

## INTRODUCTION

The 2020 edition of *Crime in South Carolina* contains general information about crime trends, provides crime data at the county level for the most recent year available, and provides descriptive information about criminality. This publication intends to provide statistical information about crime in the state simply and straightforwardly so that it can better inform policymakers, criminal justice practitioners, and researchers, as well as the public.

The information presented in the tables, graphs, and charts in this publication indicate volume, fluctuation, and distribution of crime in South Carolina based on incident reports submitted by state and local law enforcement agencies to the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED). SLED maintains these records in a repository contracted through Beyond 20/20. SLED's South Carolina Incident-Based Reporting System (SCIBRS) unit performs quality assurance reviews on all submitted reports to ensure data and information accuracy, consistency, and completeness. If needed, these reports are then amended or corrected. Once the data quality has been verified, it is compiled to form the basis of the information presented in this report. It is important to note that the information contained in this report is only as complete and accurate as the information submitted to SLED. Accordingly, unreported crimes are not included.

Additionally, edits, updates, and corrections can be submitted to SLED at any time, providing agencies with the opportunity to report as thoroughly and accurately as possible. As a result, rates and totals from a specific year can vary from previously published totals for that same year. Any data published here concerning figures for prior years supersede those published in previous reports. The data used for this report is current as of September 15, 2021.

Lastly, the definitions of specific crimes listed in this publication are derived from the FBI's UCR manual; they may or may not match those found in legal statutes or ordinances.

A great deal of thanks and appreciation is due to the sheriffs, chiefs of police, directors, state and local law enforcement officers, and administrative staff whose hard work gathering, reviewing, and submitting crime and arrest data to the South Carolina Uniform Crime Reporting Program made the publication of this report possible.

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## HISTORY, SRS, AND IBRS

Collecting, analyzing, and using crime data to inform decisions is not a modern concept. As early as the 19<sup>th</sup> century, state and local municipalities collected crime data; however, there were no standardized crime definitions or collection methods, and only a few agencies participated. Due to these barriers, crime data created an incomplete picture, and no comparisons could be made between jurisdictions. To solve these issues, in 1870, the United States Congress created the Department of Justice and mandated the reporting of annual crime statistics. However, despite the 1870 DOJ Act, and efforts by the National Police Association, the precursor to the International

Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), it would take many more decades before uniform crime reporting was implemented in a meaningful way<sup>1</sup>.

During the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, concentration on crime statistics intensified. One example of aggravation towards current collection methods and the need to unify them is found in the 1917 *Journal of Criminal Law and Criminology* article *Statistics of Crime*<sup>2</sup>. In this publication, William T. Cross writes, “[t]he lack of a rational, comprehensive system of criminal statistics in the United States is one of the worst evidences to condemn us in the eyes of the scientific world...it is at the same time probably the most pervading fault in our public organization to combat crime.”

The IACP took action and established the Committee on Uniform Crime Records in 1927. The committee’s goal was to provide unified, reliable, and systemic data of crimes in the United States, and in 1929, a system to classify and report crimes was created. A short time later, on June 11, 1930, Congress mandated that the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) collect, compile, and distribute crime records<sup>3</sup>. The initial method created was known as the Summary Reporting System (SRS); it has remained virtually unchanged since its inception.

Following a 1970s law enforcement study analyzing the effectiveness of crime statistics, and based on collaborative efforts that continued into the 1980s, the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) was created. A NIBRS pilot program was conducted in South Carolina in 1987, and at the 1988 National UCR Conference, the FBI was urged to adopt the program nationally. As a result, in 1991, South Carolina became one of the first states to implement the incident-based reporting (IBR) system certified by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The state’s program was thereafter known as the South Carolina Incident-Based Reporting System (SCIBRS).

