

ADDITIONAL SEX OFFENSES AND ASSAULTS

NOTE

Since this section is not a part of the national or state crime index, the data have been included in this section separately, rather than being displayed with the index crimes.

DEFINITION

The category of additional sex offenses is composed of forcible sodomy (oral or anal intercourse), sexual assault with an object (the insertion of any object into the anal or genital opening of a person's body), and forcible fondling (the touching of the private body parts of another person for sexual gratification). These crimes are committed forcibly and without consent, or in cases in which a person is mentally incapable of giving consent. Attempts are counted. Forcible rape is not included in this section.

DEFINITION

Simple assault, for SCIBRS purposes, is defined as an unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where the offender neither uses nor displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury. This category does not include verbal attacks or threats.

DEFINITION

Intimidation, for SCIBRS purposes, is defined as follows: to unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or dangerous object, and without subjecting the victim to actual physical attack. "Stalking" can be intimidation if the victim feels a threat of bodily harm. Such threats can be made in person, by telephone, in writing, etc.


ROUNDING






