

SOUTH CAROLINA LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED


DEFINITION

The report, *Crime in South Carolina*, covers only criminal activity. For purposes of this report, “Law Enforcement Officers Killed” refers only to those officers feloniously killed while acting in the capacity of a law enforcement officer, either on-duty or off-duty. (Annual figures for line of duty deaths in South Carolina compiled by the SC Law Enforcement Officers Hall of Fame include felonious assaults as well as deaths while on duty through other causes [accidental or natural].)

Percentages shown in the tables and charts may not add to 100% due to rounding. Rates per 10,000 population and percent changes also have been rounded.

OFFICERS KILLED S. C. POLICE OFFICERS KILLED BY YEAR





2005 SUMMARY


During 2005, one South Carolina police officer was murdered in the line of duty.

On Monday, May 16, 2005, 29 year-old Senior Trooper Jonathan Wade Parker, a seven year veteran with the S. C. Department of Public Safety, was murdered by a 34 year-old male robbery suspect, who was attempting to elude other police officers.




