Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) **SLED Internship Program**

Selection for the SC Law Enforcement Division's Student Internship Program will be based on an individual's enrollment in a two- or four-year program or graduate-level academic program. Applicants must also have at least a 2.5 cumulative academic grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent, and must meet other requirements deemed necessary for access to SLED facilities.

All Submissions Require:

- Application Form
- Resume – with at least one Reference(s)
- Letter(s) of Recommendation
- Personal Statement
- Official College/University Transcript with accumulated GPA of 2.5 or higher (*non-sealed are acceptable*)

Application Deadlines

- Summer Break – Must submit application by April 30th of that year.
- Fall Semester – Must submit application by July 14th of that year.
- Spring Semester – Must submit application by November 30th of the **previous year**.

Application Considerations

The Application Form is updated periodically. The list of departments available for placement are subject to change from term to term.

Although you **may submit your materials at any time**, we recommend **checking the website two weeks before the deadline** to confirm that the Application Form has not been updated since your proactive submission. This helps ensure your selections reflect the most current list of available departments.

If the form has been updated after you submitted your application, you may email your refreshed list to **internships@sled.sc.gov** to request that your **department rankings be updated**.

1. What is the schedule?

Internships are generally conducted during traditional office hours:

Monday – Friday
9:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Supervisors are flexible and work with students to accommodate:

- Class schedules
- Extracurricular activities
- Part-time job commitments
- School Holiday schedule

Once accepted into the program, students will receive a “Letter of Welcome” via email. At that time, they will be invited to communicate their recurring availability.

2. When will I find out if I was accepted?

We do **not** send status notifications to every individual who applies, **this includes rejection notices**. Students may proactively email us to request a personal status update at any time.

The application review process typically takes **2 – 4 weeks after the submission deadline**.

Accepted applicants will be notified **two weeks before their first day**, by invitation to the **Orientation Tour**.

If accepted, you will be sent a “**Letter of Welcome**” **by email** which includes:

- Your assigned department placement
- Your supervisor’s contact information
- Additional onboarding details, including the Orientation Tour date

3. What are the start and end dates?

Internship term timelines **generally align with a typical academic semester**, though exact dates vary since students apply from different schools across the state and country.

Typically, the Orientation Tour occurs near the first week of classes for most schools. Over the summer, it will start after most graduation dates.

The specific start dates are determined after reviewing the current availability of the participating supervisors and departments for a given term. Due to the nature of our sector, flexibility and real-time scheduling adjustments are required.

Typical Term Timeline

	<u>Summer</u>	<u>Fall</u>	<u>Spring</u>
<u>Deadline</u>	April 30th	July 14th	Nov. 30th <i>(Of previous calendar year)</i>
<u>Approx. Start</u>	June	September	January
<u>Approx. End</u>	August	December	May

End Dates

Students may **select their own end date**, usually aligning with their final exam schedule, provided their assigned duties have been completed. At each internship application interval (April 30th, July 14th, and Nov. 30th) the accepted intern is expected to communicate their intentions (to request to stay, leave, or transfer) **before** the application deadline. Once accepted, maintaining placement is not guaranteed. Once a student leaves or transfers from their internship assignment, an **Exit Checklist Form** is completed, including their accumulated hours.

The self-selected end date must be proactively communicated to both:

- The Assigned Supervisor
- The Internship Coordinator

4. What is the Orientation Tour?

The Orientation Tour serves as the students' first day, bringing together interns from across the state for a chaperoned walking tour of Headquarters and the Forensic Lab in Columbia, SC. During this time, students will meet the Chief and Assistant Chief, have their photos taken, attend guest speaker sessions, and initiate the required onboarding procedures.

5. Will I get exposure to the other departments I requested?

Yes.

Accepted Interns are **encouraged to request** shadowing opportunities with other departments that interest them, even beyond those they requested for placement.

Requests can be made through:

- Your Assigned Supervisor
- The Internship Coordinator

6. Is it okay for my Transcript to arrive separately?

Yes.

This is common and expected. We recommend requesting **electronic transcript delivery** to:

7. Is it okay for my Transcript to arrive un-sealed?

Yes.

Internship Applicants may receive their official transcript first and submit it **un-sealed** with the rest of their application materials.

8. Can I use my Transcript for multiple terms?

Transcripts remain valid for **two semesters only**:

1. The semester you initially apply for
2. The following semester

After that, a **new transcript must be submitted**.

9. Is it okay for my Letter of Recommendation to arrive separately?

Yes.

Letters of Recommendation are often sent directly by the recommender to:

When submitting your other application materials, please include the **name, email address and/or other contact information of your recommender** to help us match the letter to your application file.

10. Is it okay for my Letter of Recommendation to NOT be written by my Academic Advisor/Dean/Professor/Supervisors?

We advise students to request LORs from their Academic Advisor, Dean, Professor, or Supervisor(s) to help guide students who otherwise do not know who to reach out to, especially since they are often young with limited work experience so may not have many resume references to choose from. You are welcome to utilize professional and personal contacts from your resume or other areas of your life that are willing to write a letter on your behalf.

11. May I have more than one Letter of Recommendation?

Yes, you may include multiple Letter of Recommendations.

12. Can I submit my documents at any time?

Yes, applications may be submitted **at any time**. Preferably, a few weeks before the deadline of April 30th, July 14th and November 30th to **reserve time for corrections**. Transcripts delivery delays and/or incomplete applications that are submitted at the deadline cut off may cause your file to miss the first round of application deliveries, reducing the chances of being considered while positions are available.

However, keep in mind:

- The **list of available departments is subject to change intermittently**; we do not have a schedule for upload renewals so please take it upon yourself to set reminders.
- If you choose to submit one application form towards **multiple terms, email internships@sled.sc.gov** two weeks before the new deadline to confirm your application materials have been **properly transferred to the new term**. It is good practice to restate your investment, as well to deliver any refreshed documents such as your renewed Transcript, growing Resume, additional Letter of Recommendations, or evolving Personal Statement, etc.

14. Do I need to have a driver's license?

No.

A driver's license is not required to participate in the internship program. However, interns are responsible for **arranging their own transportation** to and from their assigned office location and any scheduled internship activities.
