
# SCIBRS TIPS

## REMEMBER

Unlike Group A  
Offenses, Group B  
Offenses are only  
reported to SCIBRS  
when an arrest  
is made.



# SCIBRS TIPS



When two Group B offenses occur within the same incident, report the offense that is "highest" on the Group B offense list.  
i.e. DUI is "higher" on the list than Liquor Law Violations.

# BAD CHECKS

---

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“**Knowingly and intentionally writing**  
**and/or negotiating** checks drawn against  
**insufficient or nonexistent funds.**”

# CURFEW/LOITERING VAGRANCY VIOLATIONS

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“The violation of a court order, regulation, ordinance, or law requiring the withdrawal of persons from the streets or other specified areas; ...prohibiting persons from remaining in an area or place in an idle or aimless manner; or prohibiting persons from going from place to place without visible means of support.”

# DISORDERLY CONDUCT

---

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Any **behavior** that tends to **disturb** the public **peace or decorum**, scandalize the community, or shock the public sense of morality.”






# SCIBRS TIPS



If an offender is charged with Disorderly Conduct, but an assault occurred, report the assault to SCIBRS.

# SCIBRS TIPS



Acts such as urinating in public and "mooning" are coded as 90C. These may be "indecent", but they are NOT sex crimes, and must NOT be coded as "Sexual Exposure" (36C)

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Driving or operating a motor vehicle or common carrier while mentally or physically impaired as the result of consuming an alcoholic beverage or using a drug or narcotic.”

# DRUNKENNESS

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“To drink alcoholic beverages to the extent that one’s mental faculties and physical coordination are substantially impaired.”

# FAMILY OFFENSES NONVIOLENT

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“Unlawful, nonviolent acts by a family member (or legal guardian) which threaten the physical, mental, or economic well-being or morals of another family member, and which are not classifiable as other offenses, such as Assault, Incest, Statutory Rape, etc.”

# LIQUOR LAW VIOLATIONS

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“The **violation of laws** or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, **or use of alcoholic beverages.**”

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

“To **secretly look** through a window, doorway, keyhole, or other aperture for the **purpose** of **Voyeurism.**”

“A person **under 17 years of age** who has **left home without the permission** of his/her parent (s) or legal guardian.”

(Not a Crime)



“To unlawfully enter land,  
a dwelling, or other real property.”

# SCIBRS TIPS

## INCLUDES

Criminal Trespass  
Subjects who break into  
a structure with no  
intent to commit a  
serious crime, such as a  
vagrant seeking a place  
to sleep.

# Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor (90P) Crime against Persons

- ▣ This code is used whenever a person is charged with this offense under state statute.

# Incorrigible Child (90K)

## Crime against Society

- ▣ The service of court papers ordering your agency to take a person into custody as an Incorrigible Child.

# Resisting Arrest (90N)

## Crime against Society

- ▣ To be used whenever a person is charged with Resisting Arrest.

# Truancy (90L)

## Crime against Society

- ▣ This code is to be used if your agency takes a person into custody for Truancy.

## SCIBRS DEFINITION

**“All crimes which are not Group A offenses and not included in one of the specifically named Group B crime categories.”**

# OFFENSES OF GENERAL APPLICABILITY

---

**WHEN AN OFFENSE IS PREFIXED BY:**

**Accessory Before/After the Fact  
Aiding/Abetting  
Conspiracy to Commit**

**Handle these arrests like this!**

# OFFENSES OF GENERAL APPLICABILITY

---

If the offense is a Group A offense,  
report it as a 90Z

## ALL OTHER OFFENSES

If the offense is a Group B offense,  
report it as the exact

## SCENARIO THREE

A juvenile runs away from home. His parents notify law enforcement. Later that evening, the juvenile returns home. The parents notify law enforcement that the juvenile has returned home and is okay.

## SCENARIO FOUR – PART ONE

**A woman sees a man peeking into her window at her residence. She reports the incident to law enforcement immediately.**

# SCIBRS ANSWERS

## OFFENSE:

Peeping Tom

arrest has been made.

## SCENARIO FOUR – PART TWO

Later that day, police locate and arrest the offender.