This new system expanded on the previous Summary Reporting System (SRS) by requiring a higher degree of detail in reporting. Whereas the SRS collected only eight Part I crimes (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson), the South Carolina Incident-Based Reporting System (SCIBRS) currently collects in-depth data on 59 Group A offenses. Additionally, the older Summary system allowed only the single most serious offense in an incident to be reported; any other offenses and the information associated with them were not collected. Initially, the SCIBRS allowed up to five separate Group A offenses to be reported in each incident, collecting data on the offense characteristics, property, victims, offenders, and arrestees associated with each crime. As of January 2017, the SCIBRS allows reporting up to ten separate Group A offenses in each incident.

While enough data was being collected through the new system to allow for historical trend reporting, SCIBRS data continued to be converted back to Summary for publication in *Crime in South Carolina*. The conversion of SCIBRS data helped facilitate the comparison with the FBI’s statistical crime publications—such as *Crime in the United States*—that converts all IBR data to Summary.

*Crime in South Carolina 2020* will be the eighth edition to feature IBR data exclusively. Because of the significant differences between Summary data and SCIBRS data, any comparisons between the figures published here in *Crime in South Carolina 2020* to those released in Summary publications such as *Crime in the United States* or editions of *Crime in South Carolina* before 2013 are strongly discouraged.

In this edition of *Crime in South Carolina*, the number of Breaking & Entering (B&E) crimes is calculated differently than in previous years. Previous editions used a counting methodology similar to the FBI's *Crime in the United States* publication. One B&E was counted per incident, except when a hotel/motel or rental self-storage facility was broken into. In those types of incidents, the number of rooms/units broken into were counted instead. This edition uses the same methodology as the FBI's NIBRS publication. Only one B&E is counted per incident, regardless of location type. With the planned sunset of SRS at the end of 2020 and the likely shift in focus from *Crime in the United States* to an annual NIBRS publication, this updated method for calculating B&E will help facilitate comparisons to future FBI publications.

Because B&E is one of the offenses that make up the Property Crime category, the number of Property Crimes is also affected. Therefore, all figures in this edition were calculated by applying the updated methodology to the data from 1991 through 2020. Only the number of crime incidents is calculated differently; arrest figures are unaffected by this update. Due to the change in methodology, any comparison between the number of crimes for the B&E offense and the Property Crimes category published here in *Crime in South Carolina 2020* to those released in previous editions is strongly discouraged.

Lastly, the *Crime in South Carolina* publication has remained virtually unchanged since the first printing in 1973. From 1973 to 2012, several factors dictated the format and overall presentation of that generation of publications; however, those considerations are no longer relevant. The 2020 version of *Crime in South Carolina* represents the first major revision of this publication since its inception. With the stylistic modifications complete, SLED's SCIBRS unit will begin preparing for next year's edition by examining the relevancy and usefulness of the data contained within these publications. Stakeholders are encouraged to contact the SLED SCIBRS unit to provide input during this process.

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#### THEME ORIENTED PUBLIC SITE (TOPS)

In addition to accuracy, consistency, and completeness, timeliness and accessibility are dimensions of high-quality data and information. SLED has collaborated with Beyond 20/20 to augment *Crime in South Carolina* with a publicly available web-based extension to the SCIBRS repository to address these crucial dimensions and provide stakeholders with the most up-to-date and easily retrievable information. This extension, known as the "Theme Oriented Public Site," or TOPS, provides a visualization layer integrated directly with the SCIBRS repository. Users can search for dynamic crime information by jurisdiction, year, and category. Additionally, after passing quality assurance reviews, the information contained within TOPS is updated and made available throughout the year. TOPS is accessible at <https://beyond2020.sled.sc.gov/tops/>.

## CRIME RATES

Throughout this report, crimes are presented as either the number of reported offenses or the rate of offenses per 10,000 units of population. The rate, also known as frequency, is a ratio of counts per observation period. In this publication, the rate is a ratio of crime incident counts and the population of an area during a year. The formula used for calculating a crime rate is,

$$\text{Crime Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Crimes}}{\text{Population}} \times 10,000$$

Because it considers population size, the crime rate provides the most useful basis for comparison over time among jurisdictions or other geographical groups. To better explain, if County X and County Y both experience thirty homicides in 2020, it would seem that each county has an equal prevalence of murders. This would be accurate if both areas had an equal population; however, population counts are not identical among jurisdictions. Suppose County X has 200,000 persons and County Y has 20,000; the mere count of murders in each area affords no context for evaluation. Additionally, though not used or intended in this publication, the vast population difference would prohibit comparisons between the jurisdictions.

