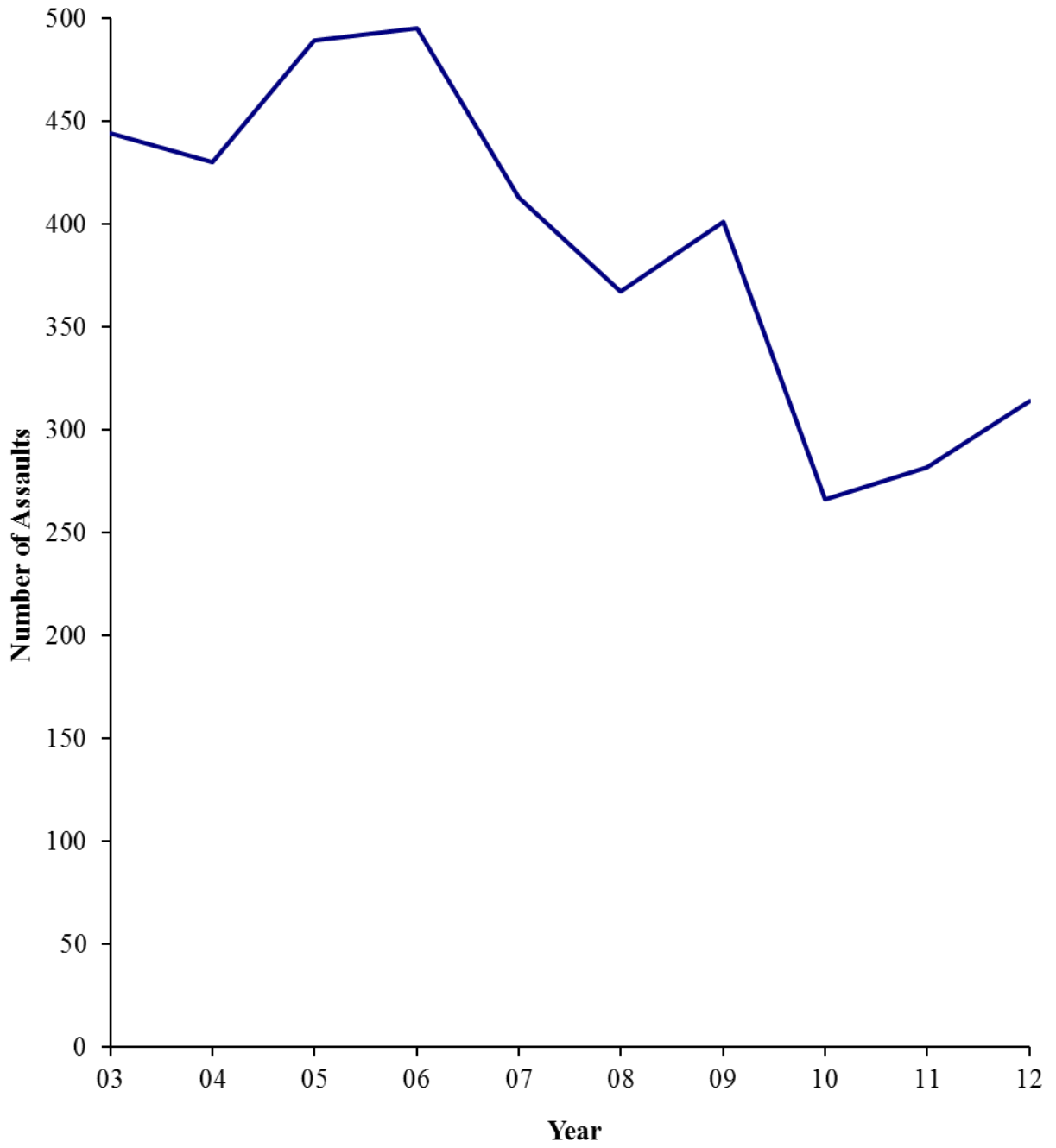

