SCIBRS DEFINITION

“An unlawful attack by one person upon another.”

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

SCIBRS DEFINITION

An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury, involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.”


KEY POINT



It is not necessary that injury result from an Aggravated Assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used (or displayed) which could cause serious personal injury.

SIMPLE ASSAULT

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where the offender has no dangerous weapon, and the victim suffers no obvious severe or aggravated injury.”

SIMPLE ASSAULT



INTIMIDATION

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.”





JUSTIFIABLE AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“The wounding of a perpetrator of a serious criminal offense by a police officer in the line of duty; or the wounding, during the commission of a serious criminal offense, of the perpetrator by a private individual.”



“The killing of another person through negligence.”



EXCLUDES

- Vehicular Homicide
- Deaths Due To Victim's Own
Negligence

JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE



KEY POINTS



The crime that was being committed when the Justifiable Homicide took place must be reported in a separate incident with a separate case number.

Do not consider a killing as justifiable or excusable solely on the basis of self-defense or the action of a coroner, prosecutor, grand jury or court.

JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE



KEY POINTS



A Justifiable Homicide can never be cleared.

Because the killing was justifiable, the incident cannot be cleared by arrest because the offender would not be arrested. It cannot be cleared exceptionally because it would not meet the criteria (i.e. no probable cause).

But remember, it's not a crime, and is not included in your crime count.

JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE



When a police officer kills a subject in the line of duty, it is the practice of most departments to turn the investigation over to another law enforcement agency. No problem.

However, when this happens, the department whose officer did the shooting **MUST report the Justifiable Homicide to SCIBRS.**

This is REQUIRED.

(The department that did the investigation will **NOT report the incident to SCIBRS.)**

“The unlawful seizure, transportation, and/or detention of a person against his/her will, or of a minor without the consent of his/her custodial parent(s) or legal guardian.”



REMEMBER

In some cases, when you have a kidnapping you may also have an assault offense, if the assault is separate and distinct from the initial kidnapping.

SEX OFFENSES, FORCIBLE

INABILITY TO GIVE CONSENT = FORCE

Mental or physical incapacity

Intoxication

Under the influence of drugs

Other valid reasons a person is unable to consent

Too young to give informed consent

These things will be determined by the investigating officer – possibly with the help of specialists.

SEX OFFENSES, FORCIBLE

REPORTING GUIDELINES

To report Forcible Rape, the victim and at least one offender have to be of the opposite sex.

A victim is not a victim of assault and a forcible sex offense. The assault is an element of the forcible sex offense.

FORCIBLE RAPE

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.”

FORCIBLE SODOMY

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.”

SEXUAL ASSAULT WITH AN OBJECT

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“To use an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly or against that person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.”



FORCIBLE FONDLING

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly or against that person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.”







One of the Forcible Sex
Offenses: 11A-11D

INCEST

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.”

STATUTORY RAPE

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.”

SCIBRS TIPS SCIBRS TIPS

In SCIBRS, the category
"36B=Statutory Rape"
usually conforms to the
criteria found in the SC
state statute:

"Criminal Sexual
Conduct with a Minor".

SEXUAL EXPOSURE

SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Unlawful sexual exposure of a person’s sexual organs or other private parts for the purpose of sexual gratification.”



a serious sex offense and
MUST be done for the
purpose of SEXUAL
GRATIFICATION.



SCIBRS TIPS SCIBRS TIPS

Sexual Exposure is NOT the same as "Indecent Exposure".


Local ordinances called "Indecent Exposure" cover such incidents as urinating in public, mooning, etc.

These are coded as **90C** "**Disorderly Conduct**" for SCIBRS.

A threat was made, and the victim experienced reasonable fear of bodily harm.

No Weapon code is entered.

SCENARIO THREE

A woman is walking home from the market down the street. She is grabbed by a man who hits her in the knee with a tire iron and then attempts to rape her. Undaunted, the woman reaches into her purse and retrieves her handgun. She then shoots the attacker twice. The attacker dies from his wounds one hour later.