Conversely, by assessing the murder count against each county's population, the resulting rates reveal that County X has a murder prevalence of 1.5 murders per 10,000 and County Y's is 15 per 10,000. Context is now more readily apparent. Furthermore, another benefit of rates is revealed.

Rates normalize vastly different population densities between areas, which, in turn, provides for fair comparisons. Likewise, normalization allows for consistent trend analysis for an area over different times and population densities. For example, if in 2020, the population of County X is 200,000 and there are 30 murders, but in 2021, the population increases to 320,000 and murders increase to 48, the murder rate is still 1.5 murders per 10,000 persons.

## CLEARANCE

In addition to rates of crime, the clearance of criminal incidents is presented as a rate. Clearance rates provide a measure of the degree to which crimes are resolved. For UCR, a clearance indicates an arrest has been made, or exceptional circumstances have occurred preventing an arrest. The four elements that must exist include 1) the identity of at least one offender must be known, 2) sufficient probable cause has been developed to support the arrest and prosecution, 3) the offender's exact location must be known, and 4) there is a reason outside of law enforcement's control which prevents the arrest (for example, death of the offender). Clearances are calculated using the following formula:

$$\text{Clearance Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Crimes Cleared by Arrest or Exceptional Means}}{\text{Count of Crimes Reported}}$$

The sum of categories for some tables, charts, or graphs may not total 100% due to rounding or the ability to submit multiple values for certain fields. The percent change in the rate per 10,000 inhabitants (or juveniles) is calculated from unrounded rates not displayed in the tables.

Many variables – education, poverty, employment opportunities, history, culture, age distribution, and other characteristics - influence crime in an area. This publication provides rates based on county population for individual county rates and state population for statewide rates. These rates do not account for the additional variables previously mentioned. Additionally, demographic data (age, sex, race, and ethnicity) is shown for arrestees/identified suspects and victims in some sections.

It is not the intention of the authors, nor should anything be construed as intending to rank cities, towns, counties, or regions based on crime rates, the effectiveness of law enforcement agencies to deter or solve crime, or the propensity for crime within any age, sex, racial, or ethnic group. Any use of the data within this publication without factoring in other variables would provide an incomplete, simplistic analysis and false or misleading perceptions.

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## POPULATION DATA

Population counts used in the calculation of crime rates are obtained from the United States Census Bureau. In addition to crime rates, the Census Bureau’s data is seen in figures pertaining to state, county, race, sex, age, and Hispanic origin groups. Traditionally, it is the practice of the SLED SCIBRS unit to obtain the Census Population figures from the American Community Survey (ACS) or the Decennial Census corresponding to the year of the *Crime in South Carolina* publication. However, for 2020, the Census Bureau has advised users that it “will not release its standard 2020 ACS 1- year estimates because of the impacts of the COVID pandemic on data collection;” though, “experimental estimates” will be available no later than November 30, 2021<sup>4</sup>. State and County population data obtained through the 2020 Decennial Census is estimated to be released between March and June 2022<sup>5</sup>. However, the Census Bureau has released population totals for the state and counties through 2020 Census Redistricting Data.

The Redistricting Data contains the population totals delineated by sex, race, and ethnicity for South Carolina and the counties contained within. However, it does not provide the same for age groups. Therefore, rates are unable to be provided for 2020 juvenile offenses. Were allowable, the available population totals will be used in other sections.