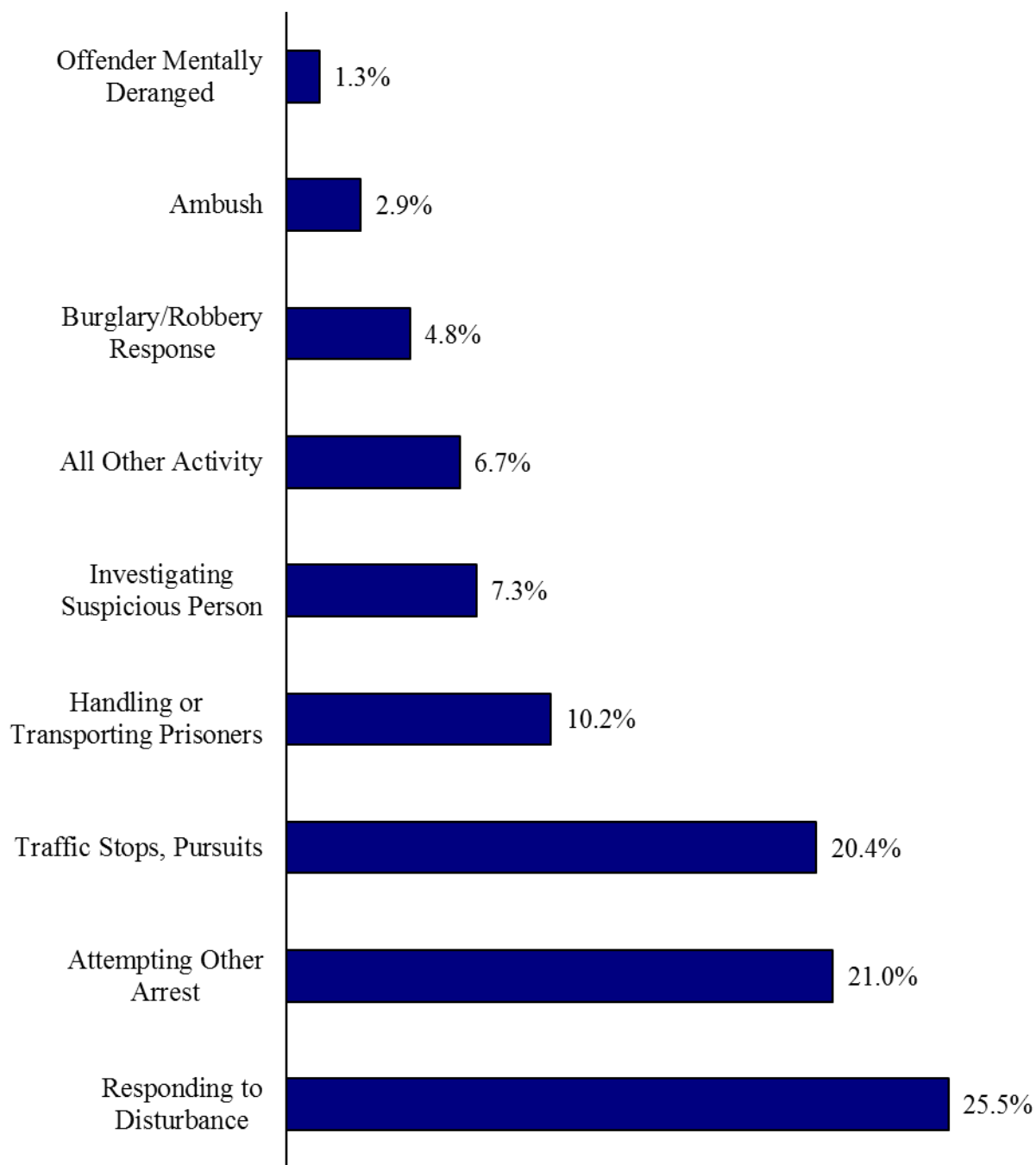