For sections displaying Census Race figures, the Census Bureau tallies responses based on the five categories defined in 1997 by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB),

- White - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as “White” or report responses such as German, Irish, English, Italian, Lebanese, and Egyptian. The category also includes groups such as Polish, French, Iranian, Slavic, Cajun, Chaldean, etc.
- Black or African American (Black/AA) - A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as “Black or African American” or report responses such as African American, Jamaican, Haitian, Nigerian, Ethiopian, or Somali. The category also includes groups such as Ghanaian, South African, Barbadian, Kenyan, Liberian, Bahamian, etc.
- American Indian or Alaska Native (AIAN) - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment. This category includes people who indicate their race as “American Indian or Alaska Native,” or report responses such as Navajo Nation, Blackfeet Tribe, Mayan, Aztec, Native Village of Barrow Inupiat Traditional Government, or Nome Eskimo Community.
- Asian - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent, including, for example, India, China, the Philippine Islands, Japan, Korea, or Vietnam.
- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander (NHOPI) - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands. It includes people who indicate their race as Native Hawaiian, Chamorro, Samoan, and Other Pacific Islander or provide other detailed Other Pacific Islander responses such as Palauan, Tahitian, Chuukese, Pohnpeian, Saipanese, Yapese, etc.

In addition to Race, participants are able to select from one of two categories of ethnic origin,

- Hispanic or Latino
- Not Hispanic or Latino.

The Census Bureau reports that respondents indicating a Hispanic or Latino origin are usually born or have ancestors from Spain, the Spanish-speaking countries of Central or South America, or another Spanish culture or origin. It is important to recognize that persons identifying as Hispanic or Latino can be of any race.

Lastly, ACS and Decennial surveys results are based on self-reported data. Respondents can select from one of the five race categories or from a combination of those categories; there are 57 possible combinations. However, the information contained within the S.C. Repository is derived from reports submitted by Law Enforcement Agencies throughout the state. The race of victims and suspects may be identified by the victim or suspect or may be indicated through observations of the reporting officer.




VIOLENT CRIME

MURDER

The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one person by another. Murder includes deaths resulting from injuries received in a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime. Suicides, traffic fatalities (including DUI and Reckless Driving), fetal deaths, assaults to murder, attempted murders, and accidental deaths are not classified as murder and nonnegligent manslaughter in UCR; therefore, they are not reflected in data presented under this section. Additionally, the classification of murder is based on the police investigation, not on the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body.




Female Murder Victim by Age




*Murder by Month and Sex*













# ARRESTS





## ARRESTS

Arrest counts provide a measure of law enforcement's response to crime. Arrest rates also offer estimates of criminal offenses such as liquor law violations or driving under the influence for which there are no victims who are likely to report the behavior. Arrest practices, policies, and enforcement emphases vary from place to place and even within a community over time. For example, the arrest practices for certain unlawful conduct such as drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, and related violations may differ among agencies. However, the methods for robbery, burglary, and other serious crime arrests are more likely to be uniform and consistent throughout all jurisdictions. Uniform Crime Reporting procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. Annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested, because one person may be apprehended several times during the year for the same or different offenses.

Until July 1, 2019, state law set the age of adult responsibility at seventeen years of age in most criminal matters. Therefore, the adult arrest totals in previous editions were calculated based on the adult age (17 and older) at that time. In this edition, the current definition of an adult (18 and older) is used in the Adult Arrestees by Sex and Adult Arrestees by Race tables. Due to this change, comparisons of the two affected tables to those published in previous editions of *Crime in South Carolina* are discouraged. All other tables in this section include all arrestees, regardless of age.

In this report, arrests are presented as the actual number of arrests or arrest rates per 10,000 units of population. Arrest data for 2001 are not available and are not included in any of the data tables or charts that follow.

## JUVENILE ARRESTS

In addition to being a gauge of law enforcement's response to crime, arrests provide reliable information concerning the age of apprehended offenders. Consequently, arrest rates by age provide one of the better readily available measures of juvenile delinquency. SCIBRS procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. As a result, annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individual juveniles arrested because one juvenile might be apprehended several times during a year.

Until July 1, 2019, state law set the age of adult responsibility in most criminal matters at seventeen years of age, so the juvenile arrest totals in previous editions were calculated based on the juvenile age (0 through 16) of that time. In this edition, the current definition of a juvenile (0 through 17) is used for all figures in this section, including historical data starting in 1991. Due to this change, comparisons of the figures in this section to those published in previous editions of *Crime in South Carolina* is strongly discouraged. Arrest data for 2001 are not available and are not included in any of the data tables or charts that follow.

Due to the lack of available data (see Introduction), crime and arrest rates are not calculated in this section. In order to do so, it would require that population data for 0-17 years old be used, and currently, that data has not been released by the Census Bureau.



Juvenile Arrest Rate for Murder




Juvenile Murder Arrest by Sex




Juvenile Murder Offender Age


Murder by Month and Sex


Juvenile Arrest Rate for Sexual Battery

Juvenile Arrest Rate for Robbery






Figure 1: Juvenile Arrest Rate for Aggravated Assault




Juvenile Arrest Rate for Motor Vehicle Theft


Juvenile Arrest Rate for Larceny






Juvenile Drug/Narcotic Type Violation







# FAMILY & INTIMATE VIOLENCE





## FAMILY AND INTIMATE VIOLENCE

This section examines murder, aggravated assault, simple assault, and intimidation involving victims and offenders who have either a familial or romantic relationship with one another. The victim-to-offender relationship might best be understood as describing who the victim of the assault was. For example, if the victim-to-offender link is “child,” then the victim was the child, and the offender was a parent.

Familial relationships are defined as including the following victim-to-offender relationships: child, stepchild, grandchild, sibling (brother or sister), stepsibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent, in-law, and other family members.

Intimate relationships are defined as including the following victim-to-offender links: spouse, ex-spouse, cohabitants, ex-cohabitants, child-in-common, boyfriend/girlfriend, and same-sex relationships.

This data is captured by reporting the relationship existing between the victim/s and each offender involved in the incident. When an incident has multiple offenders, individual victims will be reported with various relationship types. Because an individual victim may be reported with various relationship types, any single victim could contribute to the number of victims for more than one relationship type. For example, suppose a victim was the child of one offender and the sibling of another. In that case, that victim will contribute both to the number of victims who were children of an offender and to the number of victims who were siblings of an offender. Because individual victims appear in multiple relationship types, the percentages in the tables will add up to more than 100% of total victims.

In January 2017, SCIBRS began collecting cohabitants, ex-cohabitants, and child-in-common victim-to-offender relationships at the recommendation of the South Carolina Domestic Violence Task Force.


Also, in January 2017, SCIBRS followed a recommendation by the FBI and instructed contributing agencies that same-sex victim/offender pairs could be listed under any intimate victim-to-offender relationship category. Previously, these relationships would have been reported under a dedicated same-sex relationship value. Due to this change, any category listed in this report, including same-sex, may represent values that lead to incomplete, ambiguous, or faulty conclusions. Therefore, care should be taken when analyzing this relationship data unless each incident is examined and additional information is extracted.

Lastly, in January 2019, SCIBRS started to collect ex-boyfriend/girlfriend victim-to-offender relationships as a new requirement set by the FBI. The links described with these new values would have previously been reported to SCIBRS under the boyfriend/girlfriend victim-to-offender relationship. The boyfriend/girlfriend relationship remains available to report current dating relationships that are more than casual.

Twelve South Carolina law enforcement officers have been murdered in the last ten years.



In 2020, murderers of law enforcement officers were White (1) and Black (2) males. At least one handgun and one rifle were used; one incident involved a semi-automatic firearm that was not categorized.


### AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

There were 311 aggravated assaults committed against South Carolina law enforcement officers in 2020. The most common type of law enforcement action preceding the attack was responding to a disturbance, followed by traffic stops. From 2019 to 2020, there was a 267% increase in aggravated assaults involving civil disorders.



